

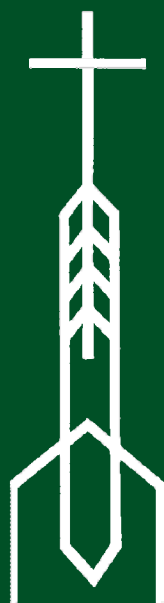

Someone is Watching and Wondering



For me, it is that time of year when I deep clean my house in preparation for holiday decorations, joyful celebrations, festive dinners, and guests who just might stop in for a visit. Outside my gardens are cleared ready for winter, the grass had the last

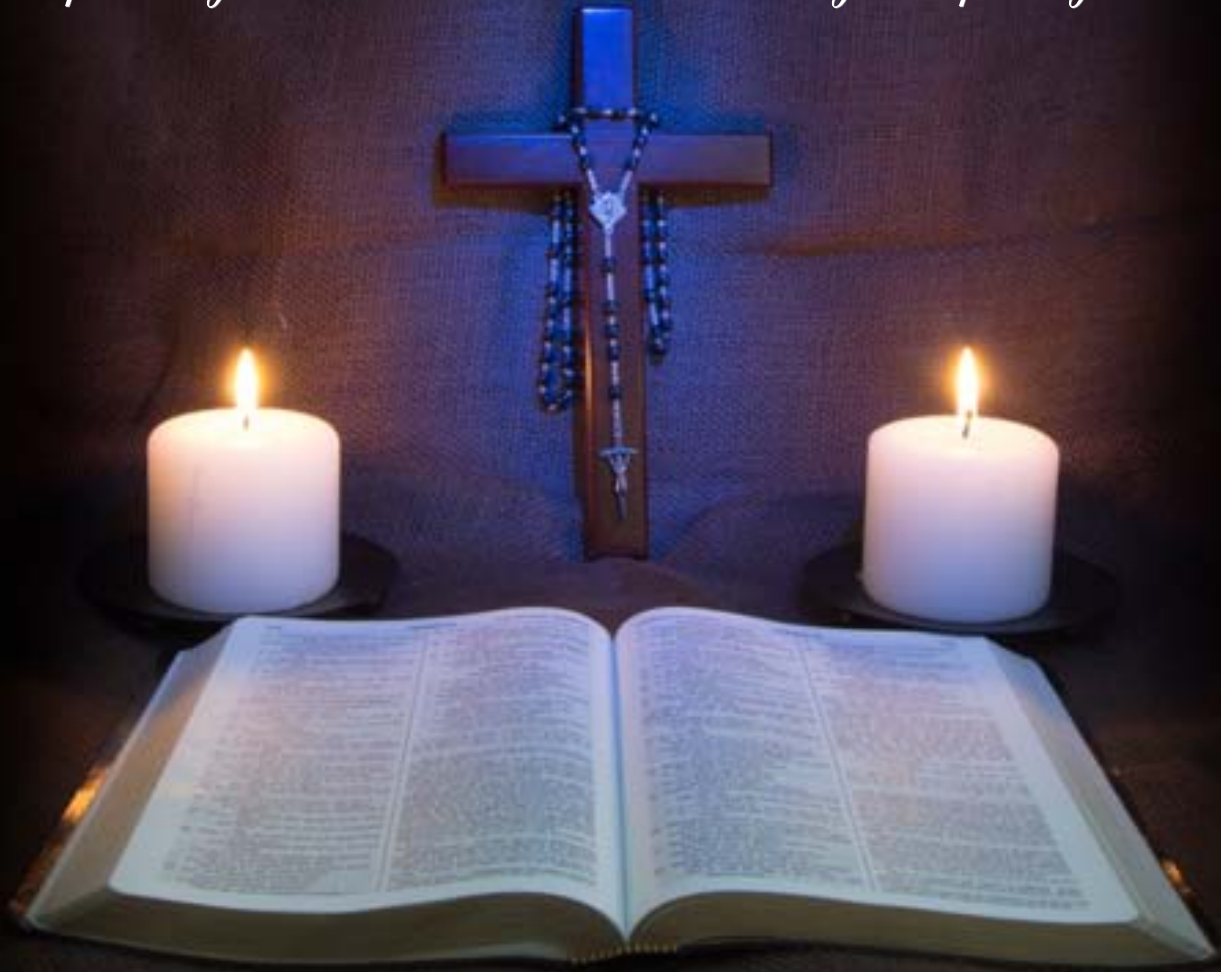
mowing, pipes and systems are winterized, and I'm prepared for winter's glory. Recently as part of my clean-up/clear-out I found an old writing tablet that belonged to my husband Gene. Of course, I couldn't simply throw it away, I had to search for any of his "Jewels of Wisdom." I was not disappointed. Among the scribbles and brief to-do lists, I found this: "It is essential to remember that salvation is not the fruit of our innate gifts, our adult competence, or our achievements. Mature faith recognizes that, no matter our competence or accomplishments, salvation is by God's grace and mercy." After this he wrote Romans 10. Of course I needed to look in Gene's New Jerusalem bible, where he had highlighted portions of this passage. What struck me, as perhaps Gene trying to tell me something, was the following: "The word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart. . .that is the word of faith. . .it makes no distinction between Jew and Greek: the same Lord is the Lord of all, and his generosity is offered to all." We are all God's beloved children.

