From the Pastor's Pen

In the text from John's gospel this weekend, the statement is made that John the Baptist gave testimony that Jesus is truly the Son of God. So are all disciples called upon to give testimony: belief in Jesus, belief in his teachings; belief in the great law of love; belief that each human being is made in the image and likeness of God. Two events this week give us opportunities to be such witnesses.

The first of these is the Monday celebration honoring Martin Luther King, Jr. He was a devout Christian, giving witness as a Baptist minister, a preacher of the Good News. We honor him especially in his testimony to the dignity of each human being, that we are all God's children. Racism and practices of discrimination are plainly contrary to teaching of Jesus. He calls for the defeat of racism of all kinds, not just against African Americans, but against Hispanics, Asians, people all nationalities, those categorized as LGBTQ. His testimony should be our testimony and the testimony of the Church: treating each person with respect and dignity.

The other event happening this week is the beginning of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Yes, we affirm and profess our Christian faith. But we do not discriminate against, put down, speak in a derogatory way of any other faith or non-faith. People must live according to their conscience. However, the celebration of the Week of Christian Prayer, January 18-25, focuses especially on working for unity within the Christian body of believers. There was a time in history when bitter wars were fought and bitter words were spoken by members of different denominations. Those days must be behind us.

So I hope our testimony will be bold, like that of John the Baptist, and that we fearlessly proclaim the message of Jesus. We honor and live by the values of our Catholic faith. But we also honor the respect those of other denominations. Our testimony is that of Jesus: living the great law of love.

We call upon the Spirit of God to give strength to our calling.

The holidays are different things for many people, but as Fr. Mike mentioned last Sunday, what is so important for me during holidays is being with family and friends. Christmas 2022 and New Year 2023 were no different. Although I didn't see my siblings or their families, I was able to be with my daughter, eldest son, (missed my youngest son) and four of my five grandchildren. I also took a road trip to Arizona to visit Gene's eldest son, wife, and two special daughters. The trip didn't go quite as planned (snow fell every day we were in Flagstaff with temperatures hovering in the 30's and Surprise was cooler than Kansas City that week and rainy. Likewise the desert was pretty green, not quite the usual vista picture above. Although I do not see Jim and his family often, and our ventures about were limited, our days were rich sharing memories of Gene, present challenges, and dreams for the future, while once again I was of the amazing gift of life and the natural world God gives to us each day and season (yes even in AZ).

Life, death, and resurrection are everywhere. Buried under the snow are new shoots of plants which will bloom in the spring; throughout the desert the sand is filled with grasses and seeds waiting for rain; hibernating animals give birth; and the wonderment continues year in and year out. I and my family also change. My grandchildren are becoming more and more independent, my children are thinking about retirement, and we are asking new questions. I am also aware of, my continual search for meaning. Finding that meaning seems to come through a greater trust and surrender of my life to God. There is a desert or a blanket of snow within, waiting for me to recognize the light of Christ, the presence of the Holy Spirit, and the love and healing of God, that is ever present within but often hidden by my ego and self-centered desires. Being with family once again, made me realize that the greatest gift to give and receive is love. My wish for 2023 is that each of you each recognize and share His love.



UPLIFT is a mobile street outreach for the homeless of Kansas City. Three nights a week, they take four Sprinter vans loaded with food, clothing, and other essential supplies out to the homeless. They meet them at parks, under bridges, at their camps, or wherever they are. We typically serve 250-400 people each night, never missing a night!

Uplift was started 30 years ago in 1990. They are 100% donation-based and run completely by volunteers. Uplift has no paid staff and is not affiliated with any particular church or religious organization.

Uplift believes in the power of unconditional love and kindness. They welcome all people of good will to join us in this work!

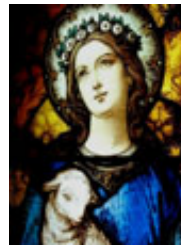

St. Agnes ~ Virgin and Martyr Feast Day January 21



St. Agnes of Rome was born in 291 AD and raised in a Christian family. Agnes was very beautiful and belonged to a wealthy family. Her hand in marriage was highly sought after, and she had many high ranking men chasing after her. However, Agnes made a promise to God never to stain her purity. Her love for the Lord was great and she hated sin even more than death!

Whenever a man wished to marry Agnes, she would always say, "Jesus Christ is my only Spouse."

According to legend, the young men she turned away became so angry and insulted by her devotion to God and purity that they began to submit her name to authorities as a Christian follower.

At each refusal, she continued to say "I am already promised to the Lord of the Universe. He is more splendid than the sun and the stars, and He has said He will never leave me!"

Ultimately because of her refusals, powerful men condemned her to death. She died a virgin-martyr at the age of 12 or 13 on 21 January 304.

St. Agnes is widely known as the patron saint of young girls. She is also the patron saint of chastity, rape survivors and the Children of Mary.

She is often represented with a lamb, the symbol of her virgin innocence, and a palm branch, like other martyrs. She is shown as a young girl in robes holding a palm branch with the lamb either at her feet or in her arms.

Training For Servers

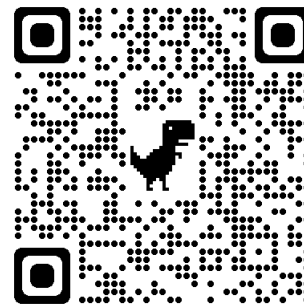


We are going to be holding a training session for servers-- both returning servers and any new students who would like to begin this ministry. The training session will be held
