



When Roe vs. Wade was overturned in June 2022, the issue of legal abortions fell to the state level to enact pro-life laws.

After all Masses this weekend members of the Knights of Columbus will be handing out a Roses for Life flyer supporting the Missouri Pro Life Campaign.

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combatting sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you observe or suspect sexual abuse:

- 1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
- 2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
- 3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500 or *crayon* @ombudsmankcsj.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

#### **About the Survey**

#### Someone is Watching and Wondering



When I recently found this image I thought it perfectly captured true, innocent love; agape, self gift to the other. Both the image of the child and of Jesus radiate pure joy in being with one another, a relationship of trust and mutual love. Whenever I share with others my understanding of catechesis, faith

formation, and spiritual direction, I emphasize these are part of a life-long journey of falling in love and developing a relationship with Jesus.

Often we speak of conversion as an event leading to initiation into the church, however, metanoia is a more accurate descriptor. Metanoia is an ancient Greek work (μετάνοια) which means a change of mind, a reorientation, a fundamental transformation of outlook, of a person's vision of the world, his/herself, and a new way of loving God and others. For me, metanoia is life-long. As I experience my relationship with God, my life changes and I learn to listen and share with others. As I seek answers to difficult questions and direction, my outlook and vision of the world evolves (hopefully into a positive, more Christ-like understanding). I am less afraid of confronting uncomfortable issues with open discussion, unpacking diverse ideas, dreams, and visions, developing new ways of embracing the uniqueness of my brothers and sisters as part of God's creative nature. The older I get the more I realize life isn't all about me, rather life is about us. I do not believe I can faithfully love God, without loving myself (as I am created) and loving others as they have been created. This does not mean accepting all my actions or yours as okay, but rather accepting myself and all God's creation as unique gifts of grace. Perhaps then I can experience love as the child in the image above. Jesuit Pedro Arrupe wrote: "Nothing is more practical than finding God, that is, than falling in love in a guite absolute, final way. What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination, will affect everything. It will decide what will get you out of bed in the morning, what you do with your evenings, how you spend your weekends, what you read, who you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes with joy and gratitude. Fall in love [with Jesus], stay in love, and it will decide everything." Fall in love with HIM; give HIM all of you!

## Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children ~ January 22



Roe v. Wade that essentially legalized abortion in all fifty states for almost fifty years was overturned on June 24, 2022, by the Supreme Court. However, that decision simply deferred the decision on abortion to state legislatures. Thus, state and

federal laws in many instances are still hostile to preborn children.

In response to this ongoing attack against human life, the bishops of the United States designated January 22 as "a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion."

Both child and mother need your prayers and your acts of penance - that every mother makes the choice for life, and that the right to life will be enshrined in every civil law throughout the world. Your acts of penance help atone for every abortion committed, especially for the repentance and healing of everyone involved.

Don't underestimate the power of your prayers and penance. Unite yourself to the Body of Christ, and do your part to bring healing to the past and true hope for the future.
