From the Pastor's Pen

By the time this bulletin is distributed, the event called "BE-HOLD KC" will have already been celebrated. This past Saturday, May 4, all Catholics from the Diocese of Kansas City, Missouri, and the Diocese of Kansas City, Kansas, were invited to participate from 4:00 to 9:30 PM at the World War 1 Memorial. Activities at the event included the Mass, rosary, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, music, and personal prayer. We hope that some of our parishioners were able to attend.

This celebration was part of a national effort, "The National Catholic Eucharistic Revival," initiated by the Catholic bishops of our country. It is a response to what seems to be a declining religious fervor and appreciation of the Eucharist. Let me share with you a quote from that promotion: "Our world is hurting. We all need healing. Yet many are separated from the very source of our strength. Jesus Christ invites us to return to the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Revival is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery here in the United States by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist."

How do people understand the Eucharist? For some people it is only a symbol, only bread that reminds us of the gift that Jesus gave at the Last Supper. Yet the teaching of the Church has been very clear from the beginning. Hear again the words of Jesus: "I am the bread of life; whoever eats this bread will live forever; the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (John 6,51). In faith we receive the Eucharist believing that we are receiving the very person of the risen Lord. The primary way of honoring Jesus is receiving his presence at Mass; the secondary way is Eucharistic devotion. I hope that the Eucharistic revival will stir up in all of us a deeper sense of the Lord's presence to us.

Know that my prayers are with you each day.

The St. James Respect Life Ministry is sponsoring a Mother's Day card shower to benefit moms and moms-to-be who visit the Liberty Women's Clinic.

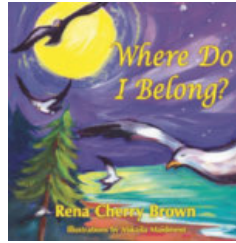

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Where do I Belong? Is a children's book about a Loblolly pine tree that is removed from the only home it has known to embark on an unknown journey. The tree faces fear, uncertainty, and physical transformation, while always wondering where it belongs. Arriving at its new

home, the tree finally realizes, it was never completely alone, and discovers new friends, new purpose, and new opportunities. Have you ever had an experience like this pine tree; a sense of disorientation and confusion? I know I have, in fact I have frequently felt this way this year. I sense my life is about to change dramatically, and I am not sure what my future holds? I find myself asking, "Where do I belong?" I do not feel particularly afraid but I do feel a great deal of uncertainty, some confusion, a certain lack of direction or goal, while faced with the realization that a transformation is taking place. I must confess, this sense of change, without direction, is totally out of my comfort zone, even though I have experienced dramatic changes in the past. I feel I'm in a boat, going somewhere with no destination in mind. I have no map or compass for direction, I am moving away from where I have been, and I feel alone.

St. Paul wrote: "May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all. . .so as to strengthen your hearts" (I Thessalonians 3:12). Reading these words I was drawn to St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians where he wrote "Faith, hope and love; but the greatest of these is love." This is a theme throughout his letters as well as the Gospel and Letters of John, and certainly the teachings of Jesus. Is Jesus leading me to a new way of loving? Is my boat taking me to another destination of service? Reflecting on these ideas, I am forced to confront, not how I live St. Paul's words (faith, hope, and love), but rather how I have lived antonyms to his words (unbelief, despair, and hate). I want to say I have faith, live in hope and love others, yet there are times when instead I lack trust, fall into despair or a sense of hopelessness, and direct malice, even hatred towards others. How can I love, follow, and serve Jesus; how can my heart be strengthened for my actions to shed Christ's light to others without continuing my journey of conversion? Perhaps my boat is being lead by Jesus but he is resting and not ready to reveal where we are going. I have written before that I am not a patient person and am persistent in searching for answers. At this point in my life, however, I am beginning to realize that my faith must include trust; my hope be rooted in patience; and my love a be a true reflection of the love I receive and know as a precious daughter of God. I do know this journey of mine is one of grace.

New Safety Ministry



St. James is taking steps to ensure the safety of all who attend our weekend Masses. Last year the Pastoral Council created the Emergency Assist Ministry to provide first aid for anyone in need. We are now implementing another ministry for the safety of our parishioners.

