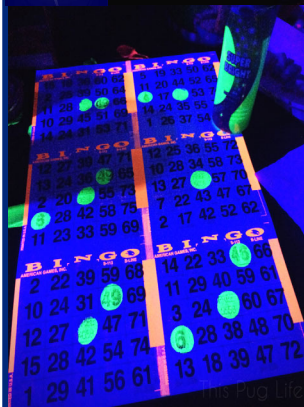

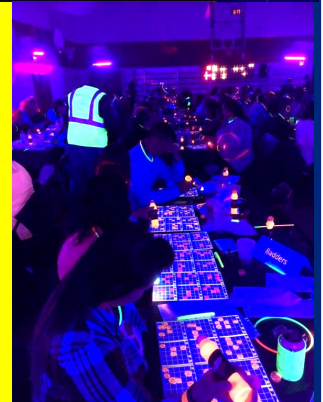

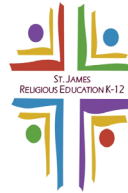

## Someone is Watching and Wondering



I believe the most difficult stage of the adult initiation process is developing an understanding of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The most commonly asked question: "Why do I need to confess to a priest? Isn't praying

to God for forgiveness enough?" My usual response is yes and no. Of course God answers our prayers, and when we sincerely confess our sins, asking for forgiveness, God does not withhold grace. That being said, however, the sacrament is so much more and certainly brings the communal aspect of our sinfulness into focus. Sins are not committed in a vacuum, rather sinfulness always effects more than a single person, yet repentance is directed inward, i.e. I recognize my freedom to choose how I act or react in any given situation. I can take offense and fight back with angry words or actions, or I can turn the other cheek and move on trying to be the best person God created me to be; I can repent and also offer forgiveness.

If you know me well, you have probably heard me say that in my opinion one of the worst lines in a movie is: "Love means you never have to say you're sorry." Love for me is quite the opposite. I must recognize how my choices have hurt another person and because I profess to love Christ Jesus, I must tell the other person I am sorry. An apology, however, may be just a habit, something said to move on without also truly accepting responsibility. True repentance is not about fixing the past, which in reality is impossible, it is looking towards a new way of being in the present and moving forward into the future. Mending a relationship, changing a behavior, truly repenting of my sins requires a willingness to become a different person, one renewed by grace and following the example of Jesus.

Desmond Tutu is quoted as saying: "Forgiveness and reconciliation are not just ethereal, spiritual, other-worldly activities. They have to do with the real world. They are realpolitik, because in a very real sense, without forgiveness, there is no future." My future and yours depends on discerning the underlying cause(s) of our sinfulness, accepting responsibility, seeking forgiveness, and a willingness to change. I do not believe there is true reconciliation without repentance that involves an inner change. I find great difficulty in withholding my innermost thoughts and feelings from a priest when I make my confession. I feel a sense of relief in my honesty, as well as in his push to help me find a different way of living. There is no magic for me in this sacrament, yet I feel renewed and ready to move forward; to change and move closer to Christ. The sacrament of reconciliation is a necessary step to wholeness.

## July - The Month Of The Most Precious Blood Of Our Lord



One particular devotion in the Catholic Church connected to the Passion of Jesus Christ is the honoring of his Precious Blood.

It is a recognition of Jesus' sacrifice and how he spilled his blood for the salvation of humanity. Furthermore, this blood is made present through the gift of the Eucharist and is something we can consume at Mass, along with the body of Christ, under the appearance of bread and wine.

Over time the Church developed various feasts of the Precious Blood, but it wasn't until the 19th century when a universal feast was established.

During the First Italian War for Independence in 1849, Pope Pius IX went into exile to Gaeta. He went there with Don Giovanni Merlini, third superior general of the Fathers of the Most Precious Blood.

While the war was still raging, Merlini suggested to Pope Pius IX that he create a universal feast to the Precious Blood to beg God's heavenly aid to end the war and bring peace to Rome. Pius IX subsequently made a statement on June 30, 1849 that he intended to create a feast in honor of the Precious Blood. The war soon ended and he returned to Rome shortly thereafter.

*When the pope was in exile, he turned to the Blood of Christ for strength.*

On August 10 he made it official and proclaimed that the 1st Sunday in July will be dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. Later, Pope Pius X assigned July 1 as the fixed date of this celebration. After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (as well as most other months of the year).

For these reasons the entire month of July is traditionally dedicated to the Precious Blood, and Catholics are encouraged to meditate on the profound sacrifice of Jesus and the pouring out of his blood for humanity.

## St. Bonaventure Feast Day - July 15



Born Giovanni di Fidanza in Tuscany in 1221, he received the name Bonaventure as the result of an exclamation of St. Francis of Assisi, when, in response to the pleading of the child's mother, the saint prayed for John's recovery from a dangerous illness, and, foreseeing the future greatness of the little John, cried out "O Buona ventura"- O good fortune!

At the age of twenty-two he entered the Franciscan Order. He steered the Franciscans on a moderate and intellectual course that made them the most prominent order in the Catholic Church until the coming of the Jesuits. His theology was marked by an attempt completely to integrate faith and reason. He thought of Christ as the "one true master" who offers humans knowledge that begins in faith, is developed through rational understanding, and is perfected by mystical union with God.

He was canonized in 1484 by Pope Sixtus IV, and ranked along with Thomas Aquinas as the greatest of the Doctors of the Church. He is regarded as one of the greatest philosophers of the Middle Ages.

## St. Benedict Feast Day - July 11



On July 11, we celebrate the feast of Saint Benedict of Nursia, the sixth-century abbot who gave Christian monasticism its lasting foundation in Western Europe.

He was born in Italy during the year 486. As a young man he spent three years in solitude, facing and overcoming severe temptations through prayer and asceticism. Only after doing so, did he have the confidence to emerge as an organizer of monastic communities. His first monasteries were established in the Anio valley outside Subiaco, Italy.

St. Benedict was also the patron saint of Pope Benedict XVI's pontificate. In a 2005 general audience, the Pope said St. Benedict was a "powerful reminder of the indispensable Christian roots" of Europe. He cited the monk's instruction to "prefer nothing to the love of Christ," and asked his intercession "to help us keep Christ firmly at the heart of our lives."

## Saint Kateri Tekakwitha Feast Day - July 14



Saint Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be declared a Saint. She was informally known as Lily of the Mohawks. Born near Auriesville, NY, she suffered from smallpox as a young child, which scarred her face and greatly weakened her eyes. She converted to Roman Catholicism at age nineteen and was renamed Kateri. She settled for the remaining years of her life at the Jesuit mission village of Kahnawake, south of Montreal in New France, now Canada.

Tekakwitha took a devout vow of perpetual virginity. She was baptized in honor of Saint Catherine of Siena. Upon her death at the age of 24, minutes after her death, witnesses say her scars vanished and she appeared radiant and beautiful.

Known for her virtue of chastity and mortification of the flesh, as well as being shunned by her tribe for her religious conversion to Catholicism, she is the fourth Native American to be venerated in the Roman Catholic Church.

She was beatified in 1980 under the pontificate of Pope John Paul II and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October, 21 October 2012. Various miracles and supernatural events are attributed to her.
