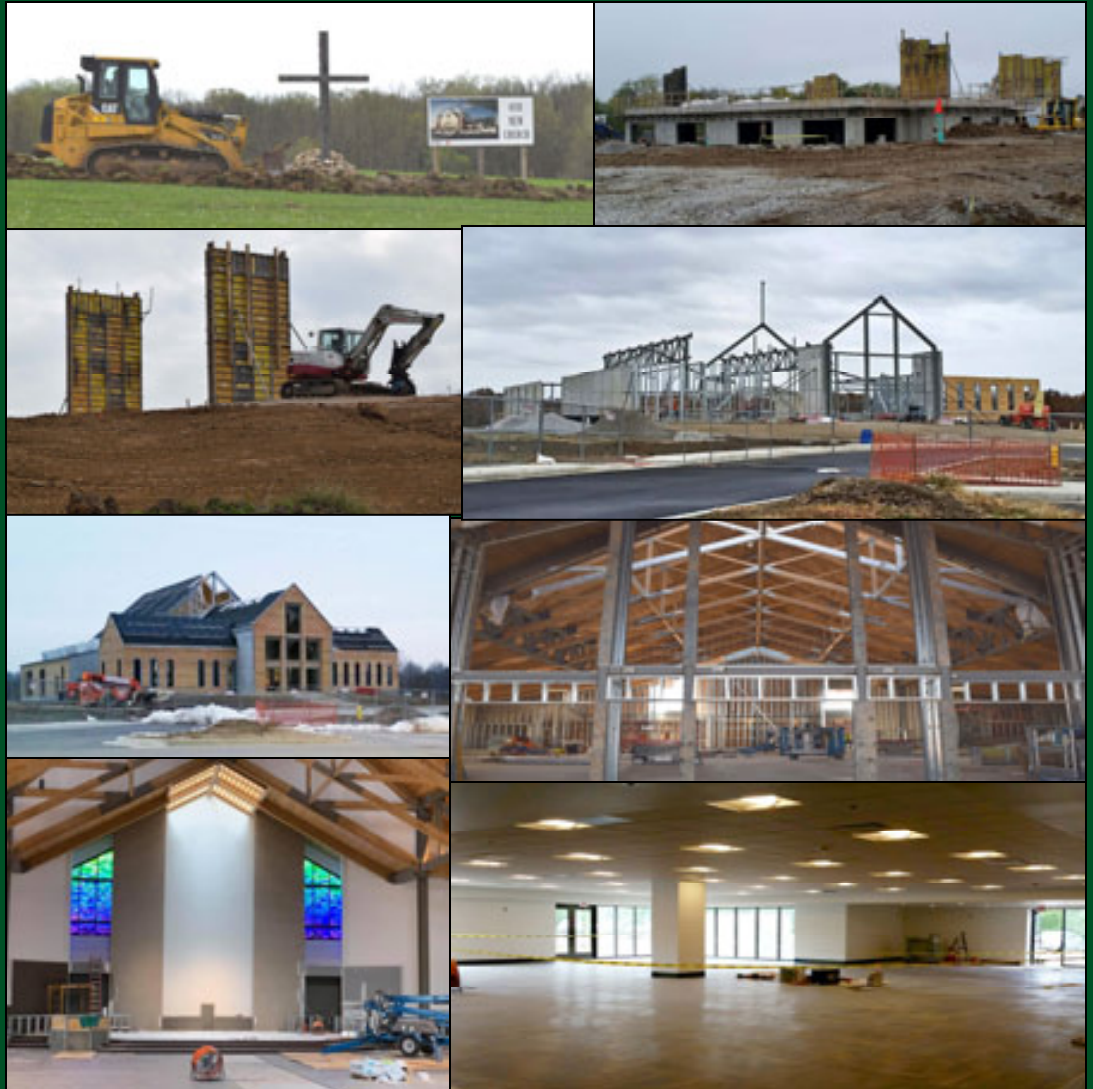

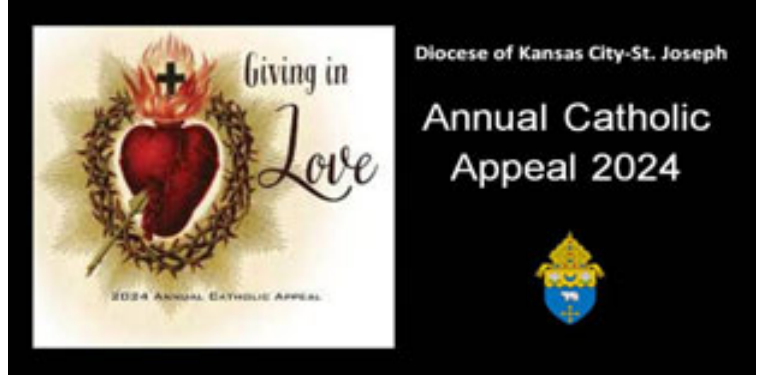

From the Pastor's Pen

When you read the Acts of the Apostles and the letters of St. Paul to the early Christians communities, you wonder how Paul and his companions accomplished their missionary work. They traveled by foot or boat; no cars or busses or trains in those times. They often met with indifference, hostility, or violence. There must have been discouragement when the converts sometimes abandoned their new-found faith. How did those early missionaries do it? In Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians, we hear the answer. Paul says that he remembers their faith and labor of love and endurance, loved and chosen by God. "For the gospel did not come to you in word alone but also in power and the Holy Spirit with much conviction."

Down through the centuries the missionary work continued. Preaching the gospel was a key work in the life of the Church. Many men and women gave their lives to the missions, traveling to the ends of the earth. Some even gave their lives in martyrdom.

If something good happens in your life, you want to share that experience with others: the birth of a grandchild; a college graduation with honors; an exciting vacation; the experience of traveling abroad. The sharing of good news comes to us naturally. For followers of Jesus, we have the greatest good news of all: salvation in Christ Jesus. Like Paul and his fellow missionaries, it's not just with human words that we share our faith. It is the power and inspiration of the Holy Spirit that gives us courage and determination.

As we celebrate World Mission Sunday this weekend, we rededicate ourselves to this work. We pledge again to support missionaries delegated by the Church to preach the gospel in our name with our prayers and offerings. There is an envelope for this purpose in your packet of stewardship envelopes. Please be generous.

My prayers are with you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



In today's society we are bombarded with many catch words and phrases such as "diversity, equity, and inclusion." Perhaps you have attended trainings on diversity in the workplace or a seminar focused on inclusivity in our churches or schools. Yet I wonder if we believe in the meaning behind the words. I think each of us have biases, and until we recognize our biases, feelings

