

Someone is Watching and Wondering



What glorious Easter liturgies this weekend which begins our journey through the fifty days of the Easter Season. As I watched the beautiful, radiant faces of the newly baptized, confirmed, and first communicants, I was

reminded of my own baptism and initiation into the Christian faith. I cannot remember a time when Jesus was not known to me, but I do remember my baptism when I was around 11 or 12 years of age. This was such an exciting time and I was anxious to receive communion (I made my profession of faith Palm Sunday was baptized Maundy Thursday, and received communion Easter Sunday at Budd Park Christian Church in Northeast Kansas City.) I remember feeling I was finally truly united to Jesus and was anxious to answer His call to serve. I was naive, however, having almost no idea how to follow Jesus. I thought I was to continue going to church, following the rules, and staying away from those "trouble makers." As long as I remained in my cocoon, everything was straight forward and relatively easy. Becoming a teen and young adult during the Vietnam war, however, changed not only my thinking about what it means to follow Jesus and serve others, but it also changed my sense of safety and security. I confess, I struggled for many years, including the four years I lived in Germany as a military wife and new mother, and especially when I returned home to Kansas City. My changing world and beliefs no longer seemed to be welcomed by family, friends, or my faith community. While I struggled to find my way, I was raising three young children and had returned to academia. I never lost the feeling that Jesus was part of my life, I just wasn't sure what that meant or how I was being called to serve.

There is a saying that crisis brings opportunity, and my family crisis certainly offered a variety of choices and opportunities. My husband, Bob, was diagnosed with lymphoma and suddenly I became his caregiver and our family's financial support. Through those five years of his battle with this illness, however, I discovered a deeper, richer relationship with Jesus. I came to realize, as I encountered Him in health providers, co-workers, and the St. James community that Jesus was always with me in the small, ordinary things of life. He held me as I cried, He supported me when I felt like giving up, and He gave me the strength to tell my children that life would get better. Although my first burst of enthusiasm following baptism those many years ago was real, I have learned that even when that excitement fades and faith is challenged, He is always there. Jesus' presence lights my inner darkness. He journeys with me as I face new challenges and opportunities to serve. I believe my greatest gift has been realizing my deep need for Jesus. I think His light radiates from His smile when I turn to Him and say, "I love you, Lord. Stay with me. Help me find the way." Happy Easter,

Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary* 300).

The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (*Diary* 699).

It's allowed for one to go to confession up to 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday
