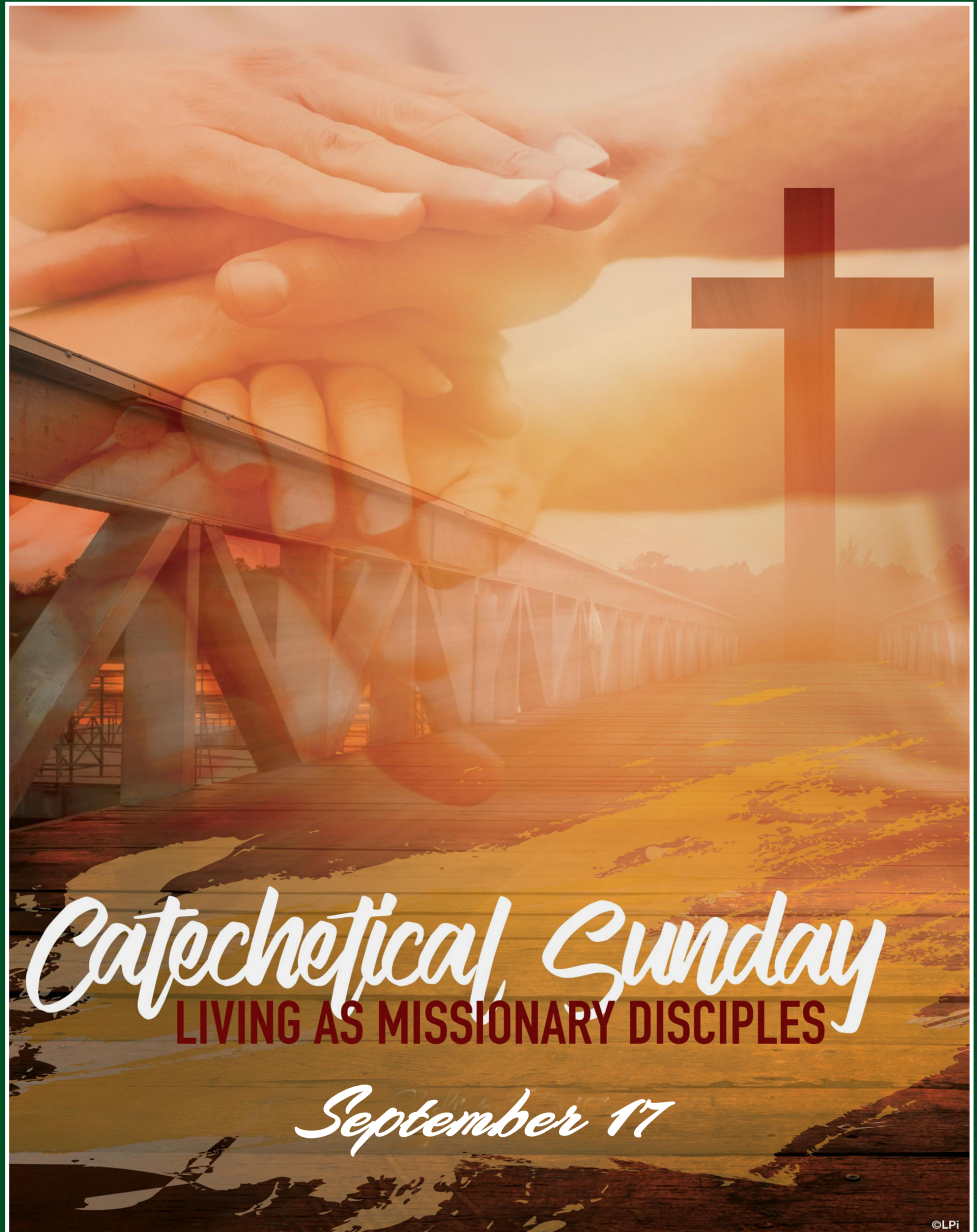

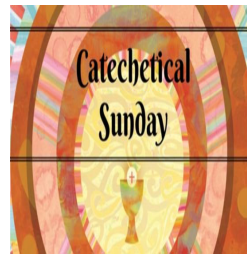

Someone is Watching and Wondering



In the 2015 encyclical of Pope Francis, entitled “*Laudato Si*” subtitled “On Care of Our Common Home” he opens with a quote from St. Francis of Assisi’s “Canticle of the Creatures”: “Laudato Si’, mi’ Signore” (Praise be to you, my Lord”). In this encyclical Pope Francis reflects on the relationship between humans

