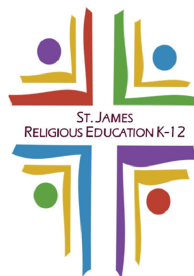
Mission Statement

From the Pastor's Pen

On July 21, Universal Studio in Hollywood released a movie called "Oppenheimer." It is a story of J. Robert Oppenheimer, often called "the father of the atomic bomb." A brilliant scientist, he was recruited to work on "The Manhattan Project," a super-sensitive study which took place in New Mexico. The movie shows the ups and downs of his personal life, as well as the events which led to the testing of the bomb in the desert. The power of the weapon was unbelievable and frightening. As World War Two was continuing unabated, costing many lives, a decision had to be made about the use of the bomb in Japan. We all know the results. The cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki were largely obliterated, with a casualty toll estimated between 129,000 and 226,000. Not only were victims incinerated, but those who somehow survived were left with lasting scars and pains. Japan soon surrendered, but as the months went by, the debates continued about the use of nuclear weapons. Oppenheimer himself, seeing the destructive power of the bombs and realizing that the development of the H-bomb could obliterate the earth, called for a moratorium and serious discussions about banning the future use of such weapons.

I hope the movie was more than entertainment. I hope that it reminds us that nuclear weaponry still exists in our world today with the capacity to end the world as we know it. Since it has been 78 years since Hiroshima and Nagasaki, perhaps many people have forgotten about the danger that continues. Recently Archbishop John Wester of Santa Fe wrote a pastoral letter, calling the people of the Archdiocese and all people of good will everywhere to remember the threats. His pastoral letter, "Living in the Light of Christ's Peace; a Conversation Toward Nuclear Disarmament" is a timely and vital reminder of this danger to the world family. He writes: "If we care about humanity, if we care about our planet, if we care about the God of peace, we must start a public conversation on these urgent questions and find a new path toward nuclear disarmament." I hope that his wise words are widely heard and heeded.

As a parish family, let us join in these efforts always to promote peace and justice.

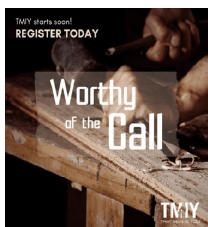

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Jesusfamilytree

We usually do not hear the scripture readings for Saturday proclaimed at Mass, but the first reading from Saturday, August 26, 2023 (Ru 2:1-3, 8-11; 4:13-17) caught my attention and got me to thinking about my ancestors. You can read these words yourself, but in summary they tell of Ruth (a Moabite), the daughter-in-law of Naomi (a Hebrew) who were both widows.

While trying to provide for herself and Naomi, Ruth meets Boaz (also a Hebrew). Boaz eventually takes Ruth as his wife, who gives birth to Obed, the father of Jesse, the father of David; you know the rest of the story, as Jesus is from the line of David. I found this poster from *LegacyBibleGame.com* on the internet, and to say the least, Jesus' family tree is complicated, and is filled with ancestors with interesting life stories. It seems significant that David's great-grandmother was a foreigner among the Israelites who left her own country to provide for her mother-in-law. A widow herself, Ruth remained faithful and strong. Who are the "Moabites" today?

As I mentioned, reading Ruth's story once again, I was reminded of my family tree, and the interesting ancestors whose stories I know. There is a strong German heritage on my father's side. Both his maternal and paternal grandparents were immigrants to this country, fleeing from oppressive conditions in Germany. My grandfather Mentch entered the U.S. navy as a teenager, serving for more than 44 years. My grandmother Mentch lost two children; only my father survived. On my mother's side, her maternal ancestors came from Switzerland, fleeing from religious persecution. They were Brethren and farmers. They originally settled in Virginia, migrated to Kansas when my grandmother was a child, lived in a sod house, and during the Oklahoma land rush secured a homestead, which they farmed for many years. My maternal grandfather was raised on the King Ranch in Texas, survived childhood polio, and worked for the J.C. Nichols company in Oklahoma City. Needless to say, I inherited from both of my parents a strong personality, determined work ethic, and love of God, country, and family. Now I realize that I am part of an even greater family, very diverse in culture, beliefs, faith, and way of life. Reading scripture and looking at Jesus' ancestry, I realize that I have an interesting and amazing spiritual family. As one of God's children, part of God's creation, I am joined to Jesus, his ancestors, and all of humanity. We in turn are joined together, not just through our common humanity but through our common home. Please join me in mutual love and understanding, as part of His family.

