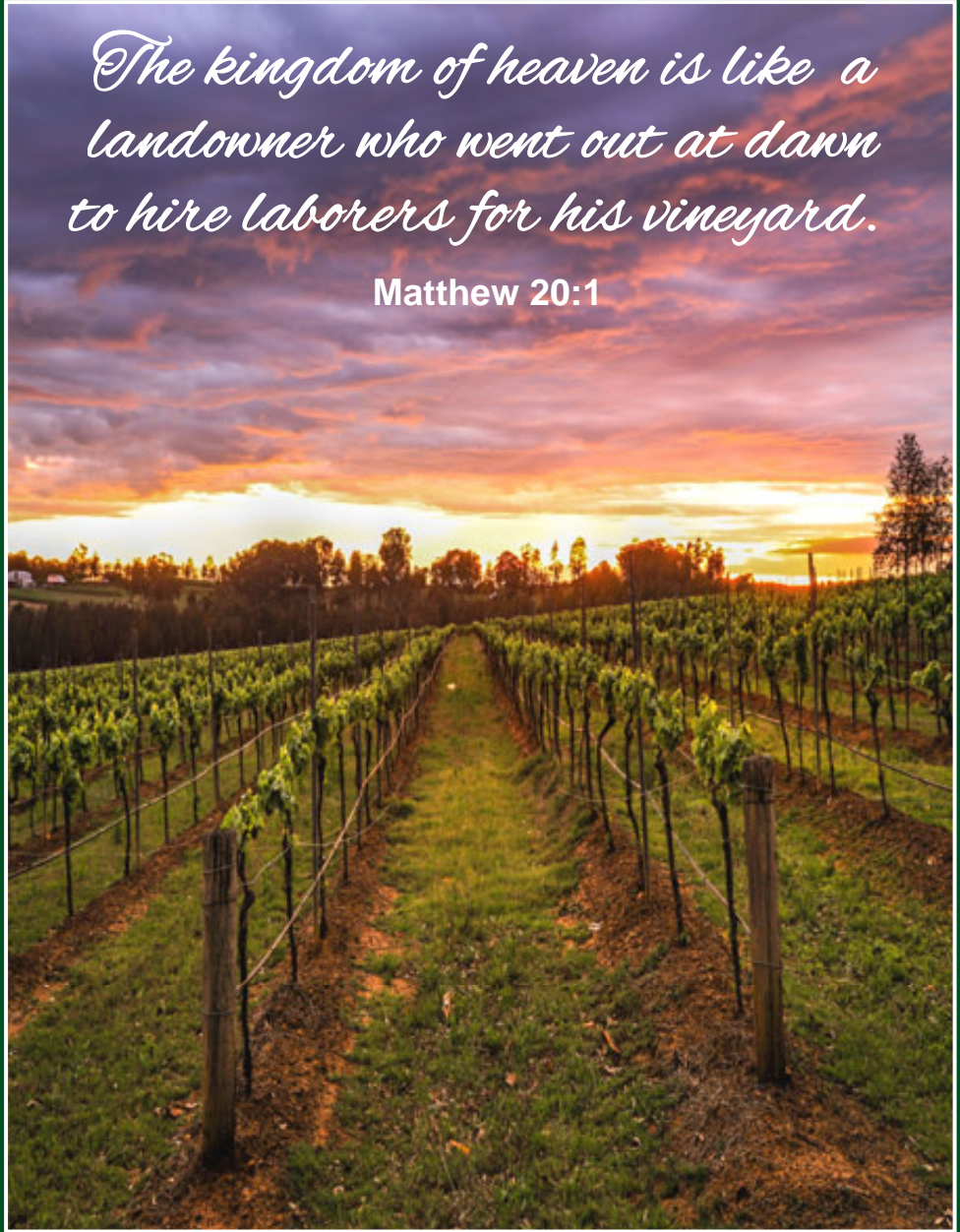

St. Lorenzo Ruiz was martyred for refusing to renounce his Catholic faith. He is the patron saint of Filipino overseas workers and migrants.

