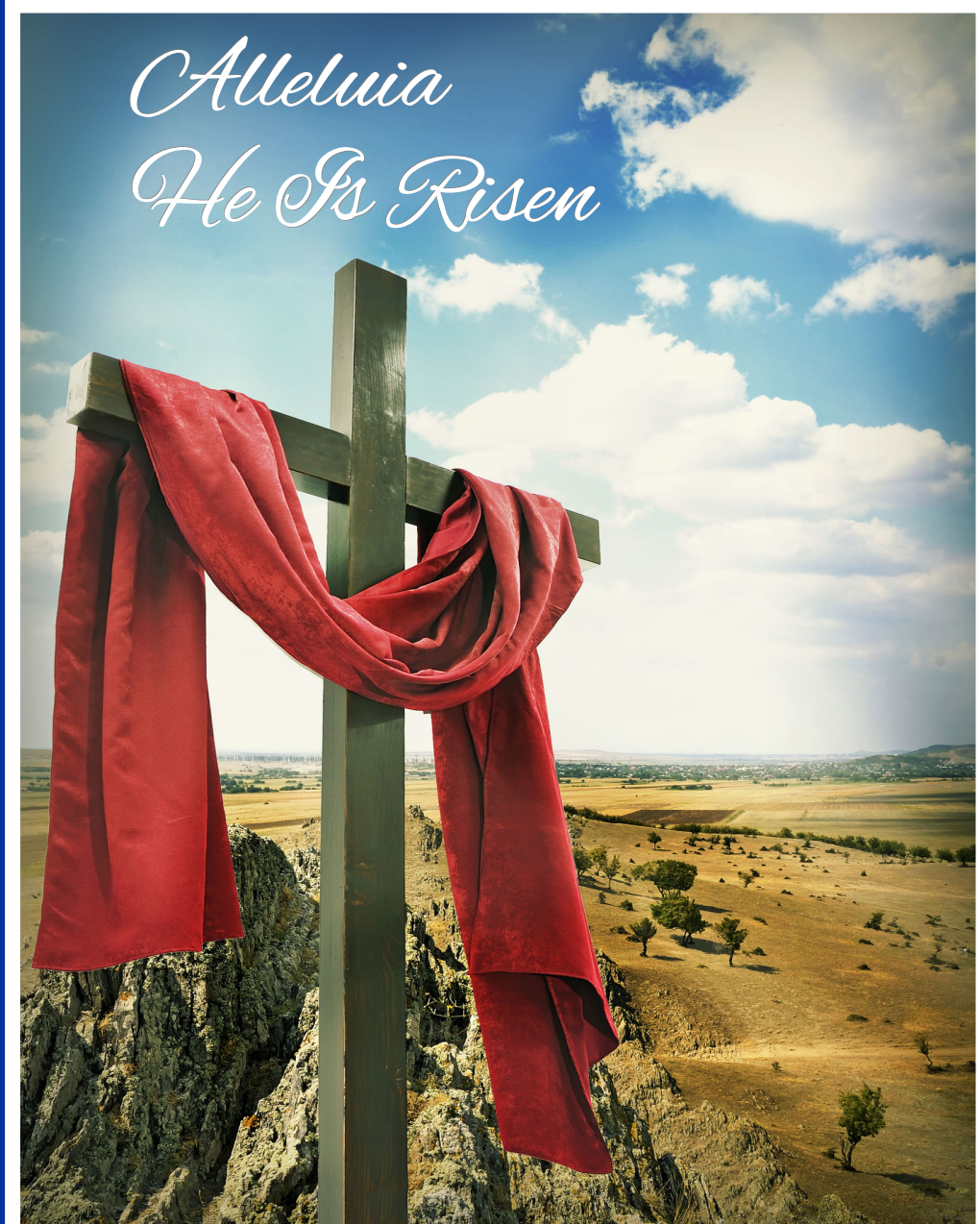

Total meals served at our three fish fries surpassed 1,850 - a record number in any one year. We again offered both dine-in and drive-thru options, making it convenient for all to purchase one or more of our "famous" fish dinners.

As you can imagine it takes a large team of workers to prepare for, cook and serve that many meals - 67 of them at our March 24 meal. Much of the prep work (such as scrubbing hundreds of potatoes) takes place a day or two before the event.

