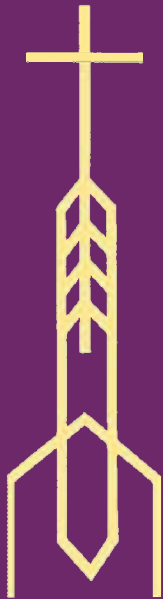

Important Information About Weekend Masses December 23 and 24

Because Christmas falls on a Monday this year, our schedule is a little different from what we would normally expect.

The Saturday, December 23rd 5:00pm Mass and the Sunday, December 24th 8:00am Mass will celebrate the 4th Sunday of Advent.

THERE WILL BE NO 10:30am MASS ON DECEMBER 24TH.

On Sunday Dec 24th at 3:00pm, 6:00pm and 10:00pm (with a concert beginning at 9:00 pm), we will be celebrating the Feast of the Nativity of the Lord, as well as on Monday Dec 25th at 9:00am.

Catholics are obligated to attend both the 4th Sunday of Advent and the Feast of the Nativity, which will mean coming to Mass two times that weekend.

From the Pastor's Pen

During the time when the Mass was in Latin in the universal Church, the words recited or sung during the entrance of the ministers were called the Introit. We call this Third Sunday of Advent "Gaudete Sunday" because the first word of the Introit, in Latin, was "Gaudete," meaning "Rejoice." St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians urges followers of Jesus to "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say "Rejoice." Why the invocation to rejoice on this 3rd Sunday of Advent? Because we are fast approaching the feast of the Nativity of the Lord with outbursts of joy commemorating His birth. You will notice that the priest presider at Mass wears rose-colored vestments and that the third candle of the Advent wreath is most often rose-colored. These symbols are beautiful reminders that the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord is near.

We have a men's organization in our parish called "This Man Is You." The group meets on Saturday mornings, beginning at 5:45am with the recitation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, followed by the Rosary at 6:00am. Then there is breakfast, followed by a video tape, followed by small discussion groups. I bring this up because the theme of the video presentations during these weeks before Christmas is "Joy." This series will include meditations of the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary. We are reminded as TMIY participants as well as all disciples of Jesus that the basic disposition of a disciple of Jesus is joy. Yes, it is true. Sometimes joy seems impossible. We think of victims of war, violence, and abuse and ask: How can these folks possibly live lives of joy? The only answer must be that the joy will come perhaps not in this life but in the joy of the Kingdom of God to come.

Most of us in this community and in our St. James parish are richly blessed. We have many reasons to be filled with joy even when there are hurts and hiccups. We join our fellow Catholics throughout the world family on this Gaudete Sunday with joy in our hearts. The Savior Jesus Christ comes among us.

Let us rejoice and be glad.

My prayers are with you daily.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Preparing for this third week of Advent, traditionally called *Gaudete* Sunday, (*Gaudete* being the Latin word for rejoice), we are called to joy. Joy is defined as a feeling of great pleasure

and happiness. Happiness is defined as a feeling of pleasure or contentment. So what is the difference between these two feelings and what should I experience of the Sunday?

For me, the distinction requires focusing on "Spiritual joy" as opposed to simple pleasures such as eating a great meal, earning a diploma, securing a long awaited job, moving into a new house, or sharing time with friends. Although these events may in fact have a spiritual dimension, the happiness one experiences is fleeting. Spiritual joy is so much more; it is a calm, unruffled feeling, a composed and serene state of mind, an experience of inner peace full of the glory of God's presence. A metaphor for spiritual joy might be the flow of a tranquil stream rather than the torrent of a rushing river; an inner gentle flow through our bodies, minds, and souls, that is noiseless, deep, and eternal.

