

From the Pastor's Pen

This 4th Sunday of Lent is called "Laetare Sunday" when we are urged to rejoice. Why rejoice? Because we are halfway through Lent. Already on the horizon we see the light of Easter, the joy of the resurrection. We try even harder during this final stretch of Lent to deepen our faith commitment and to make our hearts ready to celebrate the victory of life over death.

But our parish family has another reason to rejoice. This Monday our Bishop, James Johnston, will be with us to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation with 64 of our young people. We ae so proud of those who have made the decision to be Confirmed. No one can be forced to celebrate the sacrament. Perhaps there are those who have decided to delay their reception of Confirmation, judging that they are not spiritually ready, that they need more time and prayer to deepen their commitment and to meaningfully invite the Holy Spirit to seize them and make their faith stronger. To those who have made the decision to be Confirmed we congratulate them and promise our prayer and support.

Perhaps you are unaware of a document from our bishop called "The Way: Youth to Young Adult Initiative." Recognizing that religious belief has been on the decline in recent years, our bishop sees the need to reevaluate our approach to religious formation. How ought we better ensure that our youth become devoted followers of Jesus? This document affirms the irreplaceable role of parents and provides a more direct involvement of parents in the ongoing Christian education of their children. The document is too lengthy to go into detail, but one of the decisions is to lower the time for the reception of Confirmation to the sixth grade. Obviously there will be a need for changes in our own parish youth formation program. You will be hearing more about the rational for this decision as time goes on.

The catechesis continues for those in the catechumenate who seek to join our Catholic Church family. We so much admire their determination. Under the great guidance of Sandy Gagnon and her crew of team members and sponsors, the catechumens and candidates grow ever stronger in their faith.

Remember them daily in prayer.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



The Second Vatican Council teaches that we, the faith-filled believers, are the Church. To me it seems that being the Church requires three basic

things: open communion with God and one another, participation in liturgy and ministry, and mission or what some term evangelization. I further believe that each of us is graced with gifts, abilities, and talents meant to specifically lead us in understanding how to live in communion, be full active participates, and to freely give of ourselves through mission living. These ideas connect directly to my understanding of the Holy Spirit's transforming power. Each time I receive the body and blood of Christ, I am transformed into an instrument for doing God's work. While communion and participation within our parish community seems easily understood, but am I aware how the Holy Spirit leads me into mission through my ordinary life.

Mission is directly tied to values and vision. As Christians our values are rooted in the teachings of Jesus to love and serve God and one another and from these values we should have a vision of what our world is meant to be. There are so many parables in the four gospels where Jesus tells us "the kingdom of God is like. . ." and He is quite clear that the kingdom is now, present in every day, ordinary living. There really doesn't seem to be a need to establish a new vision or new "mission statement" as Jesus has already provided these for us. What we need is to embrace how we are individually called, to live in unity with His words.

First I must find ways to share the good news, and as St. Francis is quoted as saying: "Using words only if necessary." Second I need to understand how I can serve others without discrimination; accepting each individual where he/she is at in their life situation. Third I must strive to nurture disciples. Catechesis does not end with the sacrament of confirmation; formation and conversion are life long journeys. Fourth I must find ways to care for the natural world; to conserve, protect, and restore what God created. Finally, I must seek justice and reconciliation not simply for myself but for all humankind. I should not be afraid of speaking out and working for social change that benefits the common good. I should not sit idle and wait for someone else to take action. I cannot expect governments and laws to be the sole solution. If you and I are the church, we must act in solidarity, lead by Jesus into mission, to create a world that is just for all. We must seek to reconcile differences rather than allowing them to separate us from one another and our unity with Christ Jesus. Lent is both a time for turning away from sin, all that isolates and separates, while also leading us into fidelity with the gospel. Jesus is knocking from within our hearts. Our call to mission is to let Him out and share Him with all the world's people.

You of course can do both! This week we ask you to:

- Donate things you don't need to charity.
- If you don't have a cross in your home, buy one and put it in your bedroom.

LAETARE SUNDAY Rejoice! 4th SUNDAY OF LENT

It never fails. On the fourth Sunday of Lent someone always asks "why are the vestments pink, not purple today?

The answer is that the Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as "Laetare Sunday." The day's theme comes from the entrance antiphon reflecting on Isaiah 66:10-11: "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast."

Laetare is the first word – meaning "rejoice" – in the Latin text. On Laetare Sunday (as similarly with the Third Sunday of Advent's Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. Call it pink – or, more fittingly, rose – this change in color indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide.

Laetare Sunday is the Church's way of giving us a "shot in the arm" as we approach the darkness and horror of the days through Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It's an opportunity to savor and keep in the back of our minds what awaits us on Easter Sunday – the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, and that our hearts will always be filled with joy!

Being aware of traditions and customs assists us in celebrating the beauty of our faith. As you can see, there is much associated with even a nondescript day like the Fourth Sunday of Lent – not to mention the rest of the season, or the 50 days of Easter and beyond. Take advantage of the richness of our Catholic traditions.