Even though Fall is probably my favorite season of the year, this fall I have found myself feeling sad and out-of-sorts. I haven't experienced any personal loss or tragedy, but the world seems such a dark place. I am tired of pictures of destruction. I am tired of angry people. I am tired of voices raised in hate. I am tired of senseless violence. I am tired of "religious" people refusing to stand in solidarity with the poor, immigrants, undocumented people, those seeking a better life for themselves and their children. I am tired of witnessing so much pain and suffering. I am tired of feeling helpless, not knowing what I can do to make a difference. In my tiredness I found Gene's writings. Salvation for **ALL** comes through grace and mercy, therefore I cannot be helpless. I can be God's instrument, striving for peace, justice, hope, and love in what ever small way God opens before me. I can choose to let go and allow God's love to flow through me; I can give thanks and praise for all those who continue to accompany me on my journey to be more Christ-like, or I can sit back and wallow in my own personal pity-party. I think Gene is telling me to keep on, keeping on. He wants me to patiently, trust and follow God's gentle pushes. He wants me to use the gifts I have been given to touch others, to listen, and journey with them through their pain and doubts. I think Gene is saying, worry more about cleaning your mind and heart, and less about the house.

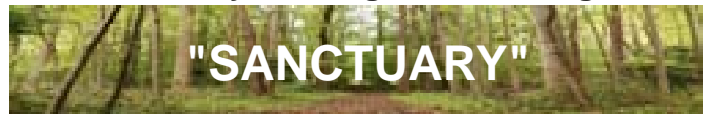
We are looking for volunteers to sell HOPE Gift Cards after the 5pm Mass on Sundays in the Gathering Space.

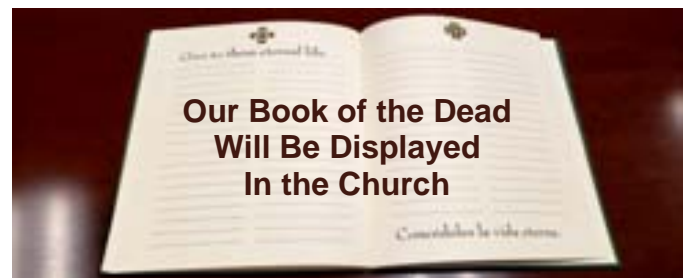
This week we are highlighting three more organizations AGT supports:

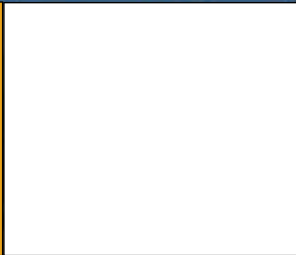
