PREPARING FOR DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



In preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday, the Lord asked St. Faustina to make a Novena of Prayer from Good Friday to the following Saturday.

These nine days of prayer before Divine Mercy Sunday are like the nine days of prayer in the Upper Room before the day of Pentecost. For each of the nine days our Lord gave St. Faustina a different intention.

Each of us can make a Novena of Prayer for these intentions and others by praying the novena on pages 7 and 8 of this bulletin.

If you are on the St. James email list you will receive the Novena intentions and prayers for each day beginning on Good Friday.

A Special Promise of Mercy

Our Lord's promise to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy is recorded three times in the *Diary of St. Faustina*.

I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (*Diary* 1109).

Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary* 300).

The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary* 699).

It's allowed for one to go to confession up to 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday.

From the Pastor's Pen

Probably most of us will not be forced to enter a place of great danger. Yet, police and firefighters must sometimes experience life-threatening situations. Certainly people in some parts of our world family face dangerous situations daily: starvation, threats of violence, homelessness, human trafficking, evictions. In the gospel reading today we listen once again to the story of Jesus as he enters Jerusalem for a final time. At first it appears that Jesus is being welcomed with shouts of "hosanna," but danger lurks in the city. Plans have already been made for his arrest, condemnation, and the death penalty.

How are we to respond to the events of this liturgy? We have heard the story many times. We can't change history, but we can meditate on the response of Jesus. No turning back. No pleas of innocence. No outrage of the injustice. Jesus was simply determined to do what he had to do, his mission to bring reconciliation and redemption. From a human point of view, it must have been heart-wrenching. Undeserved suffering. Undeserved death.

All of us are accustomed to taking a palm, holding it up during the blessing, taking it home and placing it on display, perhaps behind a crucifix or holy picture. I wonder how many of us consider that in taking and displaying a palm we remember that we are standing in solidarity with Jesus. We are willing to be in a place of danger for the sake up building up the Kingdom of God. An example: it can be a danger to witness to the values of our faith, our defense of the value of every human life, by standing in front of an abortion clinic with a pro-life sign. It can be very intimidating. We could be the subject of vicious words, threats, name-calling. Yes, sometimes in our witness to faith values we stand in a place of danger. We pray today for the courage to enter Jerusalem with Jesus, the place of danger but also the place of salvation.

My prayers are with you each day.







Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today's liturgy is one of contrast, conflict, misunderstanding, and almost reversal of our Lenten journey of turning away from sin and being faithful to the gospel. The readings suggest that our introspection, discernment, and conversion are abruptly halted as we first sing Hosannah in the Highest,

then cry out "Crucify him!" Of course each time we celebrate mass we are faced with the reality and darkness of Good Friday beside the light, promise, and joy of Easter. For me, however, today in particular I am faced with the contrast and division that continues to exist in my life. I know that my love for Christ Jesus continues to grow, yet I also know how easy it is to fall back into old habits, feelings of discouragement and despair, succumbing to the darkness rather than walking into His light. When I recently found this image above, I recognized immediately how closely it represents the pattern of my life; a constant shifting back and forth between goodness and evil; living with Christ or living in sin; walking in the light or hiding in darkness.

Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn was a 20th-century Russian writer, Soviet dissident, and winner of the Nobel Prize. Perhaps his most famous work, The Gulag Archipelago, describing his eight years as a political prisoner, contains one of the most famous and I must confess accurate lines describing the razor sharp edge between good and evil: "It was granted me to carry away from my prison years on my bent back, which nearly broke beneath its load, this essential experience: how a human being becomes evil and how good. . . I was convinced that I was doing good, and I was well supplied with systematic arguments. . .Sometimes [we are] squeezed one way by exuberant evil and sometimes it shifts to allow enough space for good to flourish. One and the same human being is, at various ages [times], under various circumstances, a totally different human being. At times he is close to being a devil, at times to sainthood. . .even within hearts overwhelmed by evil, one small bridgehead of good is retained. . .and even in the best of all hearts, there remains. . .an un-uprooted small corner of evil." Within each of our hearts there is a fine line between good and evil, oscillating back and forth. Perhaps this is the mark of true temptation within each of us.

This Passion Sunday I feel forced to re-examine the ease with which I rationalize my actions. Are my actions centered in the love of Christ, or like the angry crowd am I willing to "crucify others" again, and again, and again? Although I sing praises of joy, do I quickly return to evil and demand reparations for perceived harms inflicted by others? Where is that thin line within, oscillating between good and evil? Hosannah vs crucify him! Lord, help me realize, "there is always hope" when I place my faith and trust in you.

THE NOVENA TO THE DIVINE MERCY

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on Good Friday. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena. In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her: "On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy. On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

FIRST DAY - GOOD FRIDAY - MARCH 29

Today bring to Me all mankind, especially all sinners, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose very nature it is to have compassion on us and to forgive us, do not look upon our sins but upon our trust which we place in Your infinite goodness. Receive us all into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart, and never let us escape from It. We beg this of You by Your love which unites You to the Father and the Holy Spirit.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon all mankind and especially upon poor sinners, all enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion show us Your mercy, that we may praise the omnipotence of Your mercy for ever and ever. Amen.

SECOND DAY - HOLY SATURDAY - MARCH 30

Today bring to Me the souls of priests and religious, and immerse them in My unfathomable mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, from whom comes all that is good, increase Your grace in men and women consecrated to Your service, that they may perform worthy works of mercy; and that all who see them may glorify the Father of Mercy who is in heaven.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the company of chosen ones in Your vineyard upon the souls of priests and religious; and endow them with the strength of Your blessing. For the love of the Heart of Your Son in which they are enfolded, impart to them Your power and light, that they may be able to guide others in the way of salvation and with one voice sing praise to Your boundless mercy for ages without end. Amen.