Dr. Pamela King, an associate professor of Psychology, at Fuller Theological Seminary suggests that: "a helpful way of thinking about joy is understanding what matters most in human life." She has identified three critical domains of living in joy: 1. growing in authenticity [as a unique human being], 2. deepening relationships and contributing to [the well being of] others, and 3. living more aligned with one's ethical and spiritual needs. She further suggests that "the more one is able to live a strength-based [authentic] life, reciprocate relationships with others, and live with moral coherency, the more joy [they] will experience in life. This suggests that joy is not just an individual pursuit [feeling] but one that deeply involves our connections to others," [and to God]. Dr. King states that although there are many ways to discover and experience joy, when these domains overlap, "growing in intimacy, providing for others, clarifying and coherently pursuing our values," is when we experience the most joy. As I read her words and sought to understand her ideas, I was reminded of words found in scripture and particularly the teachings of Jesus. How can I feel spiritual joy if I live in a vacuum, trying to hide from the world, ignore the great diversity of people, cultures, and nature, and shun experiences of everyday life? Such a life is not a Christ centered life. The only way to experience true spiritual joy is in relationships: to myself, others, and to God. I must accept who I am, embrace the gifts God has given me, and use my time, talent and treasures for the good of all. I find true joy in a life centered around Christ.

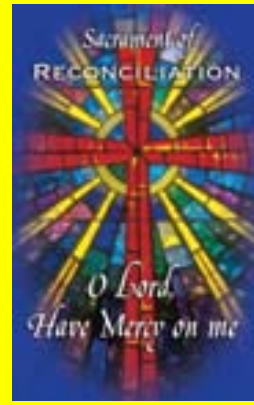

This fall, when the weather was nice, you could find the children out in the Prayer Garden or walking around our campus exploring God's beauty. We have been blessed to have so much support from Fr. From blessing rosaries, to talking about All Saints Day, to learning about baby Jesus, Gaudete Sunday, and the Epiphany, we have learned so much from them and their visits. And we are thankful for the opportunity our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade classes had to go to Reconciliation at the start of Advent. We had such a great night working with the school PTO for our parish wide Trunk-or-Treat and spaghetti dinner fundraiser for Steubenville. First Sacraments - Over the course of two evenings, we have celebrated 88 children receiving their First Reconciliation. Not only did they do fantastic at each of the services, but their families also did a great job of preparing them for reconciliation and sharing in the sacrament with them. We look forward to continue helping them to prepare for and celebrating their First Communion beginning in April.

Confirmation – Confirmation preparation is well underway. Our curriculum focuses on the Holy Spirit and how it plays a vital role in our lives after Confirmation. In addition to classes, we had a retreat and a service day. Sponsors have been heavily involved by attending the service day and also attending one of our class sessions back in October. We are looking forward to our second semester, which concludes with the Celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation on March 11!

Camino - Our high school program is off to a great year! They started back with a welcome potluck and activities outdoors. Our program continues to increase in size, which is amazing to see given it is in the second year of being offered. 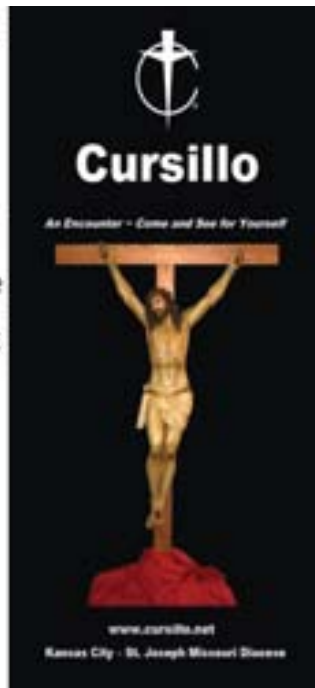

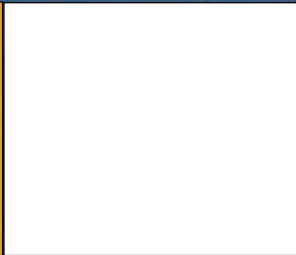

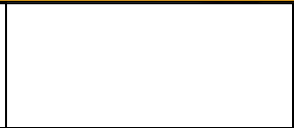
