

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Perhaps you have seen an advertisement on television for a medication to treat depression where individuals are walking around carrying a paper, smiley-face mask on a stick which they place in front of their faces when they are feeling

uncomfortable around others. Perhaps this commercial represents me. I have worn many different metaphorical masks to cope with difficult situations or people. I dressed, acted, and said what I thought was required of me, even when such actions were contradictory to my true self, beliefs, and feelings. I thought that in order to "fit in" I needed to hide myself; and hide I did for many years. Although not actually lying, I also was not truthful either. I even discovered that taking personality tests produced contradictory results because I answered questions based on a particular role or function I was required to fill. In retrospect, I also realize that as a child I was trying to please my parents, teachers, extended family members, and friends, hiding behind the mask I perceived to be what they wanted me to be. Taken to the extreme, I realize that I even hid behind a mask with God; praying with words that I memorized and thought were correct, rather than being honest and open. I hid my guilt, my anger, even my needs. I was afraid what God might think about me if I spoke what was real and hidden in my heart. I was living in my self imposed darkness.

Today, for the most part I have removed and hopefully destroyed my many masks. What you see is who I am and the words I speak and write to you are from the heart, hopefully guided and tempered by the "love of Christ," which I profoundly feel and embrace. I believe I needed to let go of the darkness within, my guilt, sin, dishonesty, feelings of failure, and perceived slights and hurts, before I could experience the joy of Christ's light. I needed to go through Good Friday, dying to the self I created in order to rejoice in my resurrection to a new life in Christ. I was forced to accept the reality of being created in the image and likeness of God; being loved unconditionally by God, embracing God's love and forgiveness, and accepting the words in Genesis: God looked at creation and pronounced it all very good. This pronouncement includes me; it includes you; and it includes everything and everyone that exists or has ever existed. Living in the light is not an easy path; it requires honesty and transparency (removing each and every mask I have hid behind) but it also opens me to vulnerability. I may be rejected or criticized. I may need to find common ground, even when I believe I am in the right. At times I will stumble and fall, but I know I am not alone. God always loves and cares for me. This is my Easter joy.

In 1930, the Church declared worthy of belief, the visions of the shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal from the May 13 to Oct. 13, 1917. Saint Catherine of Siena Feast Day May 29



St. Catherine ranks high among the mystics and spiritual writers of the Church. She established a monastery for women in 1377 outside of Siena, Italy.

She is credited with composing over 400 letters, her Dialogue, which is her definitive work. These works are so influential that St. Catherine would later be declared a Doctor of the Church. She is one of the most influential and popular saints in the Church.

Pope Pius II, canonized Catherine on June 29, 1461. On October 4, 1970, Pope Paul VI named her a Doctor of the Church

New Safety Ministry



St. James is taking steps to ensure the safety of all who attend our weekend Masses. Last year the Pastoral Council created the Emergency Assist Ministry to provide first aid for anyone in need. We are now implementing another

ministry for the safety of our parishioners.

We are pleased to announce that we are now training POINT OF CONTACT (POC) Ministers.

The POC Ministry will provide one person at each weekend Mass who will function as the person to contact whenever emergency situations arise such as Fire Alarms or Tornado Sirens. This person will direct volunteers to strategic points to assist in evacuations of the sanctuary if the situation warrants it along with other tasks.

WE NEED VOLUNTEERS

Some people have been asked to be POC ministers and they have agreed. We need more. In order to get this ministry operating we need quite a few more volunteers. If you can keep calm in most situations and can effectively lead others during what could be chaotic times then we want to hear from you. We will not schedule a POC minister more often than once per month. Therefore we feel we need about twenty-five trained ministers.
