### Someone is Watching and Wondering



On August 5, 1924, the *Chicago Tribune Syndicate*, a daily newspaper, introduced the cartoon strip, "Little Orphan Annie." The cartoonist Harold Gray created the waif,

Annie, with curly red hair, red dress, blank circular eyes, and a favorite expression "Leapin' lizards!" Annie with her dog Sandy were adopted by Oliver (Daddy) Warbucks, a self-made millionaire. Oliver Warbucks had three menservants: Punjab, an eight foot tall Indian; the Asp, an East Asian with mystical powers; and Mr. Am, a mysterious figure in the comic strip who was sometimes hinted to be God. In 1977, Annie's story was adapted for a Broadway musical, with a movie adaptation appearing in 1982. Although publication of new adventures of Annie in the comic strip ended in 1974, popularity of this little girl continues. Myself, I still enjoy her adventures and have vivid memories of my dad reading Annie in our Kansas City paper everyday, and my Aunt uttering "Leapin' lizards" at what seemed to me the oddest times.

You might be wondering, "Why is SLG writing about orphan Annie?" My simple answer is that today's gospel reading brought to mind not only this comic strip, musical, and movie, but also my own life. I think that anyone who has lost their parents is by definition an orphan, and of course I fall into this category. Not only do I miss my parents, but there are times of frustration when I know a simple conversation with them would bring comfort and answers. I find working through problems can be difficult without their counsel and wisdom. Then I remember today's reading from the Gospel of John: "I shall ask the Father and he will give you another Paraclete (advocate, intercessor, counselor, protector, support) to be with you forever. . . I shall not leave your orphans; I shall come to you" (14:16b, 18). These words re-enforce that I am never alone. I am surrounded by God's loving embrace, strength from the Holy Sprit, Jesus (present in the sacraments and love of others), and the Communion of Saints, which I believe includes my parents and other loved ones who have died. I can attest to the fact that there have been so many times when I search for answers and they seem to suddenly appear.

Like Annie, I have so many caring for me. God's grace is real!

#### How Mother's Day Became A National Holiday

Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1908, when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at St Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia.

Her campaign to make Mother's Day a recognized holiday in the United States began in 1905, the year her mother, Ann Reeves Jarvis, died. Anna Jarvis wanted to honor her mother by continuing the work she started and to set aside a day to honor all mothers because she believed a mother is "the person who has done more for you than anyone in the world."


In 1908, Congress rejected a proposal to make Mother's Day an official holiday, joking that they would also have to proclaim a "Mother-in-law's Day".

In 1914, Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating Mother's Day, held on the second Sunday in May, as a national holiday to honor mothers.