From the Pastor's Pen

I know that I speak for Fr. Mike as well in wishing you a blessed and joyous Easter. So many of you helped to make Lent and Holy Week such a special time of spiritual growth in our parish. We thank all those who assisted us with the liturgy: the lectors, servers, sacristans, music ministers, Communion ministers, and those who provided a beautiful environment. We are thrilled to be blessed with a wonderful process of preparing new members for entrance into our Church family. Thank you to Sandy Gagnon and her team of sponsors. Thank you to Danny Baker, choir members, instrumentalists, and cantors for sharing your musical talents.

Easter is about new life. Whether we are cradle Catholics, newcomers, old or young, fervent in faith or sinners, no matter what race, color, life-style, or orientation, all are welcome. All are renewed in faith by Easter grace. We live in a world or culture where people feel unwelcome, feel the hurt of discrimination, feel left out of economic benefits, feel alienation, feel alone and hurting. The Church reaffirms today: all are welcome. All are loved by our heavenly Father. All are caught up in the Paschal Mystery. All are saved by the Blood of Christ.

Easter is about good news. Perhaps the post-Easter challenge for all of us is how we might bring that good news to others. The statistics today are daunting. In our country, about a third of those surveyed claimed no affiliation with any church. Only about a quarter of Catholics attend Mass each weekend. Many of our young people attend Mass only sporadically after Confirmation. It doesn't sound very much like good news. If Easter is about good news and we are bearers of good news, then the obvious question is: how can the light of my faith shine so that I can influence others to come to know and love the Risen Lord? How can I bring new life to the Church, to the parish, to my family, to my neighborhood, to those I encounter? I am inspired by the deep faith of the people of our parish family and I know that your good example gives a strong and faithful witness. I thank you for that gift.

May this Easter season bring not only joy and peace, but courage to be witnesses.

My prayers are with you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Similar to last weekend, we begin this Saturday's liturgy outside. Journey with me as we move from the picture on the left to



the picture on the right. In darkness we lit a single candle, the Paschal Candle, thus beginning the Easter Vigil. Processing into a darkened worship space, this single light was passed to all present. Our worship space has a capacity of 1,200 people; imagine all 1,200 holding the "Light of Christ." No longer in darkness we heard words of love, grace, and salvation from Genesis through the gospel account of his resurrection. In this light we celebrated new life through baptism, we welcomed the Holy Spirit in confirmation, and we shared a meal, the body and blood of Jesus, uniting, conforming, and transforming us into his presence for the world. We sang joyfully, acknowledging the many gifts we continue to receive through God's grace and love.

Our journey through the Lenten season was a path for inner reflection, discernment, and reconciliation. Through prayer, fasting, and giving of ourselves in service to God, through remembrance of God's loving and never ceasing embrace, we now arrive at Easter. We again welcome new beginnings through sharing in the life of Christ Jesus. My journey this year has been both difficult and renewing. I have faced physical pain, compelled to let go of baggage which blocked my relationship with God, and have tried to be open to God's will for me. My journey continues as I struggle with feelings, desires, and longings. I now realize, however, that my greatest longing is to welcome God's presence, to find strength and courage for surrendering to God's will, to walk the twisted and difficult way set before me, and to share the love of Jesus with those I encounter (using words of explanation when asked). I have discovered that sitting quietly and calmly with God, allowing myself to be less preoccupied with "to do lists," has brought a renewed joy and hopefulness for life. May you also experience new life in Christ this Easter.

A Special Promise of Mercy

Our Lord's promise to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy is recorded three times in the *Diary of St. Faustina*:

I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (*Diary 1109*).

Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary 300*).

The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary 699*).

It's allowed for one to go to confession up to 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday

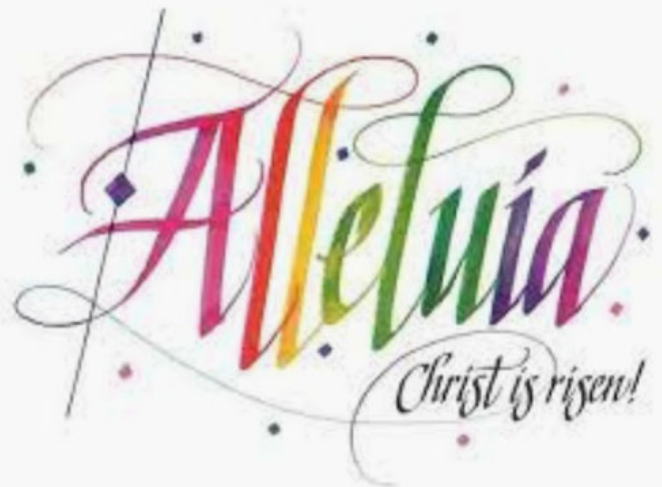