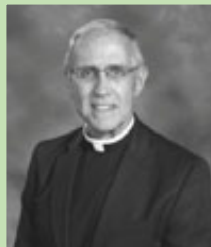

From the Pastor's Pen

This Sunday we celebrate the "World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees." Life is like a journey. Our faith history includes the story of the Israelites and their exodus, seeking the promised land. Yes, the fullness of the Kingdom of God is our destination, but that doesn't mean that we don't need an earthly home and homeland. All of God's People need safe and secure shelter. Our native American brothers and sisters were often on the move, so they had temporary shelters, tepees. Early American settlers at first build crude cabins. In more recent times many people here in the States have very fine homes.

And yet, some folks here in our country and many in our world family are homeless or live in very crude shelters. We are very much aware of situations in which people are desperate to find a home and a homeland of their own. In the midst of their poverty, they become victims of human trafficking, of abuse, or at least rejection. It is very challenging to hope for a heavenly home under such dire circumstances no matter how great the faith may be. Many in our world family feel the hurt of exclusion: that they are not a part of God's promise of a new heavens and a new earth.

We are all aware of the situation at the southern border here in our own county. Hundreds migrate to the border with practically nothing except hope that they might be granted entrance into our country. Some turn away from such scenes. They don't want to see the suffering, the abuse, the hopelessness. Some take the attitude: "Send them back where they came from." And yet, why did they leave? For many because of abuse from dictatorships, unemployment, poverty, no hope. Would any of us want to return to such conditions?

What is the Church asking of us? Prayer, certainly. But that's not enough. The Church asks us to foster a deep spirit of compassion, a cry for justice, a system that would better respond to the refugee situation, contributions to agencies that reach out with assistance to these refugees. Yes, our ultimate home is heaven, but we are judged worthy of that home by our spirit of compassion. We ask the Lord today to stir up within us the faith to see all refugees as our brothers and sisters.

My prayers are with you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As many of you know, the journey for catechumens and candidates preparing to receive the sacraments of initiation can be long and passes through many stages. They do not, however, journey alone. There are so many people in our parish who pray for, support and nurture them, yet the one relationship never forgotten is that of sponsor. Sponsors begin this journey far ahead of our celebration of

the Rite of Acceptance and Welcome, where the catechumens and candidates are introduced to the faithful during Mass, and make their first profession of intent to listen to, respond, and follow the word of God. You may well ask, how is this accomplished; how are these individuals “taught” to hear GOD, to PRAY, while on this faith journey?

Please, note I not implying these individuals must learn / memorize “Catholic prayers”. Rather they must first begin to open their senses, minds, and hearts, to God. To seek God in honest, open conversations (ie to pray always and all ways. Part of any good conversation, to quote a beloved priest from my past, “is to shut-up and listen.” Listen to the many ways God speaks; in a breath of fresh air, raindrops falling on my cheek, bird-song from the trees, flowers displaying their glorious blooms, children laughing and sometime crying, a stranger asking for help, an acquaintance experiencing a new loneliness, a teen seeking answers, the warmth of the sun, the changing colors or each season, searching for direction in my life. These and so many other experience is how I hear God’s voice. I also hear God through the Mass and receiving the sacraments, as well as in quiet moments when I let distractions go. Yet I ask, do I feel God’s presence **always in all ways**, or do I restrict my conversation with God to only those times I allot for “Prayer”? Sometimes I think God is sneaky, creeping into my thoughts when my defensive walls are low. Jesus taught us to stay alert and to pray with our actions, our life.

As the director of adult initiation for many years, I have encountered people around me speaking words I believe God gave them to speak. One more way I am able to refocus and hear God’s voice. My goal for leading catechumens and candidates to a new life in Christ is to journey together, experiencing their uniqueness, and encouraging them to embrace the freedom of a rich, full life of prayer. Thanks to all of you who support this ministry and a special expression of gratitude to all who volunteer as sponsors.

ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2023

Chairman Kevin Casel called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. The following council members were present: Fr. Mike Roach, Dan Bacon, Phil Baumert, Kevin Casel, Corrine Katzer, Betsy Lewey and Sherri Porterfield. The opening prayer was given by Phil Baumert.

