From the Pastor's Pen

This week we begin our observance of Lent with the liturgy of Ash Wednesday. How is the date determined? It is always 46 days before Easter Sunday. When the Sundays are excluded, we have the traditional "Forty Days of Lent." The beginning of the Liturgy of Ash Wednesday may begin with these or similar words: "We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and our need for the love and forgiveness shown to us in Jesus Christ. I invite you, therefore, in the name of Christ to observe a Holy Lent by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by practicing works of love, and by reading and reflecting on God's Holy Word."

The sign of our entrance into Lent is the imposition of ashes. Ashes remind us of death and our need to always be prepared for the time when God calls us in bodily death. The ashes may be sprinkled over the head or a mark on the forehead in the sign of the cross. The words spoken during the imposition are "Repent, and believe the Good News." It is an empty gesture without meaning if the one receiving the ashes has no intention of entering into the work of spiritual growth. As we accept the ashes, it should reflect our firm resolution to do the hard work of repentance.

The requirement for fasting and abstinence is very minimal. Fasting means reducing the amount of food that we take at meals and not eating between meals. Fasting is required only on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Yet many will voluntarily cutting back on the amount of food taken, not to lose weight but as an act of self-denial. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to observe the law of fasting. Abstinence simply means days of not eating meat. Days of abstinence are Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday. All Catholics 14 and older are to observe the law of abstinence.

It is recommended that Catholics engage in Scripture study and reflection, participate in the Stations of the Cross, do works of charity, respond to the needs of the hurting, and attend daily Mass when possible. Our good example fortifies others and strengthens the Church.

I know that Fr. Mike joins me in wishing you a blessed Lent and in prayer. Fr. Michael



Someone is Watching and Wondering



Last week I wrote a reflection focusing on the first of three words Pope Francis wrote describing disciple-

ship: one must first seek, stay, and proclaim. As I mentioned, seeking Jesus didn't seem problematic until I realized that finding Jesus also meant I needed to let go of my overinflated ego, embrace all His teachings, patiently wait for direction, and trust in His love. The second word, however, is where I encounter great challenges: Staying with Jesus. Of course staying with Jesus is built on seeking with an open mind and heart. Staying also implies that I must stay with Him every day, through work, play, entertainment, physical activities, in relationships, and even at rest. I am reminded of Father Ed Hayes book on prayer when he admonishes us to pray always/all ways. I understand this to mean that even my most mundane actions can be prayer, so staying with Jesus requires I accept His presence always/all ways.

I know my journey of faith, staying with Jesus as His disciple, might be described as a roller-coaster ride. To say the least it has been both exciting and frightening. with highs and lows, steep climbs, dangerous curves, loops turning me upside down, and relatively calmstraight stretches. There are times when I feel like a seed in the parable of the Sower. I am on the path where the word/way is given but life seems to get in the way. I become involved in worry, troubling times, division in the world, or my need to accomplish my goals and I don't think I need His interference. There are times when I find myself on rocky ground. I feel great joy as the word resonates in my mind, yet I am unable to establish roots of sustainability; my spiritual formation seems lifeless. There are other times when I find myself surrounded by thorns, the lure of self-filing wants and desires. I forget that my greatest needs can only be fulfilled by opening myself to His grace; grace freely given, never earned. Miraculously it seems, there are times when I allow myself to sink my feet into rich soil; times when I am fully open to His word, feel a need to embrace His teachings, and live out His love in every part of my life. I feel an inner peace and joy that my life is valued and has meaning. I feel the need to reach out to others; to forgive and give comfort. I feel called to use my time, talents, and treasure for His purposes, rather than my own. I feel blessed to understand that staying with Jesus revolves around growing in relationship; not about theological concepts or following blindly without question, but rather sharing who I am and discovering how to live with Jesus as part of my rich, full humanity. I do not pretend that it is ever easy to understand or always agree with another individual in a honest relationship. What I do know is how blessed I feel to be in relationship with Jesus, not hiding parts of myself but forever staying with Him.




Our Lady instructed Bernadette to dig in the ground nearby, from which came a spring with healing properties, active to this day and


