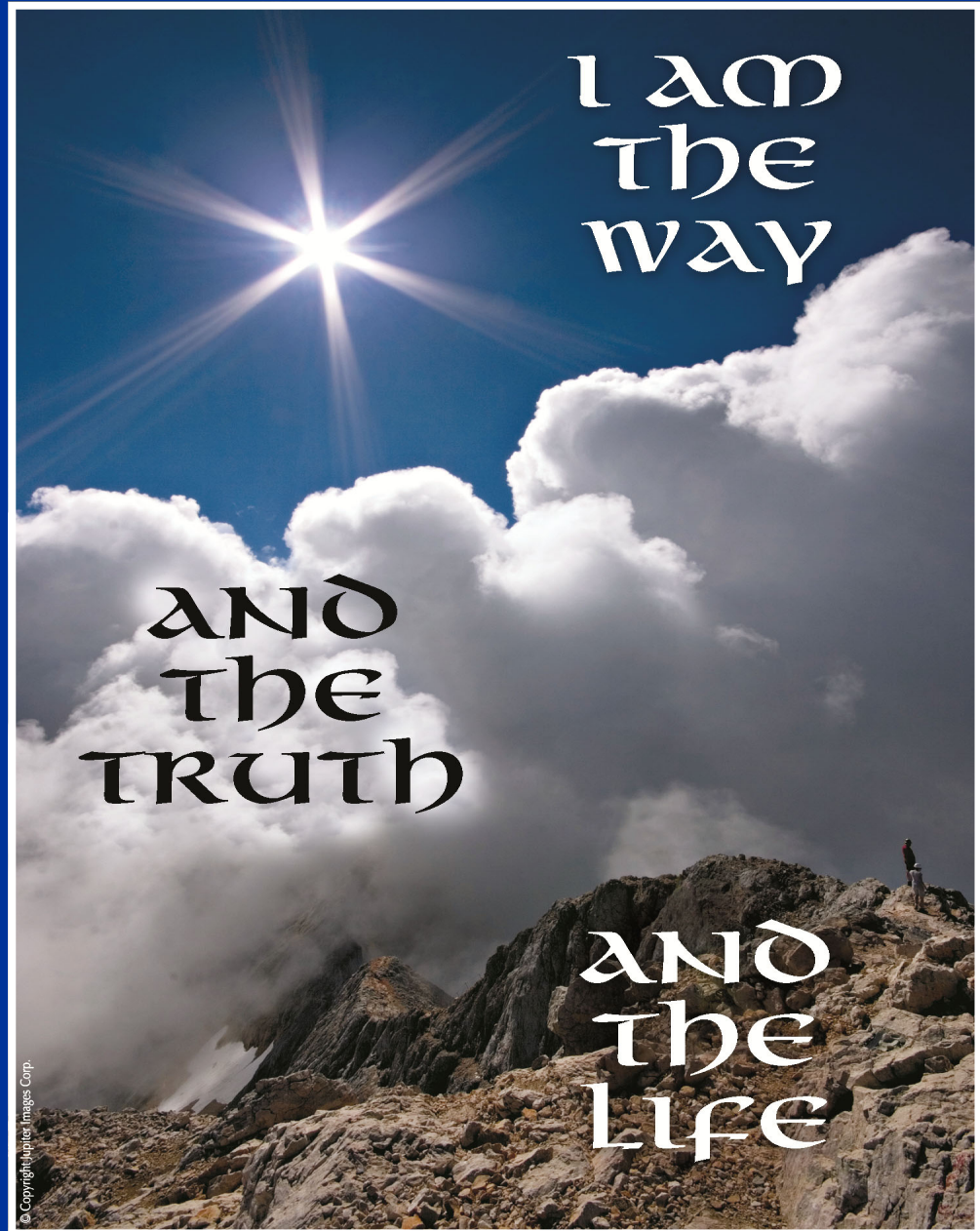

From the Pastor's Pen

This weekend's gospel text contains familiar words, often used at funeral liturgies because they are so comforting. "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Have faith in God; have faith also in me."

