



## Someone is Watching and Wondering



As I write these words, I think Fall has finally arrived. The days are getting shorter and the nights are cooler. Looking outside I find spectacular colors appearing on the trees surrounding my house, and plants displaying the beautiful blooms. For me, not only is Fall a time to enjoy nature's beauty, it is also a time to reflect and prepare: reflect on the past, present and

future. The past is filled with blessings, accomplishments, and yes, failures. Each new day and every sunrise reminds me of God's grace, and God's presence as I go about routine, ordinary tasks. Fall is a time to reflect on future ways in which I might love God more completely, put God first ahead of my wants and desires, follow in the servant footsteps of Jesus.

Fall is also a time of preparation; planting bulbs, trimming dead stalks, cleaning gardens and raking leaves. More importantly, I believe this is how I prepare to receive God with a renewed understanding and openness. One of the ways I work toward this goal is to spend time each day meditating on these simple words: "Be still and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10). As I pray, throughout the day, I am reminded just to be with God; to rest in God's presence; to calm myself; to behold the works of God. I feel God is telling me to pay attention, quiet all that is swirling around in my mind, stop fighting, allow God to be my stronghold and my strength. I think God is asking me to let go of hurts, guilt, frustrations, and my need to control every aspect of my life. God is saying be patient, trust, receive Shalom. When the earth shakes, the skies darken and rumble, storms seem relentless, and wildfires ravage, God is with me. When our world seems in chaos, God offers understanding and peace, stillness and rest in God's presence.

I also think God is telling me it is okay to simply **BE**. Be the person God gifted me to be. Be humble, be a seeker, be trustworthy, and willing to serve. Let God be God; glory in my humanness. Thank God for my uniqueness, for my abilities, for the charisms I receive. I think God is telling me to accept who I am, a beloved child, perhaps even a messenger of God's word; a servant, willing to go wherever I am called; to discern, as I am called by the Spirit, what actions I should take; knowing always that I am never alone. God is with me, all ways, everywhere, in all things.

Where you feel God's presence isn't important. In fact, how we know and rest in God is as unique as each leaf, with its fall colors. **Simply Be with, and Know God!**



## St. Luke Feast Day October 18



Luke, the writer of the Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, has been identified with St. Paul's "Luke, the beloved physician". We know few other facts about Luke's life from Scripture and from early Church historians.

It is believed that Luke was born a Greek and a Gentile. According to early Church historians Luke was born at Antioch in Syria.

The Acts of the Apostles follows the trail of Luke's Christian ministry. We know nothing about his conversion but looking at the language of Acts we can see where he joined Saint Paul.

Luke is the loyal comrade who stays with Paul when he is imprisoned in Rome about the year 61. After everyone else deserts Paul in his final imprisonment and sufferings, it is Luke who remains with Paul to the end: "Only Luke is with me"

Reading Luke's gospel gives a good idea of his character as one who loved the poor, who wanted the door to God's kingdom opened to all, who respected women, and who saw hope in God's mercy for everyone.

The reports of Luke's life after Paul's death are conflicting. Some early writers claim he was martyred, others say he lived a long life. Some say that he preached in Greece, others in Gaul. The earliest tradition we have says that he died at 84 Boeotia after settling in Greece to write his Gospel.


