






Mission Statement

From the Pastor's Pen

"Maranatha" has its roots in the Aramaic language, spoken in Israel at the time of Jesus. Basically it means "Come, Lord Jesus," a word is found in 1 Cor 16:22 as well as in Rev 22:20. The intent of the word is to express the longing, the anticipation, the expectation of the second coming of Christ in the early days of the Church. During those days of persecution it was the belief and hope that the Risen Lord would come soon to set things right and to bring relief and comfort to Christians living in the midst of trials and tribulations. In fact, the Risen Lord did not come again, at least in the way He was expected, so "Come, Lord Jesus" was prayed in the hope that He would be with people in their times of need.

So do we, the People of God 2000 years later, continue to call out "Maranatha." Our needs, trials, fears are no less than for the people of the early Church. We, too, live in a world filled with tensions, violence, wars, antagonisms, fears, and dangers. As people of faith, we cry out to the Lord, "Maranatha, come Lord Jesus." Will the second coming of the Risen Lord suddenly come upon us? Probably not. Why cry out? Why hope? Because the Risen Lord does come, but He comes in and through good people of faith among us today. Each of us reflect the second coming when we live in a spirit of faith, hope, and charity. We are all Advent people when we don't despair, don't give up, don't grow cynical, don't doubt the presence of the Risen Lord among us.

This year the Advent season is as short as it can be: only three full weeks. The Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Christmas Eve. Yes, we are caught up on the pre-Christmas commercial frenzy. It is so very difficult to make the Advent season spiritually relevant, but we try. How? Maybe five minutes a day in quiet with the words "Come, Lord Jesus" on your lips. Maybe five minutes in front of a lit candle, seeing the flame as a sign of the presence of the Lord. Maybe five minutes a day praying for someone in special need. Maybe five minutes a day reading a reflection from a spiritual book. Yes, you can find a way to make Advent a special time of welcome with the words "Maranatha, Come, Lord Jesus."

My Advent prayers are with all of you.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Advent is a time of watching and waiting. What are we watching and what are we waiting for?

When I think about these questions I realize that I am watching the changing seasons, fall into winter, and

waiting for the first noticeable snowfall. I know I may be in the minority but I like snow. Snow transforms the landscape from the dullness left after the brilliant fall colors have faded, into glistening pure white. Everything seems cleansed and robed in glory. Truly I see God every time I look at the natural world, take time to watch the never ending change, and set aside time to simply be with God and the beautiful life I have been given.

Such beauty leads me to think of our catechumens who are journeying toward fulfillment of their desire to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. They will enter the waters clothed in dark colors, emerge cleansed of sin, and clothed in a white garment. When they reenter the church, to be welcomed by the faithful, they will carry light of Christ, their baptismal candle. For now, they watch and wait to share banquet of celebration and praise at the Lord's table. A feast to share and be of sharing and transformation.

For the second question: "What are we waiting for?" The answer to this question is as diverse as people I encounter each day. There are people waiting for their wedding day, or the birth of a child, others waiting for work or a safe place to live. There are some waiting for a diagnosis or cure for a disease or prolonged illness. I think we are all waiting for the end to wars and a kinder, understanding, society where people seek justice for all. Youth are waiting for adulthood, adults are waiting for retirement, and retirees are waiting for security. "Of course," you might say, "these are all good and honorable, but really Advent is about waiting for Jesus." My answer to this: "Why are you waiting for Jesus now, during Advent? Why not embrace Jesus every day, he is present among us, touching, embracing, guiding, offering grace, forgiveness, and love. Why wait?" Jesus offers **HOPE** to all.

Do I embrace that **HOPE**? Do I open myself completely to him? Do I truly love Jesus with my whole being, heart, mind and soul or do I simply express platitudes of love? Do I accept my sacredness?

I believe Jesus is the one waiting; waiting for me. Waiting for me to give him my heart, to share his love, to embrace his call. Jesus is waiting for my yes. Lord I love you with all my being and I desire to serve you offering others the brightness and purity of the love I found in you. Why only watch and wait and wonder?

ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, NOVEMBER 13, 2023

Chairman Kevin Casel called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The following council members were present: Fr. Mike Roach, Deacon Chuck Koesterer, Dan Bacon, Eddie Baker, Kevin Casel, Yvette Lopez, Joan Peluso, and Sherri Porterfield. Patrick Schaub joined the meeting via phone. The opening prayer was given by Eddie Baker.

