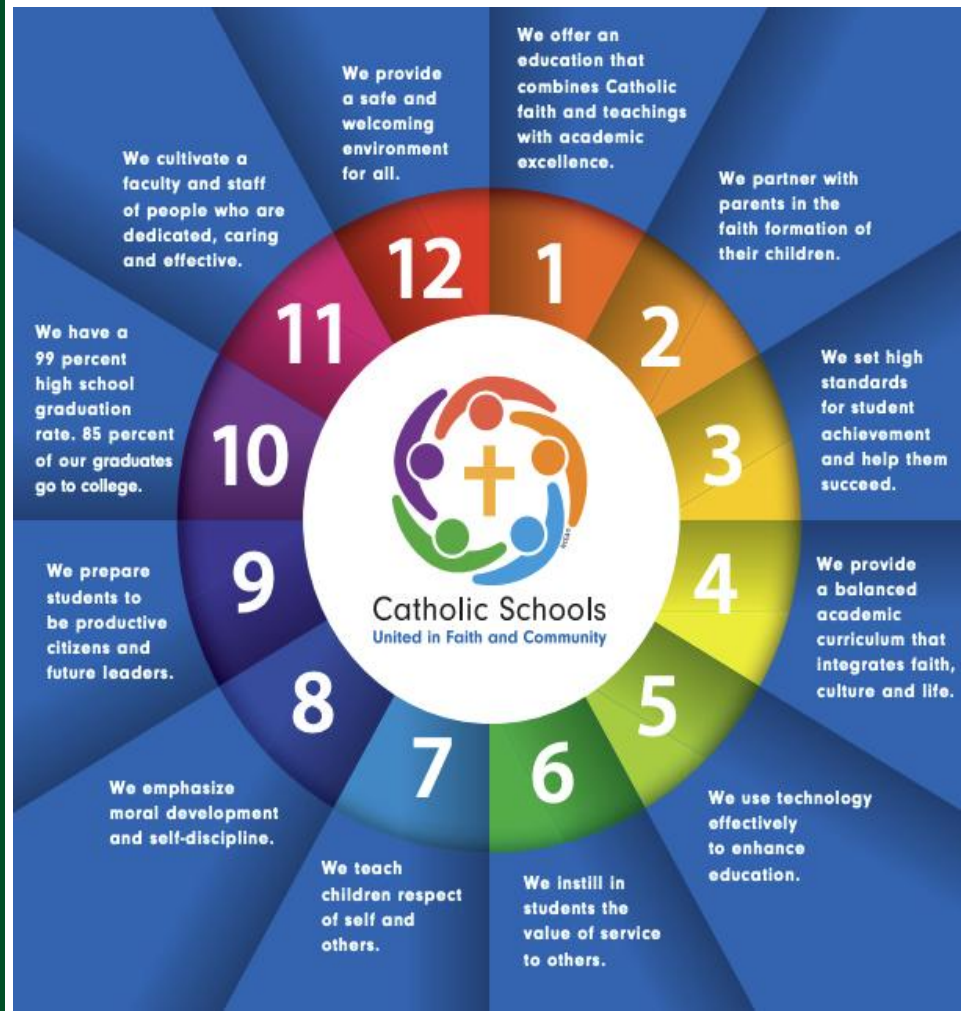

From the Pastor's Pen

Our St. James Parish Family has many ministries and social groups. I counted 43 in the 2023 Parish Guide and Directory. All of them are ways for parishioners to be involved in the life of the parish. I would like to highlight one of these: the ministry of Catholic education, particularly the St. James Catholic School. This is not to say that our Religious Education programs are secondary or unimportant. I single out our Catholic school ministry because from January 28 to February 3 we are joining parishes across the country in celebrating Catholic Schools Week. The theme this year is "Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community."

Why Catholic schools in our country? Why shouldering the expense, the challenges, the headaches? We need to remember the historical background. Most of the early Colonists were from England. Most were members of the Church of England or other Protestant denominations. When public schools were established, often Protestant teachings were included. Sometimes there was an anti-Catholic bias. When Catholic immigrants began arriving in greater numbers they saw the need to preserve their Catholic heritage. The result was the beginning of a Catholic school system: elementary schools, high schools, colleges and universities.

Today there is less religious prejudice. Still Catholic parents today see great values in Catholic education. Yes, quality teaching of subjects such as math, science, English, history is important. But even more important are the teaching and living of faith values: treating others with respect and dignity; living the great law of love; practicing social justice; and above all learning about the basics of our faith. Parents, whether Catholics or not, have a right to make a choice regarding the education of children.

