From the Pastor's Pen

I begin with a very positive note. Thank you to the prayer warriors who sent notes of thanks and affirmation to me and many others during the season of Lent. It is a fantastic ministry and lifts the spirits and faith of all those who receive these cards. The "warriors" are doing great works of ministry. You are truly an Easter gift to the parish.

I continue on a more negative note. On March 21, the Kansas City Star published an article about a report issued by the "United Nations Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change." The report conveys a message that should be of concern for all people of our world family. The gist of the message: "Burning fossil fuels is threatening human well-being and the stability of much of life on earth, and our chance to avoid the most severe impacts is fast moving out of reach." Yes, I know that many people dismiss such news and say that it is simply a cycle of change that the earth has experienced over the centuries. In my estimation, such a response is simplistic and avoids the reality of what is happening in the world around us.

Let's look at some of the words of the report. Greenhouse gas emissions generated by human activity have unequivocally caused global warming, and emissions have continue to rise. Just look around at weather events in our world today: the extreme drought in the western part of our country, in Europe, in parts of Africa, and other areas of our world. The extreme rain and snow in California. Yes, the rain and snow alleviate the drought conditions but signal another extreme. Scientists agree that global emissions are at the root of weather extremes. To cut carbon emissions requires a commitment from all countries of the world. Some scientists believe that it is already too late to prevent catastrophic changes.

The celebration of Easter is a celebration of new life. Yes, new life is a gift of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus, but Jesus gives all disciples the task of being life-givers. As Pope Francis reminds us, the earth is our common home. It is the task of all of us to be good stewards, preserving and protecting natural resources. So I encourage you to examine your own commitment to the well-being of our planet and to be dedicated to practices that sustain and protect our well-being.

My prayers are with you each day.

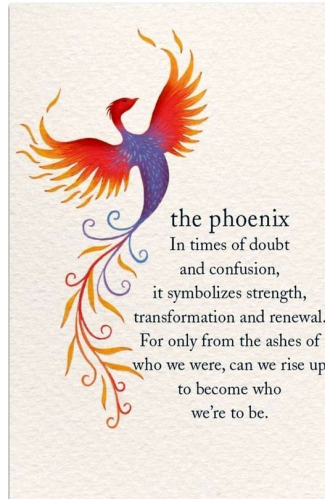

Someone is Watching and Wondering

This year, as always we began the season of Lent by receiving ashes, and journeyed for forty day with prayer, reconciliation, fasting, and giving to those in need. Our journey led us to the light of Christ as we rejoiced in His resurrection and the joy of Easter. As Catholics we continue to celebrate the Easter



Season until the Feast of Pentecost. This year my journey has taken on a new dimension. As I continue to see the amazing images from the James Web telescope and marvel at new discoveries, I am confronted by the realization that creation continues; as old stars die, throwing massive amounts of energy and matter into space, new stars and solar systems are formed. As a church community we also

continue to face death and creation; there is new life through birth and rebirth in the waters of baptism. Thinking about rebirth the image of a Phoenix came to mind. This bird has been used for centuries to symbolize resurrection, renewal and rebirth from the ashes. Witnessing the baptism of our Elect, Confirmations, and renewal of baptismal promises, before receiving the Body and Blood of Christ at the Easter Vigil, I sensed that we were rising from the ashes of Lent to a new, renewed, refreshed life in Christ. I wondered, however, if I had left my disappointments, pains, sorrows, and hurts with those ashes; did my prayer and reconciliation during Lent bring release; or do I continue to live in the past darkness and ash? Have I followed the light; is my faith renewed and strengthened; have I experienced rebirth; or have I stood back, watching others receive the gift of Easter's resurrection while I continue to struggle with letting go? I have heard these words many times: "Ashes to ashes and dust to dust," but as a follower of Christ Jesus I am forced to believe that from the ashes we can and do arise to new life; we are given new life in Christ.

As I continue through the Easter Season and my time on earth, I pray that I may always strive to follow the light and embrace rebirth from the ashes of pain, sorrow, disappointment, sin, and death. I offer you the Joy and Rebirth of Easter!