Old Business:

1. Point of Contact Ministry: Dan Bacon told the Council members that the first training meeting was held with six of those who had signed up for this ministry in attendance. Those attending gave good feedback and were impressed with the evacuation plans, i.e., tornado, fire, etc., that have been developed. Dan did say that he would like to have leaders for each section of the church to help parishioners in evacuations if needed. Ideally, Point of Contact and Emergency Assistance volunteers will work together in coordinated efforts if/when a disaster were to occur. The next training is being planned and will probably be one hour in length via Zoom.
2. Emergency Assistance Ministry: Kevin Casel reported that Betsy Lewey had told him that there are currently 38 members signed up for this ministry. Members will sign in when they come to Mass to let the ushers know that they are there to help if needed. He said that there was an incident on the weekend before this meeting where a parishioner had fainted. The usher found the EAM volunteer who then assisted in helping the parishioner. The parishioner was able to return to Mass after getting help.
3. Parish Survey: The survey to be given to parishioners in January from the questions agreed upon by the Council in previous meetings was shown to the members, The Council reviewed the survey and made any changes needed to place it in its final form. The Council discussed ways for this survey to reach as many parishioners as possible. Besides the survey being sent via email, it was suggested that the survey be accessed through a QR code placed in the bulletin, on the parish website and on large posters in the Gathering Space. For those who are not comfortable using a computer, hard copies of the survey will be printed and given to those parishioners. It was also decided that on the weekend that the survey becomes available, an announcement will be made before Mass asking all parishioners to participate. It is planned for the survey to be presented to the congregation on the weekend of January 6/7, 2024 with a deadline for return to be the weekend of January 20/21. The Council agreed that all who attend St. James and are Confirmation age or older and are registered or unregistered congregants should participate in this survey. Survey results will be released to the parish and published on April 1, 2024.

At this point, a side discussion was held on the importance of paying particular attention to the age group of confirmed high school students. Yvette Lopez said she would talk with Confirmation/High School leaders to explain this to these young people and let them know that we very much want their voice to be heard.

Patrick Schaub commented that he felt we were off to a good start with this survey in getting an overall picture of the congregation's thoughts. Once surveys are completed, we can analyze the data and use this to develop a more detailed survey to be given to the parish at a later date. This survey will deal with any concerns voiced in the initial survey. This later survey will provide knowledge to the Council on how to address those concerns voiced. The Council agreed with Patrick.

Chairman Casel and the Council thanked Dan Bacon for organizing the survey.

New Business:

1. Hillcrest Ministries: Yvette Lopez informed the Council that the man occupying the apartment sponsored by St. James is going to be graduating from the program in December. Discussed was the possibility of doing something to celebrate this graduation. Also discussed was opening this ministry to parishioners assisting in various ways. Yvette said she is waiting on answers for questions she has communicated to Hillcrest before we can move forward with this possibility.
2. Report from Fr. Mike: Fr. Mike gave the Council an update on the former church building. The roof has been a huge problem and has been replaced. This is true for the school as well with a new roof being addressed. One need is to have brighter lighting in the area and Katie is currently working on this problem. As things start to progress, professionals will be brought in for consultation. Also, the parish will be informed as to what needs to be done and a Capital Campaign will be developed.


A question was asked concerning the usage of the new church for concerts in the sanctuary. Fr. Mike informed everyone that groups, such as the Liberty Community Chorus, are charged a fee to use the church with the money going to the Music Ministries Department. He let the Council know that he very much supports outside groups using our church for events and that in January the Liberty MLK Celebration will be held at St. James as well as the St. Pius graduation and Liberty North High School Baccalaureate will be held in the Spring.

Closing:

Fr. Mike closed the meeting with a prayer and led the Council in praying the "Our Father" together. The meeting was adjourned at 8:15pm.

A Reflection

Today we begin the season of Advent, a time of preparation and remembrance and with this we begin the new liturgical year. The word "Advent" stems from the Latin word *adventus*, which literally means "coming" or "arrival." In context, this commonly refers to the coming of Jesus on Christmas day.

Advent is a time of joyful waiting. We wait hoping and expecting that He will come into our hearts and homes on Christmas day with all the peace and joy that only a loving God and Savior could bring. It is a time when we remember that Jesus came to earth over 2000 years ago to begin the Christian era with the divine gift of salvation which He holds out to all who are willing to commit themselves to His way of living.

Advent is a time of new beginnings. We have an opportunity to grow, or develop, a spirituality of waiting – a time of hope – as we pray constantly for ourselves, our world and our Church in the ancient prayer of Advent – "Maranatha, Come Lord Jesus, Come!"


