From the Pastor's Pen

On March 13, 2013, the former Archbishop of Buenos Aires, Argentina, Jorge Mario Bergoglio, appeared at a balcony overlooking St. Peter's Piazza in Rome and was introduced as the new Pope, surprising the world by taking the name Francis. With a smile he began with the word "Good Evening" and asked all the people, Catholics and non-Catholics alike, to pray for him. Now, ten years later, we celebrate his years of the papacy, thanking God for giving us this great leader.

Already at the beginning of his papacy it was obvious that he would initiate a new way. Rather than living in the papal apartment he chose to live in the St. Martha Guest House, along with other bishops and priests. On the first Holy Thursday he washed the feet of 12 young prisoners of different nationalities and faiths, including two Muslims and two women. He made it clear that he would go out to the peripheries to share a meal with the hungry, visit the hospitalized, advocate for refugees, and travel to promote peace. In an anniversary Mass he stated: "We are all brothers and sisters. We must not be afraid to weep and to smile. If a person has forgotten how to cry, something is wrong, and if that person has forgotten to smile it's even worse!" Through his excellent encyclicals, through his reforms in the government of the Church, though his call for transparency, through his lifting up those on the margins, he has taught the faithful how to be Church. His call for responsible stewardship of the earth, the air, and the water has awakened people to respect our common home.

His most recent emphasis has been on synodality as a way of being Church. Listening sessions in parishes and dioceses across the world family have given a voice to the sharing of opinions by all the faithful. The Church is not just the Church of the Pope, bishops, and priests, but of all who are baptized into the Body of Christ. All the People of God share in a responsibility to foster the well-being of our common family. So yes, we thank God for the first ten years of Pope Francis' leadership, his vision, actions, example, and holiness. I ask you to pray each day for Pope Francis and ask God to watch over, protect, and enlighten him.

May God bless you. My prayers are with you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



In today's reading from the *Acts of the Apostles*, we read of the Ascension of Jesus, and I am sure most of you are familiar with images of Jesus, on a cloud,

rising into the heavens. For me, however, there is a line in this passage that is often overlooked: "They were still staring into the sky as he went when suddenly two men in white were standing beside them and they said, 'Why are you Galileans standing here looking into the sky?'" (Acts 1:10-11a). Considering this passage with the reading from the gospel: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations; baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. . . I am with you always," leaves little doubt as to the meaning of the two white-clad figures appearing to the disciples. Do not just stand there staring, get to work; proclaim the good news, share the love of Christ Jesus with everyone you meet.

By virtue of our baptism we are in-graced, through the power of the Holy Spirit to action. We are sent forth at the conclusion of every Mass, to love and serve one another. At times it may seem difficult, if not impossible to know where God is leading me. I question if I am moving in the right direction, doing enough for others, being open to and following God's will, or am I merely acting in a manner to satisfy my own desires or understanding of what is right. Am I limiting my actions as I stare into the sky, voice words of prayer without listening, or do I limit what I do because of fear of consequences? Am I afraid of offending others while I fail to heed God's call? Am I afraid of being alienated from friends, peers, family, and acquaintances, even though my failures alienate me from Jesus? Does my pride keep me from admitting failure and sins of omission? Do I only proclaim God's love and mercy with words.

As I thought about Jesus' ascension into heaven, I was drawn to the two figures in white. I feel they are speaking directly to me: "Why are you hesitating? Get moving, reach out, spread the good news (even when you need to use words) of unconditional love and grace, do not fear, act, Jesus is with you always, even through death." I am not an orphan. I am God's beloved child, a disciple of Jesus. I am called to embrace and share Jesus, all ways.
