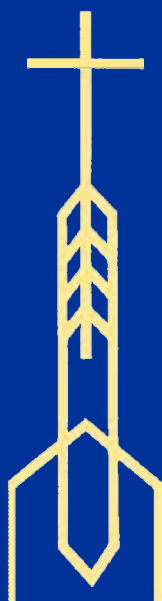

We Welcome Fr. Bill Donnelly Next Weekend



Next weekend we welcome Fr. Bill Donnelly who will be with us to celebrate Masses and tell us about the work of Unbound.

Unbound is a lay Catholic sponsorship ministry that helps children and elderly living in poverty in 17 developing countries, empowering them to become self-sufficient and fulfill their desired potential.



As a priest of the Diocese of Rochester, NY, Fr. Donnelly has served as an associate pastor, pastor and chaplain and also ministered to the homeless and worked with regional group homes. Now retired, he assists in a health care facility for the elderly and celebrates Eucharist at a homeless shelter as well as with college students.

PARISH SURVEY 2024

The best method to log your answers is to go online (see QR Code below). If you do not have internet access we will have a limited number of paper copies available in the gathering space. We estimate it will take 3-4 minutes to complete once you go online or sit down with a pen.

Survey begins January 6. The cutoff date for entries is Sunday January 28th.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



If I ask you to describe your visual image of a prophet, I think most of you would answer with a description similar to this picture – a male elder of a long past generation, who spoke to our ancestors in the faith. I wonder, however, if anyone would

describe him/herself, and yet are we not given the responsibility of a prophet, as a disciple of Christ Jesus? Are we not called to be voices sharing Jesus' "Good News" of the "Kingdom of God," centered in the mercy, forgiveness, and love of God? Are we not called to stand in solidarity with and speak for the vulnerable and weak of our world? Are we not called to carry the light of Christ to our brothers and sisters living in darkness? Are we not called to be prophets to those who overlook or objective others living outside our comfortable life-styles? Are we not called to serve the poor, the lonely, those living on the streets, hungry, cold, and longing for life's basic essentials? Are we not called to condemn war and violence? These are questions I continue to ask myself, especially at the beginning of a new year and as I prepare to journey with and serve others in this year 2024.

This past week, I read selections from a book *We Survived the End of the World*, by the Choctaw elder and retired Episcopal bishop Steven Charleston, in which he described a prophet as a human being who: "strives to stand on solid ground, even while the earth beneath their feet is moving [who]. . .not only talks about the future but the past [is grounded]. . .not only in the bedrock spiritual traditions of their people [but]. . .recall the ancient stories and covenants between the divine and human beings. They reinterpret ancient teachings and remind people of old promises. Prophets are immersed in tradition even as they talk about how that tradition will need to change to meet new. . . challenges." Charleston believes everyone can become a prophet if open to and awakened by the possibility and responsibilities of our time. We are all called to be prophets, regardless of our race, religion, age, or gender. Fr. Richard Rohr states: "We are not divine messengers. We do not speak for God. We are not miracle workers or moral judges. . .we are human beings living in extraordinary times; we are communities seeking a spiritual purpose. . .we are question askers. . .vision seekers. We strive to be common-sense advocates. . .to help people." In order to accomplish these goals we must believe in ourselves as chosen from birth and strengthened through baptism and the other sacraments, to be prophetic, to awaken to God's revelations of a new kingdom in which all are welcome and beloved. Our time may be short, but with God's blessing and grace we may know and speak truth to our fellow sisters and brothers. We can be bearers of Christ's light to the world. We can be prophets.

The Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord January 8



The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is the feast day commemorating the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. At first glance, the Baptism of the Lord might seem like an odd feast. Since the Catholic Church teaches that the Sacrament of Baptism is necessary for the remission of sins, particularly Original Sin, why was Christ baptized? After all, He was born without Original Sin, and He lived His entire life without sinning. Therefore, He had no need of the sacrament, as we do.

In submitting Himself humbly to the baptism of St. John the Baptist, however, Christ provided the example for the rest of us. If even He should be baptized, though He had no need of it, how much more should the rest of us be thankful for this sacrament, which frees us from the darkness of sin and incorporates us into the Church, the life of Christ on earth! His Baptism, therefore, was necessary - not for Him, but for us.

Many of the incidents which accompanied Christ's baptism are symbolical of what happened at our Baptism. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the Trinity took its abode in our soul. At His baptism Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we become the adopted sons of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our Baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our Baptism we must pray to avoid actual sin.

Celebrating Epiphany



Christmas may come but once a year, but thankfully the season doesn't end in the church's Liturgical Calendar on December 25th. After all the bustling activity leading up to Christmas Day, we get more time afterwards to reflect on the wonders of the Incarnation.

Think of it! God first assumed a human nature to save us from our sins, most vulnerably, as a little baby in a stable in a cave in Bethlehem! In being born in such a seemingly lowly circumstance, Jesus wished to highlight for us how much he values true humility.

On Epiphany, we hear the story of the Three Wise Men who followed the Star of Bethlehem that they saw in the sky heralding our Lord's birth. Matthew's Gospel refers to them as Magi, a word for astrologers, although tradition associates these men with royalty. They followed that star to pay homage to the "newborn king of the Jews" as they referred to Jesus.

The Magi first arrived in Jerusalem thinking that would be the most logical spot to find the long awaited Messiah but when they got there, guess what – they found...nothing and they were directed by King Herod to go to Bethlehem. And the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was.

Our God is truly a God of surprises! Born in Bethlehem? Not in the Temple or a palace surrounded by worshipers? Nope – in a stable in a cave outside Bethlehem!

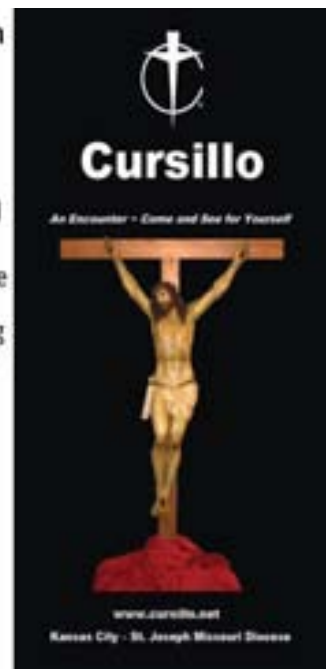

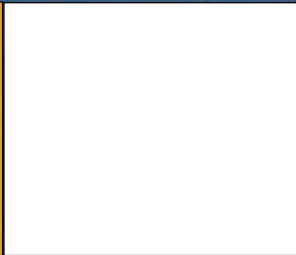

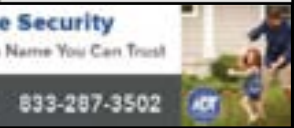
