



Lent Begins February 22




Lent begins on February 22nd and we will once again be offering the Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings at 5:30pm.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Take a minute to ask yourself what it means to be a prophet. Have you ever thought of yourself as a modern day prophet?

For me prophecy/prophetic wisdom is allowing the teachings of Jesus to not only be the focus but also the guide for my daily life. Consequently, prophecy is not about foretelling the future.

rather it is recognizing God's call, responding that call, and leading others to God through my actions and perhaps words.

Oracular means to speak as if inspired by God, i.e. prophecy in the Biblical sense. When we speak and act, inspired or guided by God we may come to a better understanding of ourselves and our lives while helping others to understand themselves, their actions, words, and lives through new eyes. To be prophetic is to see what already exists with new eyes, a different perspective, and to challenge the status quo as Jesus did through his teachings and healings.

In his book *Near Occasion of Grace*, Fr. Richard Rohr writes: "Our age has come to expect satisfaction. We have grown up in an absolutely unique period when having . . .possessing and accomplishing have been real options. They have given us an illusion of fulfillment – and fulfillment now – as long as we are clever enough, quick enough, and pray or work hard enough for our goals or rewards." Yet many times the goals we set, our actions and words, our accomplishments, and our relationships are so egocentric and self-fulling that we fail to heed our true calling from God. Our prophetic wisdom and voice are hidden and silenced by our need for instant gratification. Yet as Fr. Rohr points out, what appears to be fulfillment generally leave us with just the opposite feelings. We are restless, searching for the next possession, accomplishment, pleasure or adulation. I know this has been true in my life, yet these things did not give me feelings of inner joy or peace. I realized that I needed to let go of myself and my need for self aggrandizement before I could truly feel the presence of God, hear His voice, trust in His call, and respond to His love, grace, and desire for me to understand my goodness and fulfillment that is found through an honest relationship with Christ Jesus. I know I am still a work in progress. Will you join me in searching for prophetic wisdom and truth.

Our Lady of Lourdes Feast Day February 11



On February 11, 1858, Mary appeared to Bernadette Soubirous – the first of 18 visits.

When she asked the Lady's identity, she replied, "I am the Immaculate Conception." The Blessed Virgin, through Bernadette, had come to call sinners to a change of heart.

Her message was a request for prayer and penance. She also said that a chapel was to be built on the site and processions held. On Feb. 25, the Lady told Bernadette to dig in the dirt and drink of the stream. She began to dig and found water to drink.

In 1865, after a thorough investigation, the apparitions were approved for devotion by the Catholic Church. A shrine was built there, which remains a popular place of pilgrimage. The latest (and 69th) approved miracle involving a healing in the water of Lourdes took place in May 1989. After extensive investigation the Church approved it in July 2013.

The water continues to flow from where she had dug with her hands until it was producing over 32,000 gallons of water a day – as it still does. Over 2 million people Lourdes visit each year.

Bernadette died in 1879 at the age of 35, and was later canonized. The body of the blessed Saint can still be seen in its glass coffin, intact and incorrupt, looking like a young woman asleep.






