

The Devotion of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Recitation of the Seven Sorrows Rosary Friday, March 22 4:30pm in the Church



Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard devotion in the Church around the 14th century. It was revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary's Seven Sorrows would bring great signal graces.

The devotion consists in praying seven Hail Mary's while meditating on the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

The Seven Sorrows of Mary

- The prophecy of Simeon
 The flight into Egypt
- 3. The loss of the Child Jesus in the temple
- 4. Mary meets Jesus on the way to Calvary5. Mary stands at the foot of the cross
- 6. Mary receives the dead body of Jesus7. Jesus is placed in the tomb

Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside her Divine Son as he gave his life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of his passion as only a mother can.

Our Lady's Sorrows are commemorated on the liturgical calendar twice a year - the Friday before Palm Sunday and September 15.

All are invited to join us in the church on Friday, March 22 at 4:30pm.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



When I recently rediscovered this passage from the book of Joel, I was struck how much these words are calling me during this Lenten season. As I

have been forced to depend on others these past few weeks for simple tasks such as shopping, driving from one place to another, doing laundry, cleaning the house and so on. I have also had time to look inward and refocus on what is truly important to me. Like most people I can make a list: safety, security, family, friends, companionship, life-long learning, and health. What I realize, however, is that the most important thing to me is my relationship with Jesus. During times of darkness, Jesus is my light. During times when I feel anxious, Jesus calms me. During times of loneliness, loss, and fear, Jesus stays with me and supports me. During times of failure, Jesus forgives and graces me with his mercy. During times of hopeless and despair, Jesus encourages me to trust, to stay the course, and do what ever I can to continue the tasks I have been given. Listening to these words: "return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning; Rend your hearts, not your garments and return. . . for gracious and merciful is he, slow to anger, rich in kindness and relenting in punishment" (JI 2:13) brings comfort and hope, light to the darkest hour, forgiveness when I feel broken, love when I despair.

On Ash Wednesday, as ashes marked our foreheads, we heard the words, "Repent and be faithful to the Gospel." I asked myself, how? I feel that although confessing my sinfulness can be difficult, being faithful to the Gospel seems impossible. Jesus asks that I forgive, that I care for those who cannot care for themselves, that I reach out to the lonely, provide shelter, clothing, and food to those in need, and respect the dignity of every individual. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are the pillars of Lent, but I continue to ask myself if conversion has occurred in my life as a result of these practices. I know that God is always close to me, filled with compassion and tenderness, yet there are times when I feel my heart has become hardened to the needs of others. Times when I feel that I am not doing enough. Times when I am unsure and feel unable to bring about positive change or make a difference in the world I witness. Then I remember these words, "return to me with your whole heart" and I know that is where I will find rest, comfort, forgiveness, love, and direction. I must make the effort to return to God, give myself to Jesus and be faithful to his good news. I know I am an imperfect being, yet with Jesus at the center of my life, all things are possible. Cast fear aside and embrace God's tenderness and compassion!



There are many legends and stories about St. Patrick. Perhaps the most well known is the legend that he drove all of the snakes out of Ireland. However, all evidence suggests that post-glacial Ireland never had snakes.

Patrick preached and con-

verted all of Ireland for 40 years, working many miracles and writing of his love for God in Confessions. After years of living in poverty, traveling and enduring much suffering he died March 17, 461.

Patrick was a humble, pious, gentle man, who had total devotion to and trust in God. He feared nothing, not even death, so complete was his trust in God, and of the importance of his mission.

Bishop Johnston Invites You to Attend The Charism Mass

The Chrism Mass Did You Know?

Every year there is a Chrism Mass at which the Bishop blesses the three oils that will be used in the parishes for the next year. The oils from the previous Chrism Mass are used in the Easter Fire at the Easter Vigil.

The three oils are the Oil of Catechumens, Oil of the Sick and the Sacred Chrism.

- **Oil of Catechumens** is used to anoint those preparing for the Rite of Baptism. Children are anointed on the breast bone.

- **Oil of the Sick** is used in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, to anoint anyone that needs to be strengthened for an upcoming surgery, beginning of an illness or becoming more frail due to age.

- **Sacred Chrism** the only one that has an aroma, is used in Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders as an anointing with the Holy Spirit. At the Chrism Mass the Bishop breathes the Holy Spirit into the oil.

This year's the Chrism Mass is at the Cathedral of Immaculate Conception on March 21 at 7pm.

Missouri Ballot Initiative Threatens Legal Protection of Unborn

Bishop Johnston is asking for your help preparing and mobilizing the Catholic community to act according to our faith.

There is a ballot initiative that would weaken legal protection for the unborn in the state of Missouri. The ballot initiative is an attempt to place a question on the ballot this November that, if passed, would amend the state constitution and strip away virtually all legal protections of the unborn currently in place.


