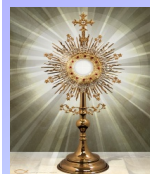

Someone is Watching and Wondering



In closing this month of November where we honor those who have died I want to reflect on two phrases: “**Never forget,**” and “**He/She is irreplaceable.**” These

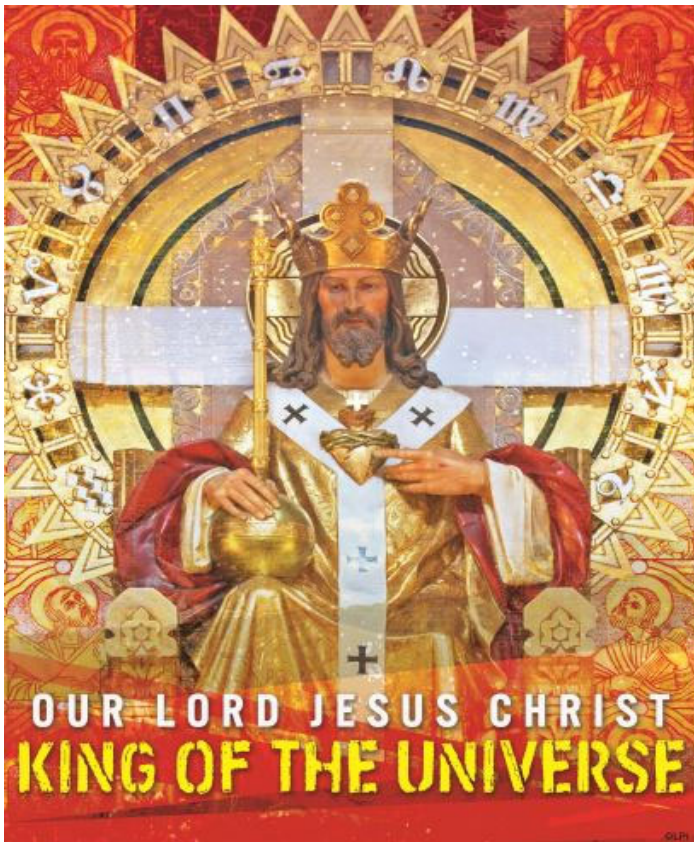
phrases echo in my mind as I think of so many human lives lost which I have witnessed and experienced in my lifetime: family members, friends, strangers.

As I write this brief column I do not know how many wars still rage throughout the world. What I do know is that many innocent lives have been and continue to be lost through seemingly wanton disregard for human life. Pope Francis has stated that war is never an answer; others have written that war is a lack of imagination, an unwillingness to see different perspectives, accept different cultures, religious beliefs, or diverse life styles. I am inclined to believe that war is a result of inflated egos, greed and the need for power; a desire to dominate and force self-interests. In reflecting on the loss of so many lives as a result of war and violent actions, “**May we never forget the call of Christ Jesus to love one another as he continues to love us.**”

The second phrase “He/she is irreplaceable” takes time to digest. If I am simply suggesting replacement as in a job or task to be completed, we are all replaceable. The world continues to turn, tasks are completed, students continue to be taught, religious services are held, social networks evolve, and the living go on. If, however, I consider the unique individual, then I confess they are indeed irreplaceable. No one is exactly like that person who has died, even an identical twin. No one thinks, acts, understands, or loves in the same manner; no one has affected my life or the lives of others in precisely the same way; no one has contributed to the community as they did; and no one can ever replace him or her. People who have died, continue to live in our memories and lives. I believe they continue to guide me, to love me, and to hold me close when I am afraid, or feel lost and alone. The communion of saints is not just those people canonized by the church; the communion of saints is comprised of all God’s children, all God’s beloved. Cherished and loved by God, I am also called to cherish and love my family, my friends, and my world neighbors. Yes, I believe people are irreplaceable and there is a certain emptiness in my life for each individual who has died. Although lessened by time, the pain of loss, and the memories endure as long as I remember to think of others, to see Christ in others, to behold and cherish others as Jesus taught, and to love without end as God loves me, you, all God’s children. Everything created is given to us through grace.

This Sunday, the last Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This solemnity, also sometimes referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Though it was originally celebrated in October, this feast was moved to the last Sunday of the liturgical year in 1969.

It is more than a coincidence that we close out the year with this particular feast. On this day especially, we celebrate the supreme kingship of Jesus over the entire universe. His is a kingship not like the secular monarchies of the past and present, but one that is pastoral, absolute, and desirous of bring us to himself.

Jesus is not just a King of Hearts. He is more than a Universal Coach, Teacher, or Consoler of mankind. By "King of the Universe" the Church is communicating Jesus' metaphysical scale, that God encompasses all of reality, not just man's reality. We say in the Nicene Creed that God created all things visible and invisible. So Jesus is King over all the planets, stars, black holes, quasars, and exploding suns in the blackest corners of remote space. He is King over the earth and all its waterfalls, rainforests, mountain peaks, desert plains, and dark sea floors.

We await the coming of Christ in his eternal Kingdom, but we recognize that he is already King.

St. Andrew Feast Day ~ November 30



St. Andrew was born in Bethsaida, in Galilee

He was Saint Peter's brother and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him." (*Matthew 4:18-20*)

Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Before the multiplication of the loaves, it was Andrew who spoke up about the boy who had the barley loaves and fishes. When the Gentiles went to see Jesus, they came to Philip, but Philip then had recourse to Andrew.

Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras on an X-shaped cross.

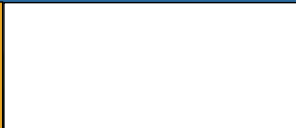