THIRD DAY - EASTER SUNDAY - MARCH 31 Today bring to Me all devout and faithful souls, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, from the treasury of Your mercy, You impart Your graces in great abundance to each and all. Receive us into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart and never let us escape from It. We beg this grace of You by that most wondrous love for the heavenly Father with which Your Heart burns so fiercely.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon faithful souls, as upon the inheritance of Your Son. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, grant them Your blessing and surround them with Your constant protection. Thus may they never fail in love or lose the treasure of the holy faith, but rather, with all the hosts of Angels and Saints, may they glorify Your boundless mercy for endless ages. Amen.

FOURTH DAY - MONDAY - APRIL 1

Today bring to Me those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Me.

Most compassionate Jesus, You are the Light of the whole world. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who do not believe in God and of those who as yet do not know You. Let the rays of Your grace enlighten them that they, too, together with us, may extol Your wonderful mercy; and do not let them escape from the abode which is Your Most Compassionate Heart.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who do not believe in You, and of those who as yet do not know You, but who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Draw them to the light of the Gospel. These souls do not know what great happiness it is to love You. Grant that they, too, may extol the generosity of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

FIFTH DAY - TUESDAY - APRIL 2 Today bring to Me the souls of those who have separated themselves from the Church.

Most Merciful Jesus, Goodness Itself, You do not refuse light to those who seek it of You. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Church. Draw them by Your light into the unity of the Church, and do not let them escape from the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart; but bring it about that they, too, come to glorify the generosity of Your mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Son's Church, who have squandered Your blessings and misused Your graces by obstinately persisting in their errors. Do not look upon their errors, but upon the love of Your own Son and upon His bitter Passion, which He underwent for their sake, since they, too, are enclosed in His Most Compassionate Heart. Bring it about that they also may glorify Your great mercy for endless ages. Amen.

SIXTH DAY - WEDNESDAY - APRIL 3

Today bring to Me the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children, and immerse them in my mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, You yourself have said, "Learn from Me for I am meek and humble of heart." Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart all meek and humble souls and the souls of little children. These souls send all heaven into ecstasy and they are the heavenly Father's favorites. They are a sweetsmelling bouquet before the throne of God; God Himself takes delight in their fragrance. These souls have a permanent abode in Your Most Compassionate Heart, O Jesus, and they unceasingly sing out a hymn of love and mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon meek souls, upon humble souls, and upon little children who are enfolded in the abode which is the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls bear the closest resemblance to Your Son. Their fragrance rises from the earth and reaches Your very throne. Father of mercy and of all goodness, I beg You by the love You bear these souls and by the delight You take in them: Bless the whole world, that all souls together may sing out the praises of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

SEVENTH DAY - THURSDAY - APRIL 4

Today bring to Me the Souls who especially venerate and glorify My Mercy and immerse them in My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose Heart is Love Itself, receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who particularly extol and venerate the greatness of Your mercy. These souls are mighty with the very power of God Himself. In the midst of all afflictions and adversities they go forward, confident of Your mercy; and united to You, O Jesus, they carry all mankind on their shoulders. These souls will not be judged severely, but Your mercy will embrace them as they depart from this life.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls who glorify and venerate Your greatest attribute, that of Your fathomless mercy, and who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls are a living Gospel; their hands are full of deeds of mercy, and their hearts, overflowing with joy, sing a canticle of mercy to You, O Most High! I beg You O God: Show them Your mercy according to the hope and trust they have placed in You. Let there be accomplished in them the promise of Jesus, who said to them that during their life, but especially at the hour of death, the souls who will venerate this fathomless mercy of His, He, Himself, will defend as His glory. Amen.

EIGHTH DAY - FRIDAY - APRIL 5

Today bring to Me the souls who are in the prison of purgatory, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, You Yourself have said that You desire mercy; so I bring into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls in Purgatory, souls who are very dear to You, and yet, who must make retribution to Your justice. May the streams of Blood and Water which gushed forth from Your Heart put out the flames of Purgatory, that there, too, the power of Your mercy may be celebrated.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls suffering in Purgatory, who are enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. I beg You, by the sorrowful Passion of Jesus Your Son, and by all the bitterness with which His most sacred Soul was flooded: Manifest Your mercy to the souls who are under Your just scrutiny. Look upon them in no other way but only through the Wounds of Jesus, Your dearly beloved Son; for we firmly believe that there is no limit to Your goodness and compassion. Amen.

NINTH DAY - SATURDAY - APRIL 6 *Today bring to Me* the souls who have become lukewarm, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy

Most compassionate Jesus, You are Compassion Itself. I bring lukewarm souls into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart. In this fire of Your pure love, let these tepid souls who, like corpses, filled You with such deep loathing, be once again set aflame. O Most Compassionate Jesus, exercise the omnipotence of Your mercy and draw them into the very ardor of Your love, and bestow upon them the gift of holy love, for nothing is beyond Your power.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon lukewarm souls who are nonetheless enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Father of Mercy, I beg You by the bitter Passion of Your Son and by His three-hour agony on the Cross: Let them, too, glorify the abyss of Your mercy. Amen.

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Conclude with:

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy on us and on the whole world. *(Three times)*




The Paschal Triduum 2024