and beliefs, we cannot begin to understand or address how to live in a world of diversity, equality, and inclusivity; a world in which the dignity of each person is valued and respected.

I recently read an article by Lutheran minister and public theologian Nadia Bolz-Weber. In speaking of our human bodies she stated, they are: "containers of the holy. . .inconvenient and disappointing. . .majestic wonders of God that carry us. . .from womb to tomb." She further stated: "I. . .know that the designations society places on us when our bodies are deemed too much or too little – too fat, too mannish, not masculine enough, too Black, not small enough, too loud, not pretty enough, too limited, not young enough – that the man-made designations our God-made bodies are given can add up – so much so that it can feel like a spirit is binding us, keeping us from taking up the space our dignity affords us as children of the most high." I never cease to be amazed that God chose a human body as a way to be with me; Jesus my friend, lord and savior? Given my faith in Jesus, who was fully human while also fully divine, I can embrace the realization that God saves me in "my [human] body, not from my body." My belief in Jesus and how I exist in this earthly body, is both wonderful and life giving. I can be who God created, without being overly concerned about my age, height, body shape, color of my skin and hair, my life with its disabilities and dependency brought on through aging, or whether I am strong or weak. Somehow it is easier to embrace myself and my humanity more fully and richly when I remember that I am made in the *imago dei*. Although God is present in all creation, humans are the only creature made in God's image and likeness. For me the question becomes, "Do I see the image of God when I look at other humans, or do I see and judge others based on their actions? How can I forget we are all God's beloved children?" I confess to God and to you that it is difficult for me at times, to separate the individual from their actions, especially when I see great harm coming to others as a result of sinful, immoral, choices made by my fellow humans. I hear God telling me to pray for them and to forgive their actions. I am not perfect, I too sin and make mistakes, but I am humbled to exist in God's image.

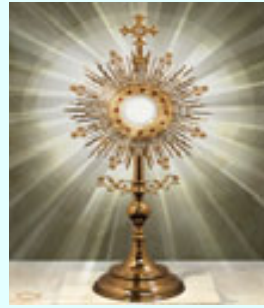