and creation. Addressing pressing environmental problems Pope Francis stated that they have “ethical and spiritual roots” for which we must seek lasting solutions. Pope Francis rejected our “throwaway culture” and called for an “integral ecology” which recognizes how “everything is connected.” He called for Christians to seek “ecological conversion,” wherein our encounter and relationship with Jesus is evident in our relationship with our common home. This includes both the environment and all people, “especially the poor and vulnerable.”

September 1, 2023 - World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation - marked the beginning of the annual ecumenical observance of the Season of Creation (Sept. 1st - Oct. 4th). Pope Francis’ words best describe this observance as “a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and all creation through celebration, conversion, and commitment.” I believe that living part of my vocation as one who cares for God’s creation, is a virtue, rather than an option or secondary aspect of being a Catholic Christian. Although I cannot solve all the environmental problems single handedly, there is much that I can do. For instance, I can substantially lower my carbon footprint by driving less, (making one trip that encompasses multiple errands and tasks), monitoring and reducing utility usage, planting native trees, flowers, and shrubs that require less water, collecting rainwater for potted plantings, recycling, utilizing composting centers, using leg/pedal-power vs gasoline power when ever and where ever possible, and helping with educational programs that serve to inform others as to how they also can care for creation. It is difficult for people to care about our natural world, who have no experience of nature or do not feel connected to the environment.

God provides such a fantastic, beautiful world for all humanity to enjoy, but each of us is responsible to protect and preserve it. We are all guests, we do not own the earth and our duration of occupancy is finite. Nature has amazing rejuvenating properties, however, humankind must do all we can to help her processes. We must be the best stewards possible during our finite visit here.

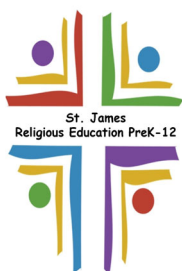

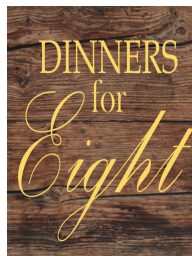

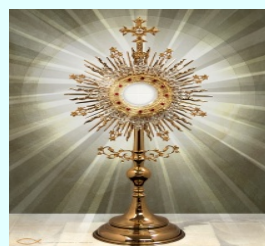
Getting acquainted - Kick-off dinner

Grades PreK- 5

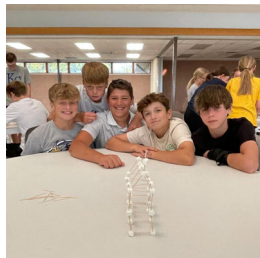

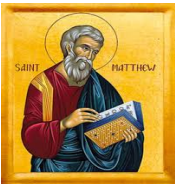

St. Matthew the Apostle Feast Day September 21



According to the Gospel, Matthew was working at a collection booth in Capernaum when Christ came to him and asked, "Follow me." With this simple call, Matthew became a disciple of Christ.

Many years following the death of Christ, around 41 and 50 AD, Matthew wrote his gospel account. Nothing is recorded of Matthew's passing. We do not know how he died, if his death was natural or if he was martyred.

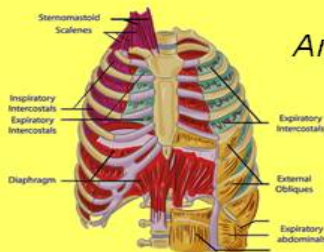
