room, board and other expenses, the cost of educating a single seminarian is about \$50,000 per year.

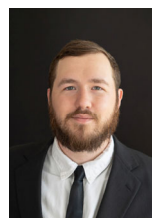

From the Pastor's Pen

Pentecost celebrates the gift of the Holy Spirit, given to the apostles, to the Church, and to each one of us. The apostles were sent forth from the upper room with a whole new attitude of mind and heart.

Before the Spirit came upon them, they were fearful and timid. After the Spirit took root in their lives they were bold and zealous. Before the Spirit alit in their hearts, they didn't know what to say or how to proclaim the Good News. After the Spirit found a place in their hearts, they told the story of Jesus with confidence and enthusiasm. Before the Spirit was embraced, they were unsure of their mission. After the Spirit was at work in them, they went forth to tell the good news to every person they would encounter. The Spirit made all the difference in the proclamation of the good news.

That same Spirit is a gift to be embraced by all who acknowledge Jesus as their Lord and Savior. How do we know the Spirit is present to us? We can't see or hear or touch the Spirit. Or maybe we can. The Spirit opens our hearts in prayer and meditation, in adoration and thanksgiving. But the Spirit also comes to us in the events of daily life, in conversations with others, in the liturgies of the Church (especially the Eucharist), and also in times of trials and tribulations. The Spirit always finds a way to speak to each of us, to enlighten us, to guide us, to comfort us, to energize us. Just as the Holy Spirit surprised the Apostles, so that same Spirit can surprise us if only we have minds and hearts open to receive that gift.

Today as we celebrate Pentecost, ask the Holy Spirit to be with you, to guide you, to enlighten you, and to give you a spirit of zeal and dedication as the Spirit gave to the apostles.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



How many times do you invoke the Holy Spirit? Many of us call upon the Holy Spirit every time we pray, at the beginning and end or each celebration of the Mass, as well as throughout the Mass, especially during the liturgy of the Eucharist, and whenever we receive one of

the public sacraments of our church. Perhaps there are other times in which you call upon the Holy Spirit. Today we celebrate Pentecost, (literally 50 or for most Christians, fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus) the Holy Spirit’s descent upon the people gathered in Jerusalem. As we mark the beginning of the church with its mission of ministry to the world, we are told to use the power of the Spirit to go, love, and serve. We were admonished last week, while celebrating the Ascension of Jesus, with Jesus’ words: “you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”

Reflecting on the scriptures from last Sunday and today I felt challenged to ask “Where is the Spirit in my life; when and how did I receive the Spirit; what am I empowered to do?” I think perhaps there are times when my words cause you to raise your eyebrows, roll your eyes, shake your head, or wonder “In what universe does this poor lost soul reside. Today may be one of those times as I attempt to answer my own questions.

Let me begin by stating that I believe God graces each of us with the Spirit at the beginning of our existence. I read in Genesis that God created humankind and with the breath of the Spirit brought life. I feel this is true for every human; we are brought into being by God and the Spirit fills us with life. The central question may be, therefore, when or how do we recognize and embrace the Spirit, rather than when did we receive the Spirit? The easiest answer is “When we recognize God’s Spirit in receiving the sacraments, but I think this diminishes the Holy Spirit. In Jesus’ words, we are given power by the Spirit to do God’s will. At the heart of the answer, therefore, is when do I open myself to the Spirit, letting go of selfish wants and desires, and allowing the power of the Spirit to flow through me, into my words and actions? When and how do I submit to the will of God?

Although we traditionally celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Feast of Pentecost, I believe the Spirit has always been with me, sustaining and empowering me. Jesus asks that I give up my old life, die to self, so that I can be filled with the Spirit, becoming more Christ like, knowing the love of my heavenly father, and opening myself to the flow of God’s grace, empowering me to say “Yes” to God’s call to share the Gospel.

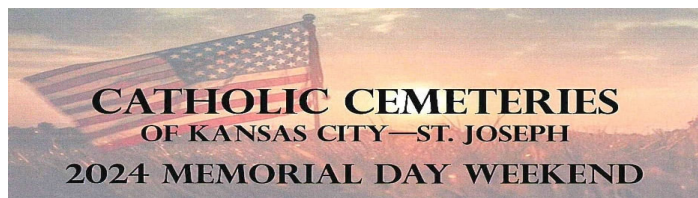

Why We Celebrate Pentecost

Pentecost, one of the most important feast days of the year, concludes the Easter season and celebrates the beginning of the church.



Pentecost celebrates the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room.

The Holy Spirit gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission - to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations

Right after Pentecost, Peter, inspired by the Holy Spirit, preached his first homily to Jews and other non-believers, in which he opened the scriptures of the Old Testament, showing how the prophet Joel prophesied events and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

For this reason, Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church - Peter, the first Pope, preaches for the first time and converts thousands of new believers. The apostles and believers, for the first time, were united by a common language, and a common zeal and purpose to go and preach the Gospel.



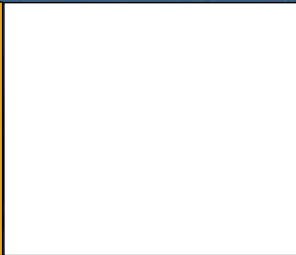

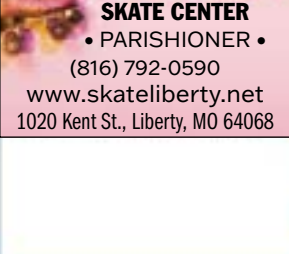
