From the Pastor's Pen

Blood is an amazing creation of God. Blood flows through the bodies of human and other vertebrates, pumped by the heart, delivering nutrients and oxygen to the cells and transporting waste products. Blood loss can end life. Blood disease can bring about death. Blood is a key to life.

Jesus had a human nature like ours. The circulating blood meant life for him, just as it does for us. At the time of his agony and crucifixion, the loss of blood led to his weakness and ultimately to his death. His bloodshed, though, meant life to all who put their faith in him.

In a miraculous way the blood of Jesus was not lost forever in his death. Remember His words at the Last Supper as he presented the cup: "Drink from it, all of you, for this is the blood of the covenant which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins." From the earliest days of the Church, disciples of Jesus took to heart these words of Jesus, breaking bread and sharing the cup in the celebration of the Eucharist. This action has been passed on from generation to generation down through the many centuries. We share in this faith and continue to find the presence of Jesus in the consecrated bread and wine. The blood of Jesus flows through us."

We call the blood of Christ "precious." It is dear to us, valuable, costly. It is the price of our salvation. It is the doctrine of our faith that in the celebration of the Eucharist the Blood of Christ is made present to us. There was a time in history when participants at Mass received only the Body of Christ, probably because at the time of plagues there was a fear of transmitting the disease. Even after the plague the cup was avoided. The Second Vatican Council in its "Decree on the Liturgy" restored this practice which we, with gratitude and praise, now embrace. After all, Jesus did give the instruction: "Take and drink." May Catholics today find meaning and strength in sharing the cup, the Blood of Christ.

My prayers are with you each day.



Someone is Watching and Wondering



"The Eucharist makes us one!" What powerful words but perhaps we miss the broader significance of this statement. We are one, with whom? If we believe the teachings of St. Paul

that we are all one body in Christ, then certainly receiving His body and blood unites us with all fellow Christians who receive this sacrament and are part of Christ's body, the church. Yet it is all to evident that there are Christians who do not believe, as we Catholics do regarding the real presence of Christ in this sacrament which unites us through the sharing of His body and blood. Many of our protestant brothers and sisters in the faith see communion as a symbolic action, a remembrance of the Last supper before the suffering and death of Jesus. The question then is: "are we united with these Christians? Additionally there is the question unity with people who are not Christian: our Jewish brothers and sisters, our Muslim brothers and sisters, Buddhists, Hindus, and even non believers; are we as Catholic Christians in someway united with them? Today as we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ, I find myself wondering: "As a catholic (universal) Christian, who regularly receives the Eucharist, how am I related to all God's children who do not receive this sacrament or who do not believe in the real presence of Christ in the bread and wine?

I wish I could tell you that I have a perfectly formed answer, however, my answer is a work in progress. I am reminded of the story of creation in Genesis, where humankind was made in the image and likeness of God, and along with all of creation, God pronounced humanity good. If we are united through our humanity, as distinct among all God's creation, then does our concept and belief of unity through receiving the Eucharist, somehow change God's original proclamation? Simply stated in my thoughts, "No!" There is and always has been a unity of all human beings with God, one another and all creation, however, each individual can choose to reject this unity, to step away from God's love and grace, and to pursue the pathway of sin.

I believe that whenever I receive the Eucharist I am strengthened by the Holy Spirit to embrace God's love and grace, to reject sin, and to serve God through serving others. I am continually challenged by this belief, and I must confess unsure where God will lead me each day. What I am sure of, however, is without receiving the body and blood of Christ I feel empty and unable to commit myself to the full rich life God has graced me with. I am united to all of my human brothers and sisters, but I need this sacred nourishment to embrace them. I need Jesus!

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Friday, June 7



Although not a Holy Day of Obligation, the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is an important liturgical day in the Catholic Church.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the 11th century, but through

the 16th century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to devotion to the Five Wounds of Christ.

The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal.

In all of these visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. The "great apparition," which took place on June 16, 1675, during the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, because the Church initially had doubts about the validity of St. Margaret Mary's visions, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France. Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, at the request of the French bishops, extended the feast to the universal Church. It is celebrated on the day requested by our Lord-the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of Christ), or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday.

ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, May 13, 2024

The May meeting of the St. James Pastoral Council was called to order by Chairman Kevin Casel at 7:00pm. The following council members were present: Fr. Mike Roach, Deacon Chuck Koesterer, Dan Bacon, Eddie Baker, Phil Baumert, Kevin Casel, Corrine Katzer, Joan Peluso and Sherri Porterfield. An opening inspirational reading from *Holy Moments* by Matthew Kelly was given by Dan Bacon.

Old Business:

Pastoral Council Discernment Results: Chairman Kevin Casel informed the Council that the discernment process was completed in late April and the two new members are Jeff Ridder and Chris Fullinwidder. Information about the new Council members will be in the church bulletin the first weekend of August and they will meet for the first time with other Council members at the annual retreat scheduled for Saturday, August 3rd. These new members replace Dan Bacon and Patrick Schaub who served the Council for the past 5 years. Chairman Casel thanked Dan and Patrick for their dedication and contribution in serving the Council.

Hillcrest Ministries Update: Chairman Casel told the Council via Yvette Lopez that many changes are occurring with Hillcrest Ministries through restructuring of their outreach program. Currently, everything regarding St. James and other sponsor participation in this program is on hold. Once we are informed of the procedure changes, we will be able to proceed. Yvette told Chairman Casel that the first order of business will be to re-paint the apartment St. James sponsors and that a team of volunteers is in place to do this.

Point of Contact Update: Dan Bacon informed the Council that there was a need for a few additional people at all the Masses except for Sunday at 8:00 a.m. The next step would be to designate section leaders for each area of the sanctuary who would guide that area of the congregation to safety in the event of an evacuation.

Connection with High School Grads and College Students: In April the Council briefly discussed the need to find ways to make a personal connection with those young adults graduating from high school and college students to let them know they

are an important part of our St. James family. Joan Peluso talked with Ashlee Hand, the coordinator for the 40-Day Prayer Letter Ministry that occurs during Lent to get ideas. The Council discussed ways to contact these young adults, and all felt it was important to not only get their contact information but how they would like to receive the communication, i.e. letter, email, text, etc. It was discussed that the best time to connect with these young adults may be at Thanksgiving and again over the Christmas holidays. There was a suggestion made by Deacon Chuck and agreed by all members that we include those Catholic students attending William Jewell College. Specific plans on how to accomplish this were not made but this will become one of the goals for the Council for the upcoming year beginning in August.

New Business:

Election of 2024-25 Executive Committee Members: The Pastoral Council Executive Committee is comprised of the following members: Fr. Mike Roach, the Council Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Secretary. The members, apart from Fr. Mike, are elected by secret ballot at the May meeting. Members elected for the 2024-25 year are: Joan Peluso, Chairperson; Kevin Casel, Vice-Chairperson; Sherri Porterfield, Secretary. These individuals will begin their term of office in August.

Topics for August Retreat: Jay Meacham will be leading the Council retreat to be held at the Precious Blood Center in August and wished to know of any topics that the Council may want to address. The members agreed that the results of the survey, particularly the comments written on the need to connect with Young Adults 18 and older and development of opportunities for Adult Faith Formation, be the primary focus for this retreat and the coming year.

Closing Prayer:

Fr Mike closed the meeting with a prayer and the Council members prayed the "Our Father" together. The meeting was adjourned for the summer at 8:15pm.


