Someone is Watching and Wondering



I wonder, as we light the second candle of our advent wreath, the candle of peace, if I truly understand the **PEACE OF CHRIST?**

Watching events unfold around the world and in our

own country, I pray for and wait for peace. I wait for world leaders to act, settle disputes, and initiate negotiations which will lead to peaceful settlements of conflict. At the same time, however, I pray, "Jesus how are you calling me to be an instrument of your peace?"

Mercy Amba Oduyoye wrote this beautiful poem, which challenges me to stop watching and waiting and act: "A circle expands forever, it covers all who wish to hold hands, and its size depends on each other. It is a vision of solidarity. It turns outwards to interact with the outside, and inward for self critique. A circle expands, forever. It is a vision of accountability. It grows as the other is moved to grow. A circle must have a centre, but a single dot does not make a Circle. One tree does not make a forest. A circle, a vision of cooperation, mutuality and care."

I believe Jesus must be the center or the circle, directing my actions and allowing me to join with my brothers and sisters, all children of God. Taking one hand at a time, the circle grows, and is enriched by each member. Joined together, I can begin to know you. We can talk and exchange ideas, share dreams, and create understanding. As long as our hands are joined, we cannot strike out in hate. We are inclusive, not exclusive, we are equals. We learn compassion, dialogue, and seek solutions. When we stand united in solidarity the circle remains unbroken. No one is alone or left on the outside. I believe this was the reason why at the Synod on Synodality, participants sat at round tables. A circle provides safe space which grows and evolves with each new member, as a forest grows with each new seedling. Jesus at the center is our model, affirming each individual's potential, healing brokenness, reconciling without judgment. Jesus invites questions as we seek answers. Jesus encourages individuality rather than group uniformity. Jesus cares for each member, without manipulation. Jesus calls us to love life, to love one another. Jesus offers **TRUE PEACE**. We must continue to follow him, allow Jesus to be the center around which we build the circle.

I am created in the image and likeness of God, called to share God's love and **PEACE** whenever and in whatever way possible as I interact with others. Lord help be to be an instrument of your **PEACE**. Show me the hand I need to take and the individual to bring into your circle.

“The tree was beautiful in its greatness, in the length of its branches.” —Ezekiel 31:7

What kind of Christmas tree should you buy: artificial or natural?

If you plan to keep the same artificial tree for at least 15 years, then having a reusable one can be a good idea.

Otherwise, a cultivated natural tree offers the benefit of having absorbed CO2 during its lifetime and has not been removed from a forest, disturbing its ecological niche. Many cities will pick up these trees in early January and turn them into mulch.

An even more environmentally-friendly solution is to buy a small potted evergreen, dig up a volunteer tree in your yard that’s in the “wrong” space, or trim a branch from a tree on your property instead. All can provide some greenery inside during the winter and potted evergreens can be transplanted outside in the spring for reforestation.

The Meaning of the Advent Candles



Each of the four colored candles in the Advent wreath represents a week leading to Christmas. Traditionally, three of the candles are purple, and one is pink. The final candle is white and is located in the center of the wreath. It is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

It was once a tradition for the pope to give someone a rose on the fourth Sunday of Lent before Easter to "liven up" the somber tone of the season. Before the mass commercialization of Christmas, Advent was also a solemn time, as people fasted to prepare for the holiday. The rose custom became part of the third Sunday of Advent. Eventually, the third candle turned pink as well.

The candles are traditionally lit in the following order: purple, purple, pink, purple, white.

The first is called the "*Prophecy Candle*" and represents Hope. It reminds us of the hope the prophets and the people had for a savior.

The second is called the "*Bethlehem Candle*" and represents Peace. It symbolizes the peace that Christ's first Advent brought to mankind that fateful night in an almost forgotten stable in Bethlehem.

The third is called the "*Shepherd's Candle*" and represents Joy. It reminds us of joyful anticipation of the shepherds who journeyed to see Jesus in Bethlehem, even before the wise men.

The fourth candle, the "*Angel's Candle*," and represents Love. It reminds us of the ultimate love of God that He might send His only Son for us.

The "*Christ Candle*," the white candle in the center, stands for Jesus Christ himself.
