

From the Pastor's Pen

Recently a data-gathering company, Center for Applied Research (CARA) reported results of a survey showing that 73% of young adults (aged 18 to 35) "somewhat" or "strongly" agreed that they could be a good Catholic without going to Mass every Sunday. 39% agreed "somewhat" or "strongly" that they could never imagine themselves leaving the Catholic Church. I think that nearly all Catholic Church leaders, at least in our country, are alarmed about young Catholics falling away from their Catholic faith or at least not practicing their faith by regular attendance at Mass. It is our belief that the Eucharist is at the heart of our faith practice.

The May issue of American magazine published an article by Sherry Antonetti titled "Why I Take My Teens to Mass." She begins by saying, "I am an older mother with several children who struggle with the faith I hoped they would embrace on their own. Yet, one has hair over his eyes and ripped jeans and sits the whole time while another is wearing shorts and a hoodie. One took out her phone, but I made her put it back." She would love for them to be fully present, but rejoices that they come. She hopes that over time, by attending Mass, they will find something that speaks to them. "I just want them to know that God is a God who loves them and that God hears their hearts' cries. I want them to know they belong. Perhaps one day the deepening of their faith will come."

She then makes a statement that resonates with me. "If perfect faith were the admission price for Mass, none of us could enter." We are all grasping for a deeper faith. So, as Sherry says, "when you see a parent with older kids at Mass and something about how these teens are sitting or how they are dressed starts to draw your scorn, maybe instead of judging them, say a prayer to St. Monica for that family."

Yes, dear parents of teens, remember the world your children live in, all the stuff they encounter, all the social pressure they feel, the lifestyle of their friends. Be understanding like Sherry. Take your teens to Mass no matter what their attitudes or behavior. Miracles happen!



Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Grappling with the concept of the Holy Trinity, three in one, can be unsatisfying.

Celebrating this idea, preaching and embracing this concept often leaves us puzzled and confused and definitely not excited or enthusiastic about proclaiming the trinity as a wonder-filled mystery at the center of our faith.

Two weeks ago on the Feast of the Ascension we read the final words in Matthew's gospel: "Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations; baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. . ." (MT 28:19-20). The closing words of today's second letter to the Corinthians reads: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship [communion] of the Holy Spirit be with you all" (2 Cor 13:13). This phrase is very familiar as it is proclaimed by the priest during every mass, and these scriptures clearly present three persons (which we believe as one God) with three simple words: Father, Son, and Spirit / three gifts love, grace, and fellowship. Perhaps it is simpler to think of the trinity focusing on the gifts: love, grace, and fellowship or communion which are synonymous with the Holy Trinity. God's first gift is creation, our humanity and all which exists, is a pure gift of God's unconditional love. The second gift God gave to reaffirm the first gift which concluded with the goodness of humanity proclaimed in the first chapter of Genesis. In spite of our failure to believe the goodness and love God proclaimed through creation, in spite of all human cruelty and sinfulness, God gave the second gift, the incarnation, a manifestation of God's-self in human form. Through Jesus we receive the mercy and grace of God's forgiveness. The third gift, promised by Jesus, is our communion with the Holy Spirit -God's eternal presence residing within our essence such that we are never alone or separated from God's love and grace. In John's gospel we read: "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son. . ." (John 3:16). God's love is before all else and I believe is the essence of the Holy Trinity. Father, Son, and Spirit are one in love and we are joined to the Holy Trinity through love. Made in the image and likeness of God, graced through Jesus and in communion through the Holy Sprit, we exist in love.






