

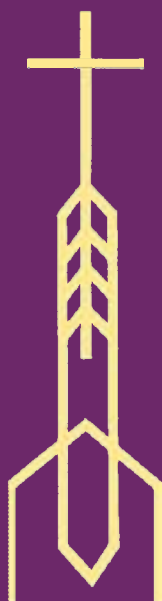

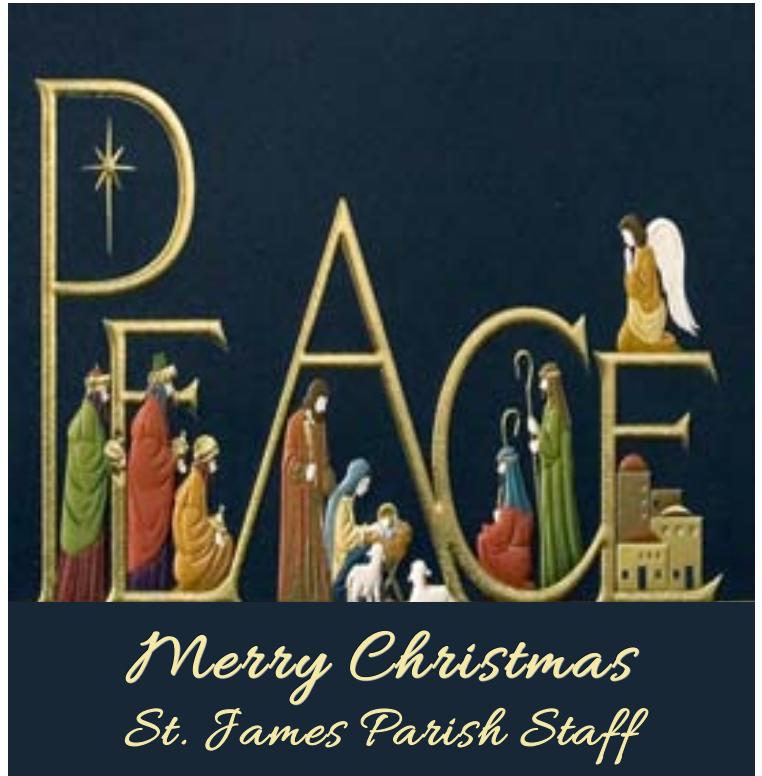

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I recently found a poem by Robert Frost entitled "Mending Wall," and it reminded me of the theme for this fourth Sunday of advent – Love. I feel certain that each of you have a

sense of the meaning of the word love or believe you have experienced love, but I wonder if any of us truly understand or have a true sense of God's eternal, everlasting love.

In his poem, Robert Frost begins by expounding on humanities love of walls. There are walls which are needed to construct buildings and house our families, walls that delineate property or divide fields, and walls which, though invisible, serve as personal boundaries. Yet, do walls make good neighbors? Frost's conclusion "Before I built a wall I'd ask to know what I was walling in or walling out, and to whom was I like to give offense." I wonder, what walls I have built and who am I protecting or shutting out? How can I continue to re-enforce my walls, while also professing to love as God loves? God's love is unmerited and unconditional, filled with grace and forgiveness, encouraging me to live as I was created, fully human and alive in the Spirit. Yet I continue to miss the mark. I rely on personal walls that separate and prevent me from loving, forgiving, and serving.

In just a few hours we will celebrate the birth of Jesus. His very incarnation is an act of pure love. St. Paul reminds us: "So in

Christ there is anything that will move you, any incentive in love, any fellowship in the Spirit, any warmth or sympathy – I appeal to you, make my joy complete by being of a single mind, one in love, one in heart and one in mind. Nothing is to be done out of jealousy or vanity; instead; out of humility of mind everyone should give preference to others, everyone pursuing not selfish interests but those of others. Make your own the mind of Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God did not count equality with God something to be grasped, but emptied himself. . . [becoming a human]." Jesus didn't build walls, he tore them down, offering loving space for all. Understanding and loving Jesus, I too must strive to remove walls that separate and divide. Walls do not make good neighbors but instead support exclusivity. Let's take them down.

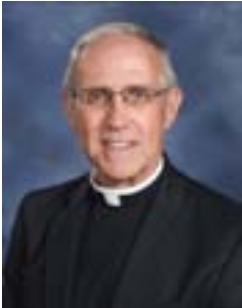

The Feast of the Holy Family Of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph Sunday, December 31



The Feast of the Holy Family celebrates the human family unit, as well as the ultimate family unit: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

The Feast of the Holy Family is not just about the Holy Family, but about our own families too. The main purpose of the Feast is to present the Holy Family as the model for all Christian families,

and for domestic life in general. Our family life becomes sanctified when we live the life of the Church within our homes.

The Holy Family feast is a good time to remember the family unit and pray for our human and spiritual families. We also may take this feast to reflect on the value and sanctity of the family unit, and to evaluate our own family life. What ways may it be improved? What would Jesus, Mary, and Joseph do?

Feast of the Holy Innocents - December 28



Also called Childermas, or Innocents' Day, this feast day commemorates the massacre of the children by King Herod in his attempt to kill the infant Jesus. These innocent lives bear witness to Christ who was persecuted from the time of His birth by a world which would not receive Him. These children were regarded by the early church as the first martyrs, but it is uncertain when the day was first kept as a saint's day.

Our Christmas joy is tempered today by a feeling of sadness. But the Church looks principally to the glory of the children, of these innocent victims, whom she shows us in heaven following the Lamb wherever He goes.

Reflecting On The Manger



The story of the birth of Jesus, as told to us by Luke, is full of joy in the midst of great conflict and sadness - even irony and rejection. It prepares us for the scandal of the cross by helping us see, in such a beautifully told story, that Jesus' mission is revealed to us, in how he came to us - in poverty and humiliation.

There, in the hay, we begin to know. There, in the manger, we begin to understand. Our God is revealed to us by coming in the lowliest of possible places. It is a meditation for our whole lives.

This story is here to bring us light in the midst of any darkness, poverty, rejection, emptiness, sinfulness we experience. By reminding us of where he where he comes, the Good News is also a revelation of who we are. We are the "people who walk in darkness." We are people who experience parts of our lives as dry and unwelcoming as that hay. We are people who, on our own, not only fail to know and understand; we are capable of tremendous infidelity and stubborn independence.

We get our word "manger" from the Latin (and so French, Italian, Spanish) root, which means simply "to eat." Jesus comes, into the greatest place of our poverty, not only to be "with us" but to nourish us. The manger can be the place we go this Christmas to be fed with the acceptance, love, and peace we need. There is no place of darkness in which we need ever feel alone. There is no situation, no loss, no tragedy that need ever leave us empty. There is no sin, no matter how selfish that will ever leave us apart from God's love.

We have prayed, "Come, Lord Jesus. Come and visit your people. We await your coming. Come, O Lord." Now, our eyes are opened to the wondrous joy of his coming to us in that manger 2,000 years ago, so that we will know and understand his coming to us in our hunger today, and ultimately so that we will long for his final coming to bring us to the banquet that has been prepared, to fill all our longing.
