

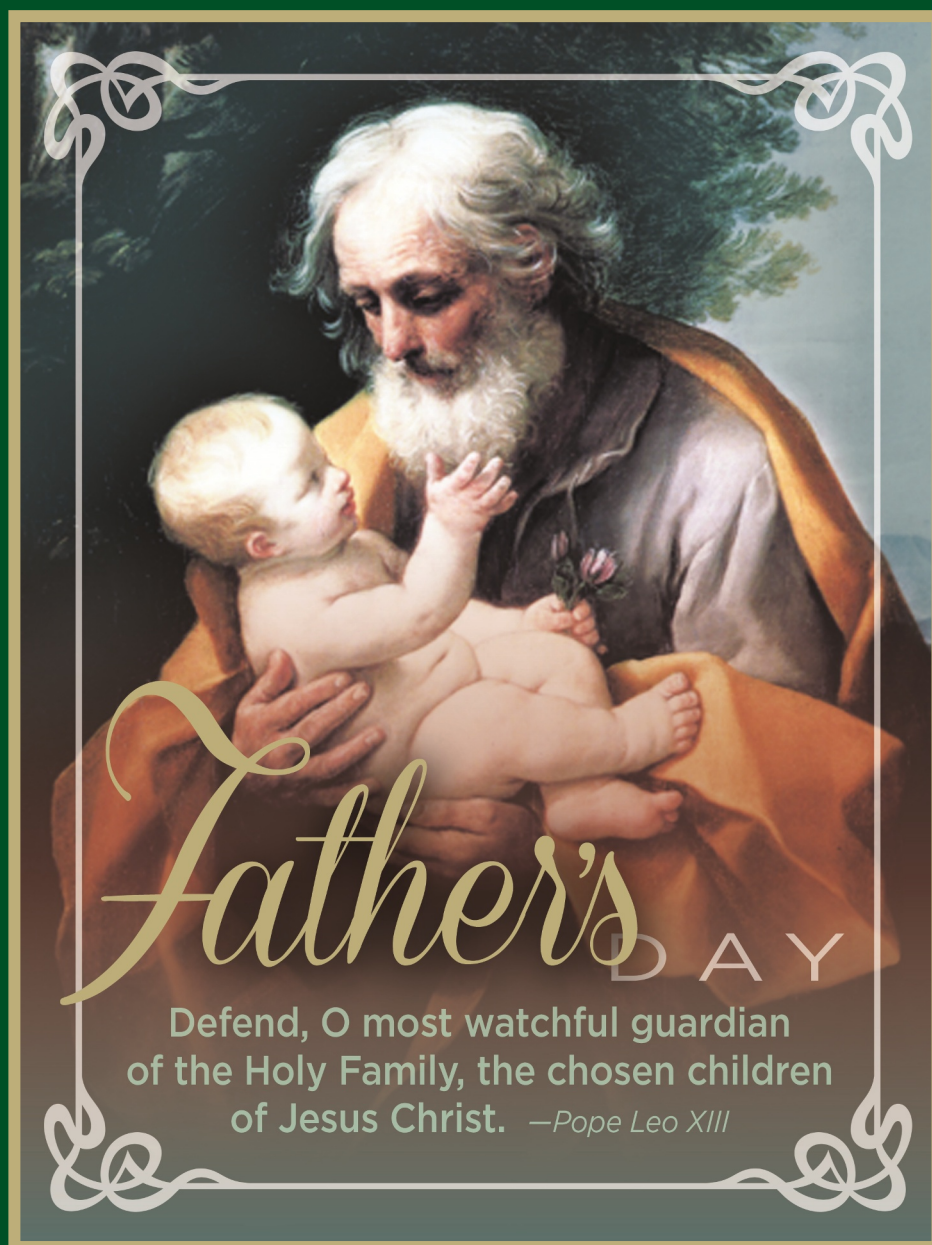

From the Pastor's Pen

Congratulations of all fathers, grandfathers, Godfathers, stepfathers as we celebrate the national holiday, "Father's Day," this weekend. Though I have probably shared with you before some thoughts about my dad, I would like to say words about him again. He was born on a farm in Nebraska, one of eight children. His dad died when he was 16. Though he only received an 8th grade education, he was a hard worker, a dedicated husband, and the father of seven children. He borrowed \$500 to start a grain elevator business. He was not given to great affection but showed his love for wife and family by dedication to hard work and strong faith. I never heard him use foul language and he never drank to excess. He was faithful in Mass attendance every weekend, and in later years attended weekday Mass. We were blessed.

