

## From the Pastor's Pen

Let's not forget one of the most important events happening in the life of our Catholic Church: the call of Pope Francis for a "Synod on Synodality" and all the preparation leading up to the celebration. The process has been very impressive. A "synod" is a gathering, a walking together, to reflect on and discuss issues in the life of the Church. Synods have been happening throughout the life of our Church, but this one is different. The conversation is about what it means to be a synodal Church.

Conversations began at the grassroots level in 2021. All Church members were invited to participate. Listening sessions were held in all the dioceses across the world. The key element was respectful listening. Participants were asked to share their ideas, feelings, concerns about Church life: joys and sorrows, expectations, disappointments, questions. Summaries of these sessions were gathered from all over each country. Each country then submitted summaries to a continental committee. A synthesis of these continental reports were then sent to the Holy See. This October 370 delegates from the continents will gather in Rome to draw up a statement that will reflect the key points of all the reports.

As you might imagine, this is an immense task. What matters most is not necessarily the words of the final statement. Rather what is important is the process: what it means to be Church. As Church we honor the thoughts and opinions of all people. We listen to each other with reverence and respect. The Church is all of us, caring for one another. Yes, of course, we need the magisterium, the official teachers of the Church. We need the authority of the Holy Father and the Bishops. But still we need each other. We need to listen with respect. We need to recognize that the gift of the Holy Spirit is given to each person. We need to put into practice the spirit of the Beatitudes.

I hope that each day you include in your prayers the work of the Synod and practice in your own lives the spirit of synodality.

My prayers are with you.





## Someone is Watching and Wondering



Never forget yesterday  
but always live for today,  
because you never know  
what tomorrow can bring  
or what it can take away.

There are two non-English phrases which have come to mean a great deal in my life: *Carpe diem* (seize the day) and *todos los días* (every day). Taken together they signify that every day should be fully lived; every day is a gift; every day is a gift of grace from God. Too often, however, I find myself worrying about tomorrow: will I be able to pay all the bills; will something unexpected happen; will I fall, break a bone or become incapacitated; will my loved ones be okay? Conversely, there are many days I live in the past with all the "What ifs". What if I hadn't made that choice? What if I left earlier or later? What if I had made that call? What if I had spoken out, instead of hiding in fear? What if I had taken better care of myself, listened to my body, consulted a health professional sooner? What if I had just taken the time to be present, listen, offer encouragement, sit with another through their pain?

I once asked a wise person, Why can't I forgive myself?" His answer, I thought at the time was cruel: "Do you think you are better than God? If you believe God forgives, yet you cannot forgive yourself, you must think you are better, bigger than God." I cried bitter tears when I realized how true were his words. Even in prayer when I asked God to forgive me, I ignored the rest of the prayer, as I forgive others.

In spite of the what ifs (both past and future), I still try to live today and each day humbly accepting God's gifts, love, forgiveness, and grace. I try to follow Christ Jesus, to love and serve others, never objectifying another person, even though we may seriously disagree. I try to be whole, forgiving myself, yet living each new day rooted in the knowledge that I am not perfect, I am flawed, I still have so much to learn, and so many areas for growth in my life. Yet, I also acknowledge how I have been and continue to be blessed. I have more reasons for giving thanks than for feeling regret and sadness. I know, at this time, I have lived the greater part of my earthly life, but I also know God is still revealing beauty, truth, love, understanding, and forgiveness each day. God continues to teach me how to live in the fullness of my humanity. God tenderly cares for me, for each of us, and wants us to thrive, to grow in love and understanding.

So, these words I offer to each of you: *carpe diem — todos los días*, giving glory to God, all ways.





## ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, AUGUST 14, 2023

Chairman Kevin Casel called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The following council members were present: Fr. Mike Roach, Dan Bacon, Eddie Baker, Phil Baumert, Kevin Casel, Corrine Katzer, Yvette Lopez, Joan Peluso, Sherri Porterfield, Patrick Schaub and meeting minutes recorder, Karen Schamel.

Following the opening prayer by Sherri Porterfield, the Chairman informed the members that it is his desire to try and keep each meeting at approximately 60 minutes in length. The meeting will follow the approved agenda and be in the format used in previous years.

**GUEST REPORT:** The Council welcomed the new Director of Religious Education, Stephanie Ladenthin who addressed the members about RE plans for this coming year. She informed the group that Amanda Lewey will once again head up the Confirmation program and Theresa Brier will lead the High School program. Stephanie will oversee the K-8 program.

Classes will be held only on Sundays. RE classes cannot currently be scheduled on Wednesday evenings because the school is not available for use.

She revealed that 31 parishioners attended the Evening of RE Volunteers. There is a need for additional volunteers, particularly for the middle school program. Stephanie would ultimately like to bring education/faith formation opportunities to parents as well and that she sees religious education as a "birth to death" lifetime journey. Stephanie and her staff are looking at ways to get parents and the parish involved and will have a variety of activities including Trunk or Treat, possible Soup Suppers, a Fat Tuesday high school fundraiser for Steubenville and a May Crowning of the Blessed Mother at the 5 p.m. Mass on the first Saturday of May. Fr. Mike let the Council know that Stephanie is on the right track in creating community and organizing activities that have not been activated in years.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Dan Bacon explained to new council members the goal of having a new ministry to pro-

vide additional safety for the congregation during Mass. A member of the parish with medical training will be "on call" in case of any medical situations. In the event of an emergency affecting the entire congregation, one person with knowledge of emergency procedures will be appointed at each Mass as the Point of Contact. Currently, there are 7 parishioners who have agreed to serve in this position. Dan asked the Council to talk with additional parishioners who would be good to serve in this position. He would like to have a total of 10 people before holding a training session.

Betsy Lewey, who was unable to attend the meeting, sent Kevin Casel an email saying that the Emergency Assist Ministry is up and running this month. These parishioners will assist with any first aid needs. The goal to have 2 to 3 parishioners with medical knowledge to be available at every Mass.

**NEW BUSINESS:** All members agreed that the Council retreat held on Sat. August 5<sup>th</sup> was excellent. Kevin Casel passed out a handout of the 11 points of Action/Strategies that the Council brainstormed at the retreat to help the members create the '23-'24 Council Vision. After much discussion of a variety of ideas from members, it was agreed that the Council's starting point must be to create a survey to understand the needs and concerns of the congregation. Kevin asked members to bring 3 questions for the survey to the September meeting and we will begin the process of developing this survey.

**CLOSING:** Fr. Mike informed the members that he was pleased with the discussion and that the group was moving in the right direction. He then closed the meeting with a prayer and the members prayed "The Lord's Prayer" together.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20pm. Next meeting is scheduled for Mon. Sept. 11th at 7:00pm.


