Blood Drive May 28




During the summer months, the need for blood donations increases considerably.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Recently, after seeing the Aurora Borealis for the first time in many years, I found this representation of the Holy Trinity. The symbols for the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit appear to be overlaid on

the Aurora. For me this image is both interesting and illuminating; the ripples of color representing grace, the love of God outside the trinity. Although we are always in-graced by God, or embraced by God's love, we are given free will and can choose to refuse or ignore this love and shun God's grace. Can we, however, ever loose grace?

I once had a very wise, vowed woman tell me that for her heaven is complete union with God while hell is complete alienation from God. In other words, human beings, like the universe and all of creation, are works in progress. Unlike the rest of creation, however, we can choose alienation, trying to remove ourselves from grace (hell) or union, living in God's grace until our earthly lives are finished (heaven). We can choose to remain in God's grace or live in chaos, always searching for the meaning of life, a place of sanctuary, peace, and inner joy. Unfortunately, I do not believe any of these things exist without a relationship with God. Living in-grace we find our true home, a place of sanctuary, where we can rest in love, peace, and joy; where hope is ever present. I believe that the purpose and meaning for my life is found in my on-going journey toward union with God. Each day I experience a little bit of heaven when I place myself into God's care; when I recognize the emptiness I feel without God's presence Conversely, I can experience a bit of hell, if I choose to hang on to my self-centeredness and overinflated ego and when I choose to live with anger, pride, hostility, guilt and grief over the past and what could-haves, fear over what might be, and the stubborn mindset of being in the right. Holding to the idea that those with different opinions, ideas, traditions, or beliefs are wrong.

Jesus provides an example for living, the true way of loving and caring for others. Jesus continues, through his teachings to show me the way to the Father, how to believe that the will of *Abba* is my destiny. Jesus gives me hope of who I can become if I simply let go of my need for complete control, and patiently trust that all is well when I place myself into the Father's care. Jesus blesses me with the Spirit who strengthens and supports me through all the ups and downs of life. I profess faith in "three persons yet one being" as I also recognize my need for attributes that each (Father, Son and Spirit) provides in leading me toward the fullness of my humanity and union with the true God. The essence of embracing the mystery of the Trinity is embracing unselfish, unconditional love; the *agape* of God.

THE STORY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, appeared 6 times to three shepherd children; Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta; between May 13 and October 13, 1917. She came to the little village of Fatima which had remained faithful to the Catholic Church during the recent persecutions by the government. Our Lady came with a message from God to every man, woman, and child of our century.

Our Lady of Fatima promised that the whole world would be in peace, and that many souls would go to Heaven if Her requests were listened to and obeyed. She told us that war is a punishment for sin; that God would punish the world for its sins in our time by means of war, hunger, persecution of the Church and persecution of the Holy Father, the Pope, unless we listened to and obeyed the command of God. At Fatima, Pope John Paul II said on May 13, 2000; "the message of Fatima is more relevant and more urgent " then when Our Lady first appeared. The message is an appeal of our Heavenly Mother, Who sees us in great danger and Who comes to offer Her help and advice. Her message is also a prophesy, a clear indication of

what was about to transpire in the 20th century, and what is still going to happen infallibly in the near future, depending on our response to Her requests.

THE MIRACLE

As a great sign of the whole message truly coming from God, a marvelous miracle was worked in the sky above Fatima before 70,000 witnesses on October 13, 1917 at the time, date and place that Lucy and the other two children had prophesized in the name of Our Lady of Fatima.

The children were told by Our Lady that God would perform a miracle so that people would believe in the apparitions. The date the children was October 13, 1917, in Fatima. On that date, 70,000 people came to see the phenomenon. The miracle occurred with the sun. All could stare perfectly at the sun without blinking, or even hurting heir eyes. While all were watching the sun, it rotated, got large and small, got close to the people, and got far away from them. The sun " danced ". Every single person who was there testified to seeing the sun dance, even non- believers who immediately dropped onto their knees and begged for forgiveness.

MIRACLES TODAY

Our Lady of Fatima continues to work miracles today through Fatima water which is sent from Fatima around the world. This water sprang up in Fatima at the spot the Bishop told people to dig, very near where Our Lady appeared at the Cova de Iria (the Cove of Peace). The water is known to cure people with sicknesses and poor health. Other people are cured when they go on pilgrimage to Fatima, about 90 miles north of Lisbon, Portugal.

Trinity Sunday, officially called "The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity," is one of the few celebrations of the Christian Year that commemorates a reality and doctrine rather than a person or event. On Trinity Sunday, Christians remember and honor the eternal God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The Trinity is one of the most fascinating - and controversial - Christian teachings. The Trinity is described as a "mystery." By mystery the Church does not mean a riddle, but rather the Trinity is a reality above our human comprehension that we may begin to grasp, but ultimately must know through worship, symbol, and faith. It has been said that mystery is not a wall to run up against, but an ocean in which to swim.

Essentially the Trinity is the belief that God is one in essence (Greek ousia), but distinct in person (Greek hypostasis). The Greek word for person means "that which stands on its own," or "individual reality," and does not mean the persons of the Trinity are three human beings. Therefore Christians believe that the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are somehow distinct from one another (not divided though), yet completely united in will and essence. How can this be?

Well, think of the sight of two eyes. The eyes are distinct, yet one and undivided in their sight. Another illustration to explain the Trinity is the musical chord. Think of a C-chord. The C, E, and G notes are all distinct notes, but joined together as one chord the sound is richer and more dynamic than had the notes been played individually. The chords are all equally important in producing the rich sound, and the sound is lacking and thin if one of the notes is left out.

Each person of the Trinity interpenetrates one another, and each has distinct roles in creation and redemption. For instance, God the Father created the world through the Son and the Holy Spirit hovered over the waters at creation. The Trinity is not pointless metaphysical speculation, but about the heart of our salvation.