Many books, articles, and reflections have been published about how important the father is in the faith formation of children. Just Google that topic and you will find lots of information. In this day and age of many divorces and broken families, a devoted husband and father is greatly admired. If you have a copy of *The Catholic Catechism*, you can find a section called "duties of parents." Parents are reminded of a promise that they make in the marriage preparation program: "We promise to raise our children in the ways of the faith". And when parents present their child for baptism, one of the questions asked of the parents is: "You have asked to have your child baptized. In doing so, you are accepting the responsibility of training your child in the practice of the faith. Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?"

In our modern American culture it is no easy task to form children in the ways of the faith. In some cases, the father simply hands this task over to his wife. Yet statistics show that if a person's own father was absent or abusive or dysfunctional, it is more likely that the child or children will struggle with a healthy relationship with God. Fathers are effective when they model healthy relationships, when the marriage is loving and respectful, when the father is a good provider, when the father lives the values of faith and desires children to share that faith.

Fathers, thank you and bless you. We honor you this day and pray for you.

GROWING  **ING**
IN FAITH

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I am sure many
people think I am
a bit odd or at
least different in
my thinking and
the way I view
things, especially
my faith. That
said, I have an
image in my mind
of Jesus as a per-

son who enjoyed simple, ordinary things, and found
great joy in celebrating life with friends, families, and
other people he encountered. I see him at the wed-
ding in Cana, eating, dancing, and celebrating the
beginnings of a new family; two people, two families
joined in marriage to become one. I also see him with
his friends Mary, Martha, and Lazarus, sharing fel-
lowship and a meal, and I see Him in a fun filled
gathering, dancing with children. Yes, I see Jesus
dancing and singing with exuberance and joy; God
dancing and singing with us.

The prophet Zephaniah declares: “The Lord, your
God, is in your midst, a mighty savior; He will rejoice
over you with gladness, and renew you in his love,
He will sing (dance - *New Jerusalem translation*) joy-
fully because of you, as one sings at festivals” (NAB
chapter 3, verse 17-18). Both my mental images of
Jesus, and this scripture passage reminded me of
the Hymn “Lord of the Dance.” This hymn is widely
sung in English-speaking congregations and assem-
blies, and was composed by English songwriter
Sydney Carter in 1963 with the melody taken from
an American Shaker song “Simple Gifts.” Carter’s
words follow the idea of the traditional English carol
“Tomorrow Shall Be My Dancing Day,” as he tells
the gospel story in the first person voice of Jesus of
Nazareth, portraying Jesus’ life and mission as a
dance. The hymn begins with the striking reference
to creation, while the refrain suggests the image of a
“Piper” whom we are free to follow. “*I danced in the
morning - When the world was begun, And I danced
in the moon - And the stars and the sun, And I came
down from heaven, And I danced on the earth, At
Bethlehem I had my birth. Refrain: Dance, then,
wherever you may be, I am the Lord of the Dance,
said he, And I’ll lead you all, wherever you may be,
And I’ll lead you all in the Dance, said he.*” For me
this hymn provides a way to expand my mental im-
ages of a joy-filled Jesus; the God-man with whom I
can laugh, sing, dance, find joy and great peace.

Check out the words of this hymn yourself, and let
your imagination soar.

In June of every year, we honor fathers. Mother's Day became an official U.S. holiday in 1914, but a holiday honoring

fathers did not become official until 1966, when President Lyndon Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day.

Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President Richard Nixon signed it into law in 1972. But this doesn't mean that the holiday was not celebrated before this time.

The idea for Father's Day is attributed to Sonora Dodd, who was raised by her father after her mother's death during childbirth. While listening to a sermon at church on Mother's Day, she thought about all her father had done for her and her siblings and decided fathers should have a day, too.

Because Dodd's father was born in June, she encouraged churches in her area, Spokane, WA, to honor fathers that month. The first Father's Day was celebrated in Spokane in 1910.

Over the years, the idea spread, and people lobbied Congress to establish the holiday. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson, who had signed the proclamation establishing Mother's Day, approved the idea, but never signed a proclamation for it. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge made it a national event to "establish more intimate relations between fathers and their children and to impress upon fathers the full measure of their obligations."

Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist Saturday June 24



John the Baptist was a contemporary of Christ who was known for evangelization and his baptizing of Jesus Christ. When Jesus came to him to be baptized, John recognized him and said, "It is I who need baptism from you."

He was born through the intercession of God to Zachariah and Elizabeth, who was otherwise too old to bear children. According to scriptures, the Angel Gabriel visited Elizabeth and Zachariah to tell them they would have a son and that they should name him John. Zachariah was skeptical and for this he was rendered mute until the time his son was born and named John, in fulfillment of God's will.

When Elizabeth was pregnant with John, she was visited by Mary, and John leapt in her womb. This revealed to Elizabeth that the child Mary carried was to be the Son of God.

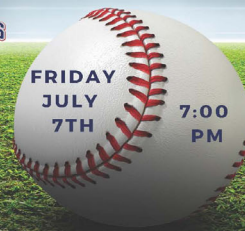

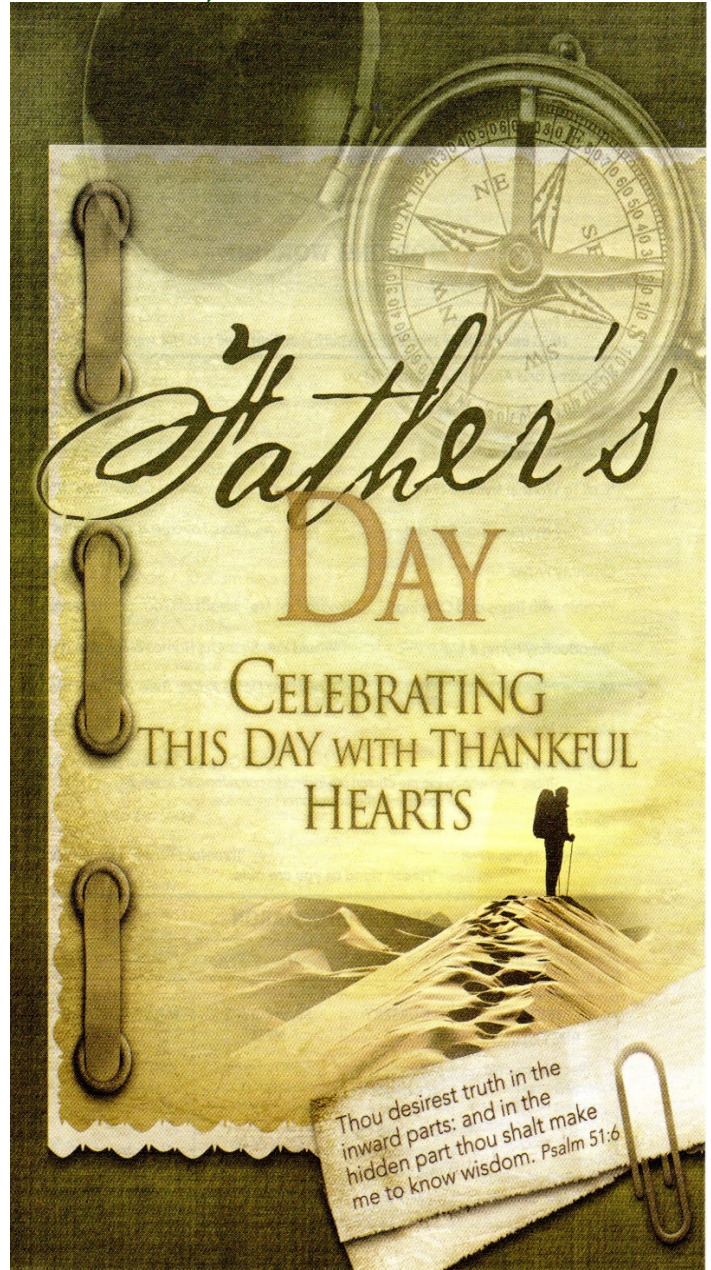

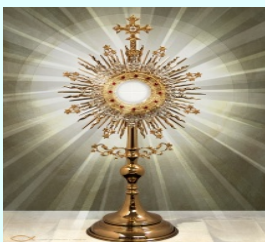