As we celebrate Catholic Schools Week three things come to my mind: (1) that we support and affirm the ministry of our St. James School; (2) that we thank all those involved in our Catholic school ministry: parents, administrators, teachers, staff, volunteers and students; (3) that we pray for the ministry of our St. James School and all Catholic schools in our country.

My prayers are with you each day. Fr. Michael

About the Survey

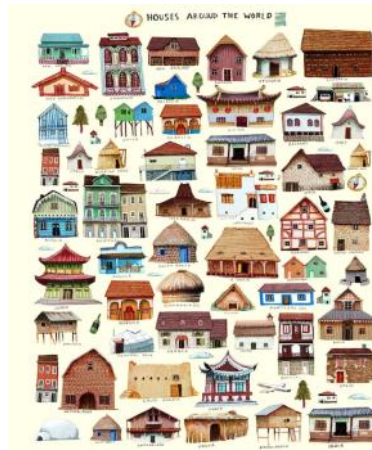

Someone is Watching and Wondering



During our recent extreme cold weather I heard a an ordinary woman interviewed who stated that she needs to help those who find themselves houseless. She further stated how blessed she is to have a warm house, with electricity, food, clean water, a place to bathe, and clean, warm clothes to wear. I agree with her

and find it incomprehensible how individuals living within our own communities find themselves without these basic necessities of day to day living. I also find the images, especially of children living in so many parts of our world ravaged by conflict and war, without shelter, food, water, and sanitary conditions, to be a sad, sad commentary on humanity for allowing hate and violence to proliferate, rather than love and dignity. Sometimes I feel a great failure within myself, an inability to make a difference for my brothers and sisters who are suffering and struggling for survival.

Serendipity Corner is a website where I find interesting quotes, some of which appear on greeting cards, pictures for decorating homes, and even items such as coffee mugs and bookmarks. There is an Indian proverb which I found credited to Rumer Godden, which gave me pause to think: "Everyone is a house with four rooms, a physical, a mental, an emotional, and a spiritual. Most of us tend to live in one room most of the time, but unless we go into every room, every day, even if only to keep it aired, we are not a complete person." Sitting with these words I realized that I do not spend enough time in my spiritual room. Instead I look at problems with the mindset of what **I can do to fix them**. Fr. Mike frequently reminds me that I must learn to trust God; God's thoughts, times, and ways are far beyond my thoughts, time, and ways of accomplishing anything. I need to enter the rooms of my bodily house and allow God to guide me, through the little ways I can work for others. The older I get, the more I realize that there is very little I can actually accomplish on my own, but going into my spiritual room each day, spending time with God, and working with my brothers and sisters, I know we can accomplish great things. I think spending time in my spiritual room is leading me to being a better listener, accepting differences, and striving to offer a safe place for others to express their needs and concerns. Maybe I can help, in some small way to ease their pain and suffering. I suggest spending time in your four rooms daily.

Steubenville Fundraiser

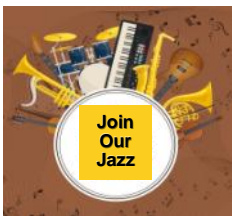

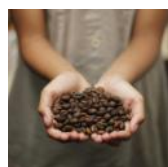

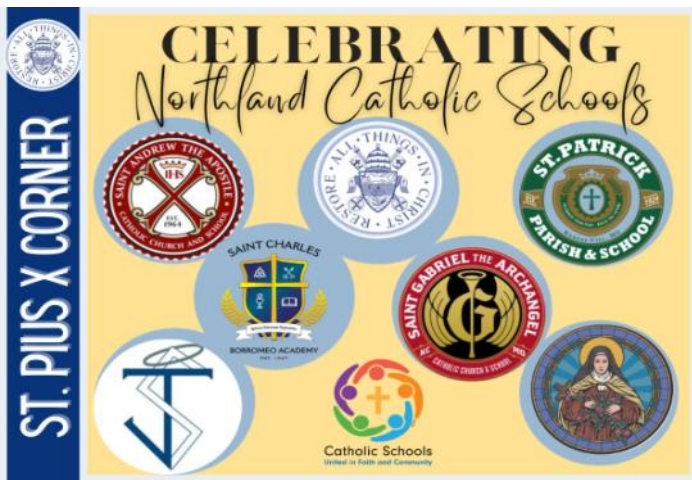
