


From the Pastor's Pen

Each year the 4th Sunday of Easter is designated as "Good Shepherd Sunday." The gospel reading for that Sunday always designates the risen Lord Jesus as the "Good Shepherd." The task of real life shepherds is to take care of the sheep: providing food and drink, protecting, caring for the wounded, seeking out the stray. Of course there are good shepherds who take a genuine interest in the well-being of the sheep, but also bad shepherds who care only about profits. Jesus says that He is the good shepherd who always seeks the well-being of the sheep. Jesus, of course, is risen in glory. He now designates in His church those who will act as shepherds in His name.

Down through the centuries from the time of the resurrection of Jesus there have always been those who are named as shepherds for God's People. At this time in the life of the Church it is only men who are trained, ordained, and serve the Church as priests. It is a Church law, not a divine law, so perhaps this rule will one day be changed. Women serve very valuable roles in the Church, not only women in religious orders, but women in parishes and religious institutions. They, too, provide a valuable role of shepherding.

God calls, but the call needs to be recognized, answered, and accepted. We pray always for this intention, that young people first accept the call of their baptism, keep their faith, be actively involved in the life of the Church in various ministries. Today we are focusing on a particular call, the call to priesthood and religious life. It is quite obvious that fewer young men and women are choosing a religious vocation, at least in North America and Europe. Cultural pulls in other directions are very strong. Perhaps our first prayer intention should be that young people hold strongly to their Catholic faith and actively practice that faith. Then the second intention would be that some consider a religious vocation. Prayer is good and necessary, but prayer is not the only way of support. We need to ask the question: "Young man or young woman, you seem to be strong in your faith. Have you ever considered a vocation to priesthood or religious life?"

Pray for me, for Fr. Mike, and for all priests and religious as I pray for you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering

You didn't choose abandonment; it happened to you. It feels like everything has been taken away from you. However, what you do have is the choice to heal.

There have been a few times in my life when I felt alone and abandoned. Apparently, this is a feeling which many people experience especially after a traumatic event or personal loss. Today we hear

of many young people experiencing these feelings as a result of cyber-bullying ... unfortunately, if some form of life-line is not offered, the result of these feelings too often results in suicide or violent acts against others.

As I began, there have been a few times in my life when I experienced these feelings. One I can share is when my husband Gene died from cancer. We were married shortly after my 60th birthday, and a few months following my retirement from MCC. I had never expected to marry after the death of my husband Bob, however, I discovered more happiness than I dared to imagine, but within four short years, Gene died from prostrate cancer. I was surrounded by family and friends, yet I could not shake the feeling that God was gone. I remember telling Fr. Mike: "God is on sabbatical leave!" I could not understand why Gene was brought into my life, giving me so much joy and happiness, only to be taken away by such a cruel, undiscriminating disease. I continued to attend Mass, and journey with individuals through the initiation process, even offering spiritual direction, but I personally did not feel the presence of God. In so many ways, I was spiritually struggling and lost. Yes, I was in a dark place, surrounded by light which didn't penetrate the surface of my being. I prayed and served as best I could, while feeling alone and abandoned by God. Fr. Mike continued to remind me to be patient, that feelings of God's care and love would return, because God never abandons anyone. I must confess, time, patience, and a desire to trust are great healers. God returned to me, or I came to realize God had never left me. I simply was not able, for many months, to allow myself to be open to God's presence, God's love, compassion, and forgiveness. I was afraid of losing and being hurt again. I felt such joy, however, when I once again opened my heart to God.

Breathing in God's love filled me with a desire to reach out to others in need and added a new dimension to my spiritual growth. If I am being completely honest, there are still times when I experience a "personal pity party" where I feel lost, unsure of where I'm at and where I'm going. Transitions are never easy, but with God leading the way all things are possible. Each day, a part of my prayer is asking God to lead me; to show me how I can help another person who may be experience feelings of loneliness and abandonment. No life should be lost because not one of us offered a choice; Christ's loving care shown through our patience, presence, listening, and kindness.

ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, April 8, 2024

The April meeting of Pastoral Council was called to order by Chairman Kevin Casel at 7:00 p.m. The following council members were present: Fr. Mike Roach, Deacon Chuck Koesterer, Dan Bacon, Eddie Baker, Phil Baumert, Kevin Casel, Betsy Lewey, Joan Peluso and Sherri Porterfield. The opening prayer was given by Joan Peluso.

Guest Report: Tom Greufe, Grand Knight of the St. James Knights of Columbus, addressed the Council concerning two ministries in which the Knights are involved and asked for possible ideas for a solution to a problem concerning both ministries. One of the largest ministries is the In As Much food ministry. The food collection is held four times each year and parishioners of St. James donate up to three to four tons of food each collection. The other large ministry is the annual Coat Drive held each November. Because of the renovation taking place in the old church area, the Narthex is not available for use to store the collected items as in previous collections. The Knights have tried other areas to house these items, but nothing seems to work.

The Council discussed possible solutions for both problems. One possible solution is to build an outbuilding to store the mowing and other equipment. The Knight could then use this area, but there is a problem concerning the temperature in the winter and summer because the garage is not air conditioned or heated. This is the same problem if food was stored in the outbuilding instead. Because the next collection will be in May, Tom said the Knights would like to find a storage place before this time. Fr. Mike told Tom and the Council that he guarantees this will occur. He needs to discuss this with the staff first.

Old Business:

Pastoral Council New Member Recruitment: Chairman Casel updated the Council on the upcoming discernment for new members. There are five candidates for two open positions. Discernment sessions will occur on April 21st and 27th. The Pastoral Council retreat will be held on the morning of Saturday, August 3rd at the Precious Blood Center. It was dis-

cussed to form a Planning Committee, but this was not needed because all planning had been completed.

Hillcrest Ministries: The Council was also told that Yvette Lopez had reported to Kevin Casel that painting for the apartment should take place within the next two weeks. The Council discussed how to get parishioners involved so that the parish members can take ownership of this very important ministry. Phil Baumert shared with the group that it is important that we inform and show to parishioners that this is one of St. James very important ministries. He suggested that other ministries be involved in the three teams needed to maintain our sponsored apartment with the Council agreeing. More discussion will take place on this matter at the May meeting.

New Business:

Review and Changes of Council Bylaws: The Council discussed and agreed upon any needed changes to the Bylaws written last Spring. The changes included some items that did not apply to the Council being deleted and as well as changes in wording. All changes will be completed at the May meeting and the updated bylaws will be published on the St. James website and given to all Council members.

Upcoming Officer Selections: Chairman Casel reminded the Council that elections of new officers for the 2024-25 year will be held at the May meeting. He also briefly explained the process.

Closing Prayer:

Fr Mike closed the meeting with a prayer and the Council members prayed the Our Father together.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

The Council's next meeting is Monday, May 13th at 7:00 p.m. in the AV Conference Room. If you have any ideas or concerns for the Council, please contact Fr. Mike or Chairman Kevin Casel. If you would like to attend the meeting, please contact Kevin Casel no later than Thursday, May 9th.

New Safety Ministry



St. James is taking steps to ensure the safety of all who attend our weekend Masses. Last year the Pastoral Council created the Emergency Assist Ministry to provide first aid for anyone in need. We are now implementing another ministry for

the safety of our parishioners.

We are pleased to announce that we are now training POINT OF CONTACT (POC) Ministers.

The POC Ministry will provide one person at each weekend Mass who will function as the person to contact whenever emergency situations arise such as Fire Alarms or Tornado Sirens. This person will direct volunteers to strategic points to assist in evacuations of the sanctuary if the situation warrants it along with other tasks.

WE NEED VOLUNTEERS

Some people have been asked to be POC ministers and they have agreed. We need more. In order to get this ministry operating we need quite a few more volunteers. If you can keep calm in most situations and can effectively lead others during what could be chaotic times then we want to hear from you. We will not schedule a POC minister more often than once per month. Therefore we feel we need about twenty-five trained ministers.