Jesus assures us that he is going to prepare a place for us. We do not know what that word "place" means. Yet we trust that it implies a spiritual presence with God, being in a state of perfect joy and peace.

Perhaps the words that follow are more difficult to understand: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Yes, for Christian believers it makes absolute good sense. But we try to understand the meaning in the context of a much larger sense. Every person is created in the image and likeness of God. Every person is beloved by God. Every person belongs to God. And yet millions of persons either do not know the God revealed to us by Jesus or they do not have faith in Him. They may be atheists or agnostics, or they may follow another "god." Does this mean that there is no way that they can come to the God revealed by Jesus who said, "No one can come to the Father except through me?" What is to be their final destiny? Are they shut out of the Kingdom of God forever? Do you think that I have the answer?? It is a question pondered by theologians down through the ages: what is the ultimate fate of those who don't know or believe in the God revealed by Jesus?

Some would say that perhaps they are "saved" by their human goodness: their kindness, their sense of moral right, their works of charity, their desire to do what is right and good. Maybe in some sense, living with strong moral character and love they are living in a spirit of Jesus and are somehow "anonymous" Christians. We would hope that is the case. We put it in the hands of God.

We only know that we are on a journey and that there is a destination. The path we follow is our Catholic faith. Prayer, the sacraments, works of charity all help us to stay on the path and not get lost or make a wrong turn. We pray for the gift of fidelity as we are touched by the word of God this weekend.

My prayers are with you each day.

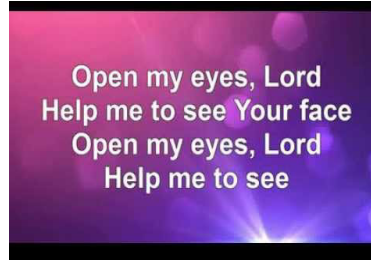
Volunteers Needed For HOPE Card Sales

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Two Sundays ago the Gospel proclaimed was the story of the disciples on the Road to Emmaus. Hearing these words once again, I was struck by the inability of the disciples to recog-

nize Jesus and I wondered, "Do I recognize Jesus?" Perhaps seeing Jesus is the point. The disciples had a preconceived idea of what the messiah should be and never truly saw Jesus as He was. I must confess, I too have preconceptions that prevent me from seeing Jesus where He is. I am blinded by my culture, teachings I received, my understanding and biases. I think He calls me to see Him in unlikely people, places and events. I do not need to search for Jesus, rather Jesus continues to seek me, meet me where I am and to lead me where I should go.

Luke's story can be seen as a mirror to our Mass; Jesus approaches us and teaches us through God's word; He gathers us at the table, offering His body and blood. We are nurtured and fed, strengthened, and sustained for the journey; and once our hearts are re-enlivened with His spirit, we are sent to lovingly serve. At both the altar of the word and the altar of the sacrifice Jesus fills us with mercy and grace, transforms us so that we may become His presence in the world. Yet I know that I continually fail; I do not see Jesus in others, and I fail to be Jesus to others. I fail to recognize Jesus resurrected and present in my life. I believe Jesus is with me even when I do not see. He graces me with new sight through the nurturing presence of a parent, love of a spouse, cherished friendships, kindness of a stranger, beauty of a sunrise or sunset, birth and rebirth, and the care and compassion offered in times of sadness or sorrow. St. Theresa of Avila wrote: "Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks with compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours." If I am to see Christ then I must see Him as He appears, today, in my life. I must seek to become His presence to others. Quoting Jesse Manibusan: "Open my eyes Lord, help me to see your face, Open my ears Lord, help me to hear your voice, Open my heart Lord, help me to love like you."

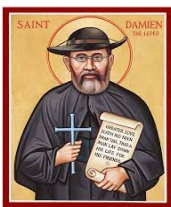

St. Damien of Molokai Feast Day May 10



St. Damien of Molokai, also called Father Damien, was a Belgian priest who devoted his life to missionary work among the Hawaiian lepers.

Born in Belgium in 1840, he joined the Society of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary in 1858 and went as a missionary to the Sandwich (Hawaiian) Islands in 1863. He reached Honolulu in 1864 and was ordained a priest the same year.