Guest Report: Chairman Casel introduced, and the Council welcomed parishioners, Scott and Anna Alessi who explained an opportunity for a Pickleball Ministry here at St. James as a fun way to encourage our congregation to get to know one another and create community within our parish. A certified pickleball instructor, Scott, told the Council that the back parking lot behind the church would be a perfect area for this activity. Mr. and Mrs. Alessi would take care of the organization of this ministry, chalking the court(s) and providing the nets. For those who haven't played before and/or don't own equipment, they could provide paddles and balls as well. This activity would be fun for all age groups, and it was suggested that Mr. and Mrs. Alessi also talk with the middle school/high school RE sponsors about this possibly becoming a special activity for the youth of the parish as well. Mrs. Alessi said they would like to get this started soon, possibly on a Wednesday evening. There would be no cost to participate and those interested would use a QR code to sign up so that there will be enough equipment for participants. Information will be placed in the bulletin within the next few weeks with the Council helping as needed.

Old Business:

Point of Contact Ministry: Dan Bacon reported that we are in need of 3 additional people for this ministry to begin. He asked Council members to please help him recruit these needed parishioners. Hopefully, once this is complete, a training session will be held.

Emergency Assist Ministry: Betsy Lewey reported that has people but would like more to participate. She is planning to ask those people who are part of this ministry to speak at one of the weekend Masses. This will be followed by interested indi-

viduals signing up after the Mass. She also reported that there has been a problem with miscommunication in the awareness of this ministry and the ushers. Betsy will place info in the bulletin and ask that an email be sent once again to all ushers.

New Business: The remainder of the meeting was dedicated to developing key concepts to be included in the survey for the congregation. It was suggested that we use the St. James Mission Statement as a guide in developing these concepts. The Council members agreed that the survey should be kept as simple and short as possible. After some discussion, agreement was reached that 4 main concepts were needed. The Council will develop key questions within two of the main concepts during the October meeting and will, hopefully, complete the writing of the survey with the other two concepts at the November meeting. The survey results will help the Council to develop strategies and actions to address the needs and concerns of our parish.

Closing: Fr. Mike reported that the RE program is underway and registration is very good. He praised the Director of Religious Education, Stephanie Ladenthin for her work and vision for the program. In addition, he reported that the Altar Society had much success with their recent campaign to increase membership. Fifty-nine women participated in the first meeting in September. Fr. Mike then closed the meeting with a prayer and the members prayed "The Lord's Prayer" together.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:06pm. The Council's next meeting is Monday, October 9th at 7:00pm in the AV Conference Room. If you have any ideas or concerns for the Council, please contact Fr. Mike or Chairman Kevin Casel. If you would like to attend the meeting, please contact Kevin Casel no later than Thursday, October 5th.

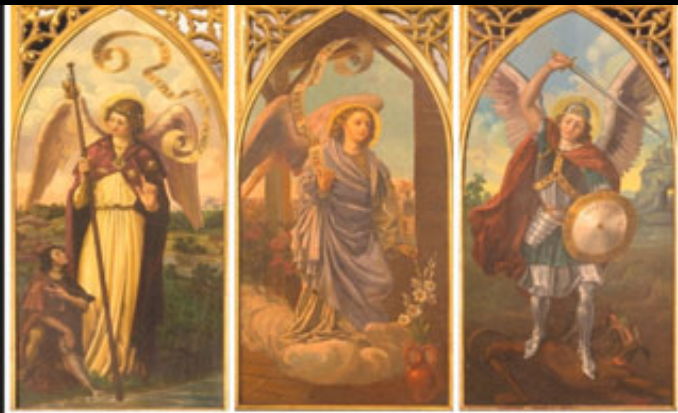

Based upon Scripture the Church determined there are Seven Archangels who played an important role in Jewish and Christian traditions. At the Council of Rome in 745, the names of the three Archangels mentioned in Scripture were officially recognized: Michael, Gabriel and Raphael.

Although names of the other four Archangels (Ariel, Raquel, Zerachiel, and Remiel) appear in Jewish and Christian sources outside of the canon, they are not recognized by name in Catholic doctrine.
