

## From the Pastor's Pen

For many families, the celebration of Independence Day here in our country means time off from work, a vacation, visits to relatives and friends, grilling, parades, and fireworks. Sometimes people forget the primary intention of the day: to celebrate and thank God for our freedom and to remember the cost of that freedom: colonists who fought and gave their lives so that we might live in freedom. As we enjoy this day, we express thanks to God for our county and the freedoms we enjoy.

First, we enjoy physical freedom. In many parts of our world, people live in countries or places where freedom is denied. Even though the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights makes this statement: "Whereas member states have pledged themselves to achieve, in co-operation with the United Nation, the promotion of universal respect for and observance of human rights and fundamental freedom," still basic human rights are non-existent. Our country maintains this ideal and for this we are most grateful.

Second, in our country we live by the ideal of emotional freedom. Mental illness is an affliction which hurts in many ways: depression and anxiety; inability to cope; anger and violence, inappropriate relationships. Those who experience mental illness have the right to get help. Especially for those with moral and religious values, initiatives of support are a key to helping our brothers and sisters with such an affliction.

Third, we have the right to spiritual freedom. We are blessed to live in a country where religious freedom is honored and practiced. All faiths are recognized and safeguarded. As disciples of Jesus, we love and value our faith. Of course our faith places restrictions on our behavior. We are not free to do whatever we desire. We live by a higher law, the great law of love. We accept and embrace that command and ask the Lord to help us to live in the spirit of that great law: love of God and love of neighbor.

So we celebrate this 4th of July holiday aware of the gift of freedom but also knowing the challenges and dangers freedom can bring. My God bless your celebration..

#### Someone is Watching and Wondering



As we prepare to celebrate the birth of our nation this week, I have been reflecting on the words of our *Pledge of Allegiance*, "liberty and justice for all." What came to mind was a recent "Francis" cartoon

by Pat Marrin, featured in *The National Catholic Reporter*, June 13, 2023. In this strip, Br. Leo and Gabby are discussing the agenda of Pope Francis (ending the war in Ukraine, turning around climate change, making the Church more open, merciful and fair, and the world more just) given their concerns related to the limitations of his health. Br. Leo's response to Gabby is that the Pope's plan is simple: "It's up to us. . .with the help of the [Holy] Spirit." I think the same can be said about the problems we face as a nation: division, violence, poverty, immigration, "liberty and justice for all."

Granted there are problems in our church, our nation, and the world, but if each of us turns a blind eye to the part we continue to play in perpetuating these problems, where are the solutions? If we continue to point the finger of blame to others, have we failed to honestly examine our conscious or unconscious participation? If we continue to look to and often unquestioningly follow leaders, where is the responsibility? I think it is time for honest discernment of ourselves and the lives we lead.

I think I am a patriotic American and I believe in the underlying values of this country, established in the late 1700's. However, as we face new challenges our thinking, solution finding, and values must evolve to meet the needs of every human being. Jesus did not hesitate to call out evil actions, even in fellow, practicing Jews. He did not, however, refer to any individual as bad or evil by nature. Remember, he washed the feet, and shared a sacred meal with Judas Iscariot, even knowing that in a short time Judas would betray Him to the Roman authorities. Jesus simply said, "Do what you must do."

I believe Jesus is speaking those words to me and to each of us: "Do what you must do. Do what your conscious dictates, follow the inner voice which directs you for listen to my words and teachings. Know that I will be with you, even when you stumble and fail. My love is greater than your understanding, and it is without end." Yes, I think Pope Francis has a plan, lead by the Holy Spirit, to trust in the goodness of humanity. We, children of God are all called to do His work, strive to heal His creation, and to love as He loves. Have a Happy, safe July 4th,

July - The Month Of The Most Precious Blood Of Our Lord



#### St. Thomas, Apostle, Feast Day - July 3



St. Thomas is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of his Master. Thomas' unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday earned him the title of "doubting Thomas.

He was a dedicated but impetuous follower of Christ. At the Last Supper, when Christ told His disciples that He was going to prepare a place for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.



This week, we celebrate Independence Day, a day which affords us a great opportunity to consider the freedom we enjoy today - and so often take for granted.

One of the most precious freedoms we enjoy as Americans is the Freedom of religion. Some might scoff at the notion we are at risk of losing this freedom, but let's pay attention to what is going on. No longer do we talk, in the public arena, of "Freedom of Religion". A certain faction of public servants never use the phrase, "Freedom of Religion" by which we mean the freedom to worship and practice our religion according to our belief - a right guaranteed in our Constitution. Rather. they speak of "Freedom of Worship" by which they mean: "Keep your religion to yourself. Religion is a private affair. What you do behind the walls of your church is your business, but there is no place for you in the public square where religion is barred."

Listen carefully and you will hear this subtle change everywhere today. Unfortunately, that is not the only evidence. In the past decade, we have seen yet another assault on religious liberty. The examples are too numerous to detail here, but here are but a few:

The activity of military chaplains is challenged.

The Catholic Church and charitable adoption agencies incur legal challenges for being loyal to the tenets of their faith. Catholic hospitals that provide health care to many of the poorest areas of the country are being sued for not performing abortions.

Francis Cardinal George, the late Cardinal Archbishop of Chicago, saw this developing years ago. In a speech he made in Rome, he warned, "In this culture, the Gospel's call to receive freedom as a gift from God and to live its demands faithfully is regarded as oppressive, and the Church, which voices those demands publicly, is seen as an enemy of personal freedom.

But Independence Day is not a day to worry and be filled with anxiety. It is a day to celebrate a country in which we are so privileged to live and the freedom we know so well. It is also a time to renew our "eternal vigilance" to preserve our right to religious freedom.