We are pleased to announce that we are now training POINT OF CONTACT (POC) Ministers.

The POC Ministry will provide one person at each weekend Mass who will function as the person to contact whenever emergency situations arise such as Fire Alarms or Tornado Sirens. This person will direct volunteers to strategic points to assist in evacuations of the sanctuary if the situation warrants it along with other tasks.

WE NEED VOLUNTEERS

Some people have been asked to be POC ministers and they have agreed. We need more. In order to get this ministry operating we need quite a few more volunteers. If you can keep calm in most situations and can effectively lead others during what could be chaotic times then we want to hear from you. We will not schedule a POC minister more often than once per month. Therefore we feel we need about twenty-five trained ministers.

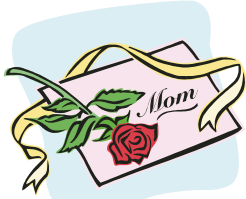

St. Damien of Molokai Feast Day May 10



St. Damien of Molokai, also called Father Damien, was a Belgian priest who devoted his life to missionary work among the Hawaiian lepers.

Born in Belgium in 1840, he joined the Society of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary in 1858 and went as a missionary to the Sandwich (Hawaiian) Islands in 1863. He reached Honolulu in 1864 and was ordained a priest the same year.

Moved by the miserable condition of the lepers whom the Hawaiian government had deported to Kalaupapa on the island of Molokai, he volunteered to take charge of the settlement. He served as both pastor and physician to the colony and undertook many projects to better the conditions there. He improved water and food supplies and housing and founded two orphanages, receiving help from other priests for only 6 of his 16 years on Molokai.

In 1884 he contracted leprosy, refused to leave for treatment and died in 1889.

He was beautified by Pope John Paul II in 1995 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009.



Why May Was Designated As The Month of Mary

A number of traditions link the month of May to Mary. Alfonso (a Spanish king) in the 13th century wrote in his *Cantigas de Santa Maria* about the special honoring of Mary during specific dates in May. Eventually, the entire month was filled with special observances and devotions to Mary.

The origin of the conventional May devotion is still relatively unknown. Herbert Thurston identifies the seventeenth century as the earliest instance of the adoption of the custom of consecrating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin by special observances. It is certain that this form of Marian devotion began in Italy. Around 1739, witnesses speak of a particular form of Marian devotion in May in Grezzano near Verona. In 1747 the Archbishop of Genoa recommended the May devotion as a devotion for the home. Specific prayers for them were promulgated in Rome in 1838.

According to Frederick Holweck, the May devotion in its present form originated at Rome where Father Latomia of the Roman College of the Society of Jesus, to counteract infidelity and immorality among the students, made a vow at the end of the eighteenth century to devote the month of May to Mary. From Rome the practice spread to the other Jesuit colleges and thence to nearly every Catholic church of the Latin rite.

In Rome by 1813, May devotions were held in as many as twenty churches. From Italy, May devotions soon spread to France. In Belgium, the May devotions, at least as a private devotion, were already known by 1803. The tradition of honoring Mary in a month-long May devotion spread eventually around the Roman Catholic world in the 19th century together with a month-long devotion to Jesus in June and the Rosary in October.

In his 1965 encyclical, *Mense Maio*, Pope Paul VI identified the month of May as an opportune time to incorporate special prayers for peace into traditional May devotions. Pope Pius XII, recognizing traditional precedents, proclaimed the "Queenship of Mary" through his encyclical, *Ad Caeli Reginam*.

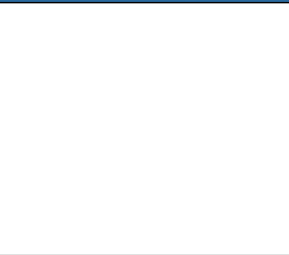

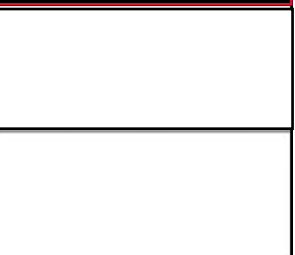
