Someone is Watching and Wondering



Outside the Old City walls of Jerusalem, on the Mount of Olives is a church, "Pater Noster." I was blessed to visit this site and sit quietly in the beautiful courtyard.

The walls of the courtyard are faced with simple mosaics of words in different languages, expressing the prayer Jesus taught. This church was built on the site which is traditionally believed to be where Jesus taught the disciples to pray. Sitting in the courtyard, surrounded by his words, I was aware not only of the universality of this prayer, but also the unique way in which its words continue to speak to me, thousands of miles and years away from when and where the words were first spoken. Over the past few weeks I have refocused on this prayer and my own failures to live the words I pray. Please indulge me here. What I write are my personal, heartfelt thoughts and not in any way a suggestion for change.



Beloved Father, your name alone is truly holy, above all others, true God and creator of all that is, was, or ever will be, including me. I feel such gratitude for living in your kingdom, knowing full well that it is still a work in progress. I, perhaps like so many others, fail to understand your will. I cling to my own selfish wants and desires, including my expectations that others should understand the way I do. I wonder if I will ever be able to respond to you like Jesus and his mother: "Let your will be done unto me!" Will I ever know or feel the wonder of your kingdom here on earth, or must I, wait for heaven? I ask for your blessing, yet often feel self sufficient in providing for myself. I don't always say thank you for everything you continue to provide for me. There is, also of course, my problem of letting go, of forgiving others. I find it easy to confess my shortcomings and sinfulness to you, asking for forgiveness and the strength to change, yet I cling to guilt, finding it difficult to truly let go of my sin. In offering forgiveness to others, I tend not to forget and secretly hold on to my limited understanding that they must be punished or accept partial responsibility for my actions toward them. Finally there are those words so troubling to me: "Lead me not into temptation." I feel my faith is conflicted by my image of a loving, merciful God, but one who also leads me into places where I am most likely to fail. In my mind, these words should be: Let me seek your presence as I face my temptations and demons. As always, Father, I struggle with myself, yet in loving and trusting you, I know, in your infinite mercy you will deliver me. Into your hands, Lord, I desire to give myself to you

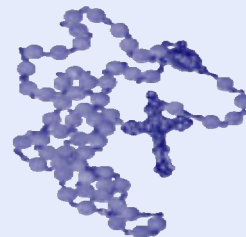

City of Liberty Testing Out An Affordable Ride-share Option



A new ride share pilot program is testing in Liberty from September 1 through November 30th. Liberty has part-

nered with the Kansas City Area Transportation Authority for this pilot program that blends traditional on-demand rideshares and fixed bus stops. The IRIS app uses "virtual stops" that will be within .25 miles (less than a 10 minute walk) of the requested pickup and drop-off locations. It's not a door-to-door service, but the goal is to expand access to transportation options in areas underserved by other forms of public transit.

Rides within the Liberty city limits are \$3.00; rides to and from the KCI airport from any of the covered zones are \$10.00. Rides are available from 6am until 10pm seven days a week.

There are three ways to use this new service:

- Download the IRIS by Ride KC app on your smart phone (Google Play or Apple Store)
- Book online - <https://book.iris.rideco.com>
- Book by phone - 816.205.8221

Look for more information about this pilot program in the bulletin or check out the information on the city's website at the City of Liberty website.

Data will be gathered during the three-month pilot program and will be used to inform the City Council on demand, use of the service, etc. and will be used to evaluate the need for an ongoing IRIS service agreement for Liberty.

While this may not be an urgent need for most of our parishioners, the \$10 airport ride fee could make travel plans so much easier! The city is testing this just until November 30th so please spread the word!

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary, primarily because the Feast of the Holy Rosary is celebrated on October 7.

According to an account by a 15th-century Dominican, the first rosary was given to St. Dominic in 1206 by Mary when she appeared to him after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses and efficacy, and told him to preach it to others.

In 1571, to commemorate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7 of that year, Pope St. Pius V officially approved the Rosary in its present form and declared October 7 an "annual feast," attributing the success of the battle to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

In 1884 Pope Leo XIII dedicated the entire month of October to the Rosary.

John Paul II called the Rosary his favorite prayer, in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a mother meditated on in her heart

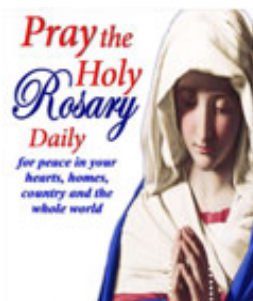
Let us all consider praying this beautiful prayer of the Rosary more often (many pray the Rosary daily)

In 1531, when the indigenous peoples of Mexico were subjugated and the practice of human sacrifice was still a recent memory, the Mother of God appeared to St. Juan Diego as a pregnant native woman, now known as Our Lady of Guadalupe.

She sent him with miraculous flowers in his cloak to tell the bishop to build a church where people could receive her Son and her loving, tender care. When St. Juan Diego opened the cloak before the bishop, an image of Our Lady was revealed that remains to this day.

The chapel was quickly built, millions embraced Christianity, and the Church increased its protection of the indigenous peoples. By embracing the mission entrusted to him, St. Juan Diego helped bring Christ's transforming love to cultures gripped by oppression and death.

Today, we again see the dignity of human life disregarded. Unborn children are destroyed through abortion, and ill people are encouraged and assisted to take their own lives. How do we respond?

The essence of our identity is that we are created in God's image and likeness and loved by Him. Nothing can diminish the priceless worth of any human life. Every person is cherished. 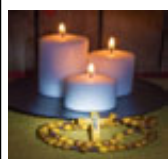