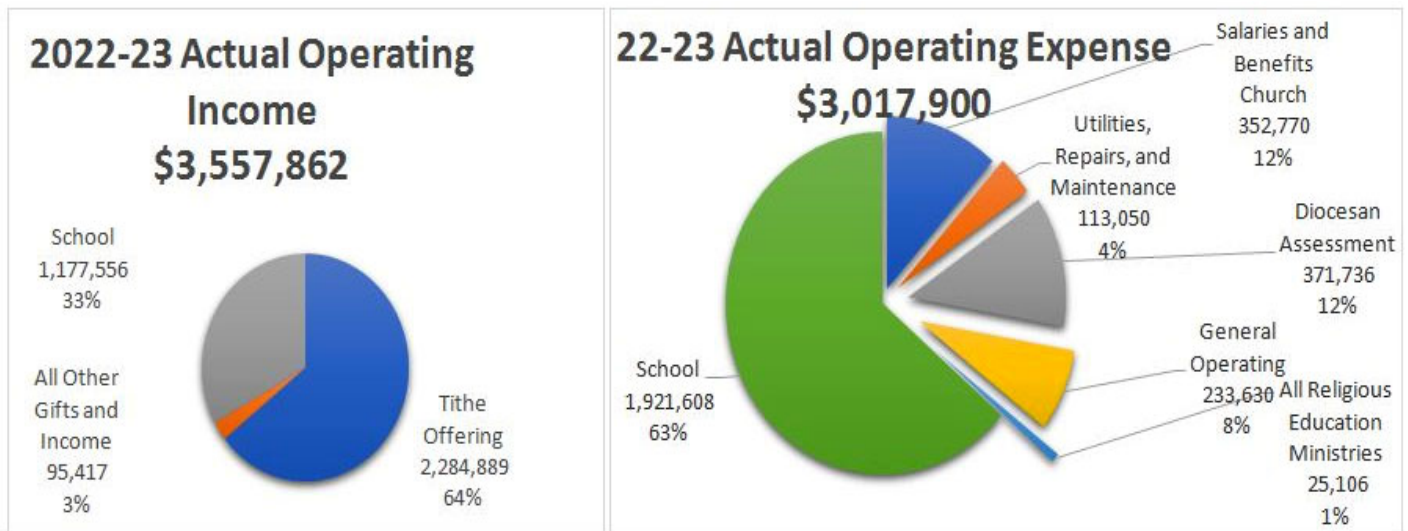

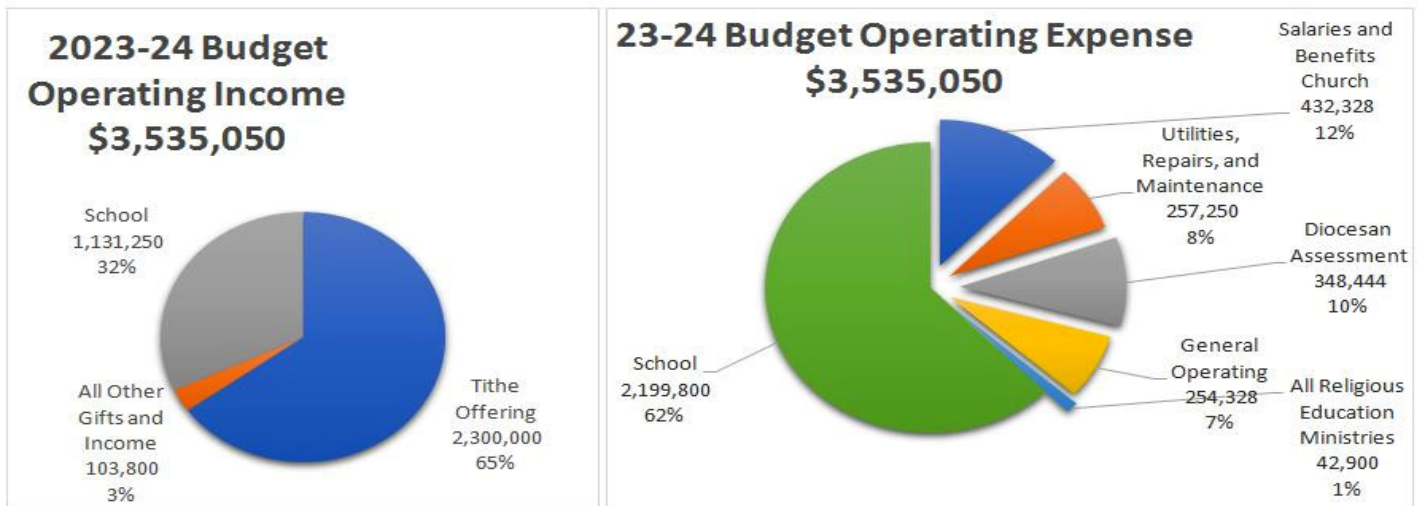
Operating Income and Expense
