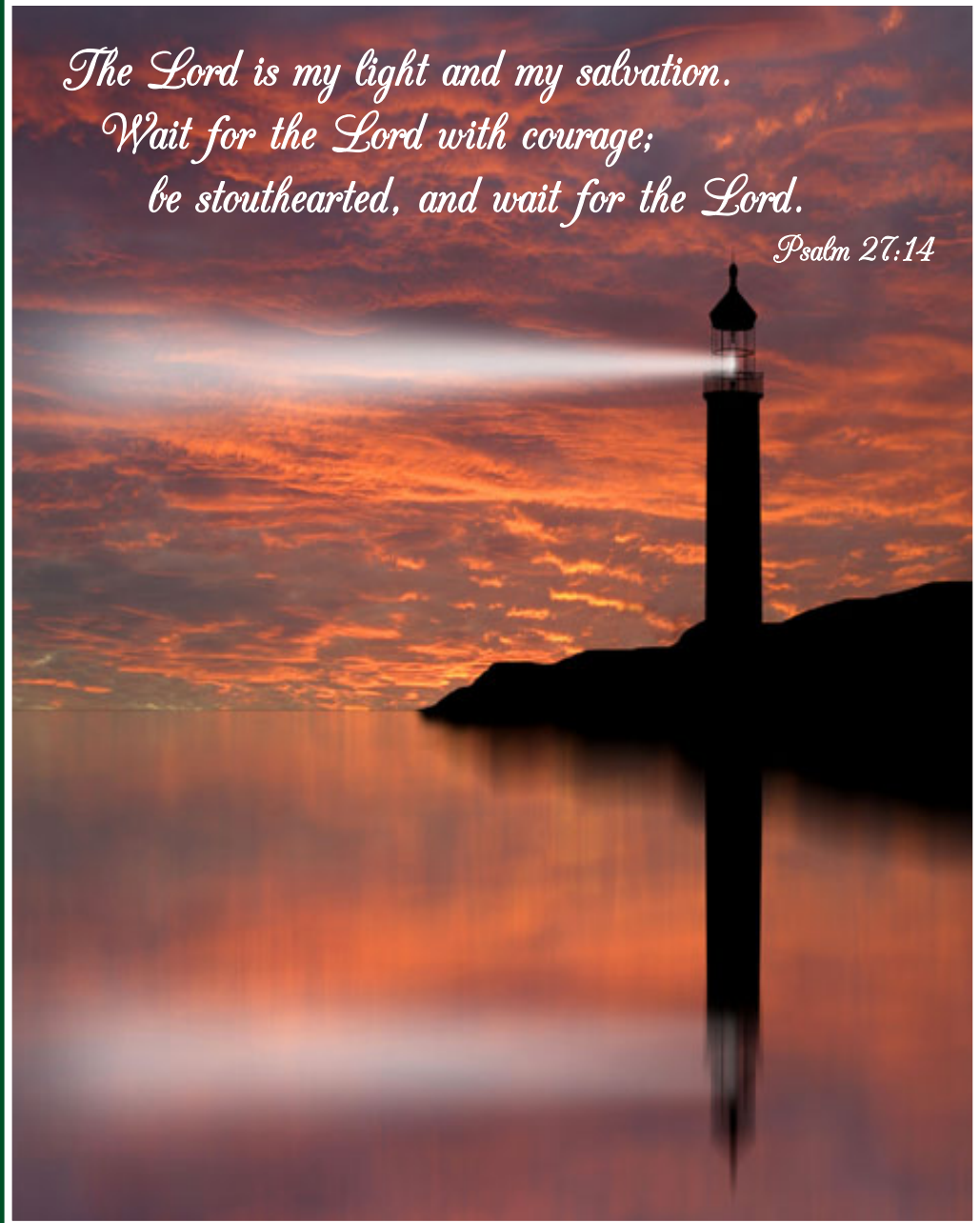

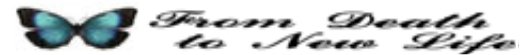

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Sacramental objects, such as rosaries, statues, medals, scapulars, holy water, ashes, palms, oils, icons, crucifixes, church bells, candles, incense, and Holy cards,

