



Mission Statement



From the Pastor's Pen

In the days after Christmas and New Years, California and parts of neighboring states experienced what has been called “atmospheric rivers.” After years of drought, rain came in torrents, bringing floods, mudslides, and death. These “rivers” are an example of climate extremes, brought about by misuse of the environment. Pope Francis, in his landmark encyclical “Laudato Si” in 2015, sensing such catastrophes, cried out for greater care for the earth, our “common home.”

Water is a critical gift in God’s creation. There are several water stories in the Hebrew Scripture: water as part of creation; the great flood in the days of Noah; the Exodus story of the crossing of the Red Sea and Jordan River; the people of Israel crying out for water on their Exodus journey. There are also important water stories in the New Testament: the baptism of John in the Jordan River; the water jars of the Cana wedding feast; and the story in today’s gospel of this 3rd Sunday of Lent: the woman at the well.

In this account, Jesus and his disciples rested at a well-known landmark called “Jacob’s Well.” While the apostles go to a nearby village to secure provisions for the journey, a woman comes to the well to draw water. A conversation with Jesus ensues and the woman is gradually led to the conviction that Jesus is the source of “living water.” All of us, too, have that same conviction: we embrace Jesus, beginning our journey of faith in the waters of baptism.

The Scripture of this Third Sunday of Lent could also offer us an examination of conscience about our use of water, as well as the ways we treat our environment. The warnings have been coming for some time about the misuse and degradation of the resources God has given us. Often we take for granted that fresh, potable water will be always be available for us. Water is so often wasted or polluted. Yet people don’t seem to notice or care that water may not always be there for us. Areas of our world today are experiencing extreme drought or water shortages. As we hear the gospel story today about water, let’s commit ourselves to a conscious effort to take care of this precious resource.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



What does it mean to "Give Alms?" We are told when we fast and abstain from eating certain food during Lent, to donate the extra money to the poor. I ask myself, is that the true meaning behind giving alms; how do I grow spiritually through giving extra money to the poor: am I called in other ways, especially in light of Jesus' teaching: "Blessed are you who are poor for the kingdom of God is yours" (Luke 6:20), or "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5:3). The poor (*anawim*) found in Hebrew scripture describes the poor in spirit as those without material possessions, whose confidence is in God. In other words, the poor in spirit remain faithful to God in times of difficulty as well as in good times. So, who are the poor: you and I, all humanity, or just those without means?

The obvious answer is those who lack the basic necessities of life (food, clothing, shelter, medical care). Although giving money to assist these poor is certainly needed, I feel it is also important to give my time in service, not just by serving at a food pantry or shelter, but also by working toward changing societal conditions which ignore the underlying problem of food insecurity, homelessness, and lack of basic, preventative medical care. There are many times I feel that I have little to offer the poor but then I realize I can make a difference by putting my hands to work and my voice to advocating for change.

Thinking further about *anawim*, I also realize there are times when I am poor. Although I have the means to provide for my basic needs, I fail to trust God and I often fail to realize that God is always walking with me in good times and in my darkness. I have been blessed to participate in missions working with the materially poor. What was unexpected on these occasions was how much they moved me spiritually. They helped me understand how simple acts of kindness and community enriched each of us, and brought us closer to the true meaning of "Living in the Kingdom of God." The entirety of humanity is on a journey of searching and through others I have learned that the greatest gift on my journey is learning to trust in the love of God and sharing that love. There are many ways to give alms, but for me the gift of meeting, ministering, and loving one another is the greatest gift; a pure gift of God's grace.



St. Patrick Feast Day - March 17

There are many legends and stories about St. Patrick. Perhaps the most well known is the legend that he drove all of the snakes out of Ireland. However, all evidence suggests that post-glacial Ireland never had snakes.



In his early teens he was captured by Irish raiders in his birth-country of Scotland and taken to Ireland as a slave to tend sheep. During his captivity, he turned to God in prayer. Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. There he found sailors who took him back to Britain. He had another dream in which the people of Ireland were calling out to him "We beg you, holy youth, to come and walk among us once more."

He studied for the priesthood and was ordained. Later, he was ordained a bishop, and returned back to Ireland to establish the church. Though the task was difficult and dangerous, he persisted and was able to build a strong foundation for Christianity. The Irish people were very receptive to his teachings especially since that he was able to take several of their Celtic symbols and Christianize them. The most prominent of these is the green shamrock. He used this plant, which was held sacred by the Druids, as a symbol of the Trinity.

Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years, working many miracles and writing of his love for God in Confessions. After years of living in poverty, traveling and enduring much suffering he died March 17, 461. Patrick was a humble, pious, gentle man, who had total devotion to and trust in God. He feared nothing, not even death, so complete was his trust in God, and of the importance of his mission.