Moved by the miserable condition of the lepers whom the Hawaiian government had deported to Kalaupapa on the island of Molokai, he volunteered to take charge of the settlement. He served as both pastor and physician to the colony and undertook many projects to better the conditions there. He improved water and food supplies and housing and founded two orphanages, receiving help from other priests for only 6 of his 16 years on Molokai.

In 1884 he contracted leprosy, refused to leave for treatment and died in 1889. He was beautified by Pope John Paul II in 1995 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009.



Why May Was Designated As The Month of Mary

A number of traditions link the month of May to Mary. Alfonso (a Spanish king) in the 13th century wrote in his *Cantigas de Santa Maria* about the special honoring of Mary during specific dates in May. Eventually, the entire month was filled with special observances and devotions to Mary.

The origin of the conventional May devotion is still relatively unknown. Herbert Thurston identifies the seventeenth century as the earliest instance of the adoption of the custom of consecrating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin by special observances. It is certain that this form of Marian devotion began in Italy. Around 1739, witnesses speak of a particular form of Marian devotion in May in Grezzano near Verona. In 1747 the Archbishop of Genoa recommended the May devotion as a devotion for the home. Specific prayers for them were promulgated in Rome in 1838.

According to Frederick Holweck, the May devotion in its present form originated at Rome where Father Latomia of the Roman College of the Society of Jesus, to counteract infidelity and immorality among the students, made a vow at the end of the eighteenth century to devote the month of May to Mary. From Rome the practice spread to the other Jesuit colleges and thence to nearly every Catholic church of the Latin rite.

In Rome by 1813, May devotions were held in as many as twenty churches. From Italy, May devotions soon spread to France. In Belgium, the May devotions, at least as a private devotion, were already known by 1803. The tradition of honoring Mary in a month-long May devotion spread eventually around the Roman Catholic world in the 19th century together with a month-long devotion to Jesus in June and the Rosary in October.

In his 1965 encyclical, *Mense Maio*, Pope Paul VI identified the month of May as an opportune time to incorporate special prayers for peace into traditional May devotions. Pope Pius XII, recognizing traditional precedents, proclaimed the "Queenship of Mary" through his encyclical, *Ad Caeli Reginam*.

Our Lady of Fatima May 13

106th Anniversary of
Blessed Mother's
1st Apparition at Fatima

We can manifest our love and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her month of May by saying the Rosary daily.

On May 13, 1917 in the small village of Fatima in Portugal, Our Lady appeared to three shepherd children – Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco. She appeared six times between May 13, 1917 and October 13, 1917. In each and every apparition Our Lady insisted upon the praying of the most Holy Rosary.

On July 13, she said “Pray the Rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary to obtain peace in the world . . . for she alone can save it.”

By virtue of its meditative character, with the tranquil succession of Hail Marys, the Rosary has a peaceful effect on those who pray it. The Rosary is also a prayer for peace because of the fruits of charity which it produces. When prayed well in a truly meditative way, the Rosary leads to an encounter with Christ in his mysteries and so cannot fail to draw attention to the face of Christ in others, especially in the most afflicted

In a word, by focusing our eyes on Christ, the Rosary also makes us peacemakers in the world. By its nature as an insistent choral petition in harmony with Christ’s invitation to “pray ceaselessly” (Lk 18:1), the Rosary allows us to hope that, even today, the difficult “battle” for peace can be won. Far from offering an escape from the problems of the world, the Rosary obliges us to see them with responsible and generous eyes, and obtains for us the strength to face them with the certainty of God’s help and the firm intention of bearing witness in every situation to “love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony” (Col 3:14).

During her apparition on June 13, 1917, she said, “When you pray the Rosary, say this prayer after each mystery. We refer to this as the Fatima Prayer.

**O Jesus, forgive us our sins,
save us from the fires of hell,
lead all souls to Heaven,
especially those
who have most need of your mercy.**

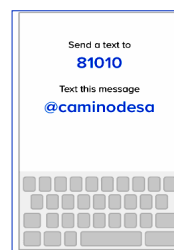