are part of our inherited Roman Catholic tradition, hence are important in the lives of most Catholics. Sacramental actions familiar to anyone attending Mass include, making the Sign of the Cross, bowing, genuflecting, folding hands, and blessings. Sacramentals are signs and symbols that prepare us to receive grace and dispose us to cooperate with grace. "sacramentals sanctify almost every event of [our] lives with the divine grace which flows from the pascal mystery of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ" (CCC, 1670). Furthermore, scripture reveals that encounters with God often involve the natural world: the burning bush, a column of cloud, pillar of fire, whispering wind, or tongues of fire. We believe, therefore, that God continues to speak to us not only in words, but also through signs and symbols. God uses signs and symbols to teach us, thus when we use signs and symbols in worship we are using God's language.

For me, the natural world is filled with beauty and wonder, and is a reminder of God's presence. When I am surrounded by flowers and trees, waterfalls and mountains, rolling plains and lush forests, arid deserts and amazing rock formations, hot springs, geysers, tranquil thermal pools, and bubbling mud pots, I know that I am in the presence of God; God is always reflected through His creations. When I see the great diversity of life, gaze at the night sky ablaze with the moon and stars, watch one season unfold into the next, I feel that God is speaking to me, reassuring me that His love is ever present and always guiding me. As I recognize my brother or sister in the face of a stranger, I know God is teaching, leading me to kindness and service. Yes, I use traditional sacramentals and sacramental actions, but I know God's presence most completely in the beauty and wonders of the natural world, which reminds me God is omnipresent.

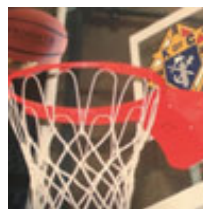

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children ~ January 23



Roe v. Wade that essentially legalized abortion in all fifty states for almost fifty years was finally overturned on June 24, 2022, by the Supreme Court. However, that decision simply deferred the decision on abortion to state legislatures. Thus, abortion remains legal in the majority of states.

In response to this ongoing attack against human life, the bishops of the United States have designated today, January 23 (generally January 22 but moved to the 23rd if 22nd is a Sunday), as “a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.”

Both child and mother need your prayers and your acts of penance - that every mother makes the choice for life, and that the right to life will be enshrined in every civil law throughout the world. Your acts of penance help atone for every abortion committed, especially for the repentance and healing of everyone involved.

Don't underestimate the power of your prayers and penance. Unite yourself to the Body of Christ, and do your part to bring healing to the past and true hope for the future.

Sunday of the Word of God January 22



In 2019, Pope Francis established the *Sunday of the Word of God* to be celebrated each year on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Holy Father stated in his apostolic letter instituting the observance, “Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of His word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world.”

In the hearing of God's word the Church is built up and grows, and in the signs of the liturgical celebration God's wonderful, past works in the history of salvation are presented anew as mysterious realities. God in turn makes use of the congregation of the faithful that celebrates the Liturgy in order that His word may speed on and be glorified and that his name be exalted among the nations.

The word of God proclaimed in the celebration of God's mysteries does not only address present conditions but also looks back to past events and forward to what is yet to come. Thus God's word shows us what we should hope for with such a longing that in this changing world our hearts will be set on the place where our true joys lie.

Memorial of Saints Timothy and Titus January 26



Saints Timothy and Titus were apostles of an Apostle. They were trusted friends and co-workers with Saint Paul through many of his trials.

St. Paul eventually set both up as heads of local Churches and encouraged them as would a father. They, along with many others, carried out on a local level a priestly ministry.

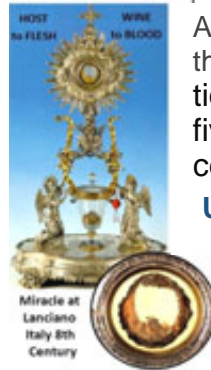
