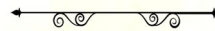
Mission Statement

The Stabat Mater is a 13th-century Christian hymn to Mary, which portrays her suffering as Jesus Christ's mother during his crucifixion.

The title comes from the very first line of the text, "Stabat Mater dolorosa", which means "the sorrowful mother was standing."

In 1736, Giovanni Battista Pergolesi wrote this setting of the Stabat Mater in a monastery in Pozzuoli, near Naples for soprano, alto and chamber orchestra in 13 movements.

From the Pastor's Pen

In 2002, seven siblings and their families gathered for the funeral Mass and burial of my dad, Ronald Michael. At the graveside, my brother Ron gave each sibling a soybean grain. As the casket was being lowered into the ground, each sibling threw a soybean grain into the grave. Why? My dad owned and operated a grain elevator business for many years. So this gesture was a way of paying tribute to him, as well as thanking him for his hard work and providing for our family. Like the soybean seed that could be planted and produce new life, so in faith we had trust that dad, as a man of deep faith, would rise again to new life in God's Kingdom.

We honor the dead in many ways. For the more famous people like Presidents and war heroes, there are public memorials such as statues and plaques. Though most of those who die are not famous or well-known, still they should be remembered, as all of us lovingly remember our deceased loved ones. Especially for us who have Christian faith, our grief is touched with joy because of the promise of new life.

Jesus had a dear friend by the name of Lazarus, who lived with his sisters, Martha and Mary, in the town of Bethany. They were a close-knit family, as we can tell by the grief of the sisters when Lazarus died. The gospel tells us that even Jesus wept. However, it was not yet the time for Lazarus to enter into the Kingdom of God. The powerful story that we hear today from the gospel of John tells us that out of physical death Jesus called Lazarus back to earthly life again. Yes, Lazarus would die again a natural death, but there is a motive in this act of Jesus. He wanted all to know that he had and has power over death and that all who put trust in him would rise again to new life.

This promise is the very heart of our hope and belief. Let us hear these gospel words today with great confidence.

Know that my prayers are with you each day.

The Devotion of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Recitation of the Seven Sorrows Rosary
Friday, March 31, 4:00pm in the Church



Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard devotion in the Church around the 14th century. It was revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary's Seven Sorrows would bring great signal graces. The devotion consists in praying seven Hail Mary's while meditating on the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

The Seven Sorrows of Mary

1. The prophecy of Simeon
2. The flight into Egypt
3. The loss of the Child Jesus in the temple
4. Mary meets Jesus on the way to Calvary
5. Mary stands at the foot of the cross
6. Mary receives the dead body of Jesus
7. Jesus is placed in the tomb

Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside her Divine Son as he gave his life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of his passion as only a mother can.

Our Lady's Sorrows are commemorated on the liturgical calendar twice a year - the Friday before Palm Sunday and September 15.

All are invited to participate on Friday, March 31.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



This year I have envisioned Lent as my "Sabbatical Leave;" a stepping away from my usual daily routines, to a restful,

peaceful journey with Christ Jesus. Beginning with the reception of the cross of ashes on my forehead, Lent is a journey to Easter when the cross will once again be transformed into the glory of the resurrection. Part of my journey is a desire to shed my crosses: sorrow, grief, fear, misunderstanding, hurt, and trepidation, which will lead me to a fuller transformation into the Body of Christ.

We all hear and speak of what we are giving up for Lent. Instead my focus is on what I receive as I give myself to Christ Jesus; as I trust in him to be my intimate guide through the darkness of pain and depression, the shadow of doubt, and the gloom of anxiety about who I am, what I have failed to be, and how my future will unfold. Strangely, I feel a sense of peace this Lenten season. I have felt the realization that God receives me as I am, leads me away from my inner turmoil to where I need to be, and brings me once again into the light and the hope that is the promise of Easter.

As an academic on sabbatical I was relieved of my regular teaching and administrative duties but required to produce something new: a new course, new research, new curriculum, new methodology, a new publication. The time I spent on sabbatical was certainly different but my days were still filled with work, gathering data, reaching out to peers, and attempting to be creative. When I think of Lent as a sabbatical, however, my focus is on rest, sitting quietly with Jesus, and allowing myself to feel the presence of the Holy Spirit. I believe Lent is a time for renewal and revisioning of what life can become as a disciple of Jesus. I am sure you recognize that the word Sabbath and Sabbatical are related. God leads us to rest on the Sabbath, to step away from the ordinary, and experience the extraordinary, the presence of God experienced through worship, song, and rest. For me this Lenten season is an extension of the Sabbath; a true Sabbatical from the ordinary and a time to be with God, to embrace grace, to let go of myself inflicted business, to find peace and comfort, to be immersed in Jesus' light drawing me toward Easter.

Chrism Mass Did You Know????



Every year there is a Chrism Mass at which the Bishop blesses the three oils that will be used in the parishes for the next year. The oils from the previous Chrism Mass are used in the Easter Fire at the Easter Vigil.

The three oils are the Oil of Catechumens, Oil of the Sick and the Sacred Chrism.

- **Oil of Catechumens** is used to anoint those preparing for the Rite of Baptism. Children are anointed on the breast bone.
- **Oil of the Sick** is used in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, to anoint anyone that needs to be strengthened for an upcoming surgery, beginning of an illness or becoming more frail due to age.
- **Sacred Chrism** the only one that has an aroma, is used in Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders as an anointing with the Holy Spirit. At the Chrism Mass the Bishop breathes the Holy Spirit into the oil.

This year's the Chrism Mass is at the Cathedral of Immaculate Conception on March 30 at 7:00pm.

Military Outreach Ministry

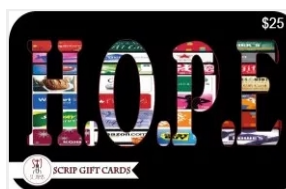


The Military Outreach meeting scheduled for Tuesday, March 28 has been cancelled.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Palm Sunday



Next weekend, churches provide palms to be carried in the opening moments of the liturgy, as we gratefully recall Jesus' entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. The children who greeted him on that day used what was both handy and traditional, since palms were carried to inaugurate the joyful harvest feast of Succoth. To this day, faithful Jews are directed to take a beautiful palm branch, green and straight as possible, called a *lulav*, and bind it with three myrtle branches fifteen inches long, and two longer willow branches. At the end of the temple service, everyone carries the *lulav*, circling the sanctuary in a dance called the *Hoshanot*, singing hymns of joy.

In other climates, Jews and Christians alike have had to make accommodations over the years. In Italy, everyone carries olive branches, often brought from their own garden. In England, forsythia branches are preferred, a relative of the olive, sign of peace. Germans prefer pussywillows, and others look for flowering spring branches. In our part of the world, we use palm branches to express joy and welcome, and to remind us of the joy of Christ's victory even as we prepare to commemorate his passion?
