



The Knights of Columbus are sponsoring a Winter Coat Drive again this year.


Many coats are needed as well as socks, gloves, scarves and other warm clothing.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As we approach the Feast of All Saints, I am reminded of living saints, those devote faith filled individuals who affect the lives of so many others,

following the teachings of Christ Jesus. Two such individuals are St. Joseph of Carondelet Srs. Rosemary Flani-

gan and Barbara Moore. The photographs above were taken 55 years apart, the black and white during the March on Selma, Alabama in 1965 and the later during a presentation by these women commemorating their courageous stand for civil rights. (Recent photo appeared in the Global Sisters Report, Feb 2020 — Sarah Baker). I do not know Sr. Barbara personally, but Sr. Rosemary (now age 96, officially retired, and residing at the Nazareth Living Center in St. Louis), is a dear friend and mentor. In speaking of their memories of 1965, they believe the year marked a turning point in U.S. sisters engagement in the civil rights movement and fight for social justice.

Rosemary was born in Kansas City and became Sr. Thomas Marquerite, CSJ in 1948. She earned a bachelor's degree in philosophy in 1947, a master's in 1956 and a doctorate in 1964. She was an educator for 42 years, first in elementary education and later as a professor at Avila and Rockhurst University. Rosemary retired from Rockhurst in 1992 only to begin an 18 year career with the Center for Practical Bioethics, where she served as the director of the "Ethics development and Education Committee. During these years she continued to be an advocate for social justice, through education and involvement with various groups. I know there are more than a few individuals in our diocese, priests and laity alike, who were challenged and influenced by this amazing women. Her involvement with the Center for Practical Bioethics brought into question many challenging issues surrounding the dignity of every human being when making medical decisions. I have personally benefited greatly from our discussions and her insights into the sacredness of every life, the sacredness of all God's creation, and how I must live a life of truth, love, and stewardship. Sr. Rosemary is one of many living saints who have blessed my life.

Who are those people in your life? Remember them in prayer. I know they are praying for you.

I wanted to share our 1st quarter financials with everyone ~ St. James-Liberty.

Out of curiosity, I looked back at some of the previous bulletin notes. I found this from the Fall of 2016:

"... August was looking so tight and then we get to last Wed. (Aug. 31), the multiplying of the loaves. We were able to pay all our bills and had \$9,991 in the bank to start Sept.

I know that may not sound like a lot, but folks - that is a lot. THANK YOU! Because of your dedication, financial accountability, and awareness to our parish, we have made the last 8 months with all our bills paid. The church runs on a cash based / zero based balanced budget. It has been many many years since we have achieved that kind of fiscal responsibility. So again, THANK YOU! I am so proud of our parish. Have we come a long way or what!"

As Fr. Mike shared this past weekend on the anniversary of our dedication, we have under \$600,000 left on our mortgage with the Oct. payment made. This is truly incredible! We continue to support other ministries and the needs of others; we pay our monthly bills; we have had maintenance that needed to be completed; AND we have maintained our commitment to our Parish mortgage. Job well done good and faithful servants.

ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES **MONDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2023**

Vice-Chairman Phil Baumert called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. The following council members were present: Fr. Mike Roach, Dan Bacon, Phil Baumert, Corrine Katzer, Betsy Lewey, Joan Peluso, Sherri Porterfield, and Patrick Schaub. The opening prayer was given by Dan Bacon.

Old Business:

- 1. Point of Contact Ministry: Dan Bacon reported that we currently have 14 parishioners who have volunteered for this ministry. He stated that training will be scheduled very soon.
- 2. Emergency Assistance Ministry: Betsy Lewey informed the Council members that there was no new news concerning this ministry.
- 3. Hillcrest Ministries: This item of business was tabled until the November meeting as Council member Yvette Lopez was absent. She did send word via email that she is waiting for a response from Hillcrest Ministries regarding their new policies and would inform the Council once she has more information.

New Business:

The remainder of the meeting was dedicated to the development of questions for a survey to be given to the congregation. The purpose of this survey is to give the Council direction on having a "bird's eye picture" of the needs of the congregation in the areas of Spirituality and Community. With this purpose in mind the Council brainstormed and discussed questions which focused on the formation of basing their guestions in relation to our church's mission statement. The importance of keeping the survey simple with questions to a minimum was also discussed. It was decided that in the areas of Spirituality and Commu-

nity, questions will be stated in the form of a statement with the respondent agreeing or disagreeing with the statement. It was also discussed that a short explanation statement be given at the beginning of each section of the survey and a comments area be provided for the respondent at the end of the section.

Vice-Chairman Baumert asked the Council to review the questions created at this meeting and to create description statements or an explanation for each area of concern. The goal of the November meeting will be for the Council to finalize the questions to be included in the survey and further discuss and write the descriptions to be included at the beginning of each statement.

Closina:

Fr. Mike reported to the Council that the Pickleball Ministry seemed to be a positive contribution to creating community in our parish with guite a number of parishioners participating in this activity. He also said that the Grief Support Group was starting again and should be of help to those congregation members who have lost loved ones. Fr. Mike then closed the meeting with a prayer and the members prayed "The Lord's Prayer" together.


