

#### Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today we once again celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit to those first disciples at Pentecost, the birth of the Church. In the Acts of the Apostles the Holy Spirit is described as a living spirit that moved the community through faith, from fear to fearlessness. The Spirit transformed individuals into an inclusive missionary community, which not only understood the proclaimed words in their own languages, but moved them to proclaim the gospel, live in service and charity, and practice unconditional love. In considering the Pentecost event of the first century, I wonder what it means in me, living in the 21st century. How do I live as these earlier believers in Christ Jesus, without fear, pray fully, serving in charity, and love?

I believe to celebrate Pentecost I must be willing to examine my life and open myself to the path God sets before me. Perhaps this means letting go of what is dead while nurturing new life in the Spirit. A few weeks ago we read from the Gospel of John: "He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit" (John 15:2). I read these words with resistance and trepidation. I am relatively comfortable and secure with my life as it is. Change is difficult. It isn't easy to face loss, removing what is not life giving; I'm not even sure what needs to be pruned to encourage new growth at this stage in my life. If I am to welcome the Holy Spirit into my heart, if I am to live as Jesus taught, then I think I must let go of guilt, past mistakes, pain, and destructive behaviors. I must release the bonds on my heart, mind, and soul which block my awareness and openness to the Holy Spirit. If I believe that the Spirit that led the disciples in forming the body of Christ in the early Church, is the same Spirit I received at baptism and gave gifts at confirmation; if I am to share the Spirit inclusively with others, and believing that the Spirit is with me always, then I must also be willing to accept losses that lead to new life and nurture growth of the body of Christ. If you agree, say Amen, Amen, Amen!

## Thank You Fr. Michael For 55 Years Of Oedicated Service To The Church June 1, 1968 ~ June 1, 2023



Fr. Michael Volkmer, C.PP.S. was ordained a priest of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood on June 1, 1968, at St. Charles Seminary in Carthagena, OH, by Auxiliary Bishop Edward McCarthy.

Fr. Michael was born December 10, 1939 in Nebraska City, NE, the sec-

ond oldest of seven children and belonged to a parish served by Precious Blood priests. As a boy, he witnessed his parents' devotion to the Catholic faith; he attributes their example, in part, to his vocation.

He graduated from high school in 1958, attended Creighton University for two years, then entered St. Charles Seminary in Carthagina, OH where he studied theology. After ordination, he taught at the Precious Blood Seminary in Liberty, MO, for eight years.

He then moved into pastoral ministry, serving at St. Mary Parish in Centerville IA, from 1976-82. He then served at parishes in Wisconsin and Missouri before returning to the diocese in 2007 to serve as pastor of St. Mary's Parish in Albia IA. When he turned 75 in 2015, he was relieved of this assignment in accord with diocesan policy for priests serving beyond their 75th birthdays. He then served as administrator of the Albia parish with all the rights and duties of pastor.

In 2019, he moved to Liberty and on July 1 of that year he became the senior priest in residence at St. James.

Upon arriving here, it did not take Fr. Michael long to become an integral part of our parish life. In addition

to serving at daily and weekend Masses, he visits the homebound, hospitals, nursing and assisted living residences, giving comfort where needed and always the Eucharist. He volunteers at One City Café, a soup kitchen in Kansas City's inner city.



In addition, immediately upon his arrival here he became active in the local St. James Council and assumed the duties as the St. James Council Knights Chaplain supporting 3rd degree and 4th degree requirements and meetings. Over the past year, thanks to Father Michael's participation in each of the St. James Council's eight live degree ceremonies, the local Council has added 76 new mem-

bers and received the 5 Star Council Award and the State of Missouri Knights Membership Award.

Once, when asked about his ministry, Fr. Michael said "I would say that I love my priesthood and parochial ministry. The best part of my priesthood has been interacting with the people of the five parishes that I have served, celebrating the sacraments, and working with their various ministries."

At a meeting of the St. James Knights of Columbus, Council 6780, last weekend, it was announced that Fr. Michael has been selected to receive the State Blessed Michael McGivney Award given to a council chaplain who supports the Knights in many ways and whose dedication and service goes beyond expectations. Fr. Michael will receive the award at a Knights state meeting in Jefferson City on July 8.

#### **Why We Celebrate Pentecost**

Pentecost, one of the most important feast days of the year, concludes the Easter season and celebrates the beginning of the church.



Pentecost celebrates the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room.

The Holy Spirit gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission - to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations

Right after Pentecost Peter, inspired by the Holy Spirit, preached his first homily to Jews and other non-believers, in which he opened the scriptures of the Old Testament, showing how the prophet Joel prophesied events and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

For this reason, Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church - Peter, the first Pope, preaches for the first time and converts thousands of new believers. The apostles and believers, for the first time, were united by a common language, and a common zeal and purpose to go and preach the Gospel.

In 2018, Pope Francis decreed that the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church be inserted into the Roman Calendar on the Monday after Pentecost (also known as Whit Monday) and to be celebrated every year.

In Roman Catholic Mariology, Mother of the Church (in Latin Mater Ecclesiae) is a title, officially given to Mary during the Second Vatican Council by Pope Paul VI. The title was first used in the 4th century by Saint Ambrose of Milan.

The title "Mother of the Church" was used by Pope Benedict XIV in 1748 and by Pope Leo XIII in 1885. The title was also used by Pope John Paul II and is also found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Pope John Paul II stated that overall the title indicates the Blessed Virgin Mary's maternity of Christ's faithful, as deriving from her maternity of Christ in that "Mary is present in the Church as the Mother of Christ, and at the same time as that Mother whom Christ, in the mystery of the Redemption, gave to humanity in the person of the Apostle John. Thus, in her new motherhood in the Spirit, Mary embraces each and every one in the Church, and embraces each and every one through the Church."

Mary accomplishes her role as Mother by being first of all a true disciple of her Son. She who was flawlessly faithful, joining Jesus all the way to the tomb, is the perfect model for all who are called to follow him along the way of the Cross and to remain at the foot of the Cross.

As members of the Church, we learn from Mary how to live in obedience to the will of God. She forms her children in her way of docility to the Holy Spirit and her attentiveness to the needs of others. Mary helps us live in fidelity to the commandment of love, with willingness to carry in our own bodies the death of Christ, so that the life of Christ may also be made manifest in us




