

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I venture to say that most people of faith have developed some form of prayerlife. At times I do wonder, however, what constitutes a life of prayer.

As the director of Adult Initiation, I tell sponsors to share their prayer life with our candidates and catechumens, and to journey with them as they too develop a life of prayer. Naturally, the first step is leading these individuals to regular attendance at Mass (the most common form of communal prayer). Initiation into the faith is impossible without attending and actively participating (through singing, listening, and gestures) in weekly Mass.

The second path for developing a life of prayer is to read and meditate on sacred scripture. During the journey towards full initiation into the Church, candidates and catechumens, as well as sponsors focus on the scripture readings proclaimed at Sunday Mass. We attempt to understand these words as if we were with Jesus in the first century, by what our Church teaches through these readings, and what I believe is most significant, how the words resonate in our daily, everyday lives. If we believe that sacred scripture is the living word of God revealing truth, then that truth must have meaning today, to each of us. Sometimes this is difficult, especially with some of the Hebrew Scriptures, but praying with the scripture and looking for the universal message is vital for our journey in relationship to God, in faith.

The third path on our journey of a prayer life is to simply be in the presence of God, not uttering a word but rather quietly experiencing God's abundant love and grace. An occupational habit of mine, developed over the years of teaching, is expressing myself in words (mostly spoken). Yet I have found a special nearness to God in silence. Words seem to get in the way and block the flow of my prayer, silent thoughts, and feelings shared with God. Silence may be difficult in our world of never ending noise and demands. I have discovered, however, that following a daily routine of simply sitting and listening to God in creation has helped me to find the strength to quiet myself, block out extraneous noise, set aside what I need to accomplish that day, and give myself over totally to this experience of God's presence.

There are many ways to pray and I am not suggesting that I have the perfect way of communicating with God. I do believe it is important for each individual to pray and develop a regular life of prayer throughout each and every day. Perhaps you pray through music or with icons. Perhaps you have a special place for meditation. Perhaps you pray in the presence of the blessed sacrament or with sacramentals. I don't think the form or prayer truly matters, as long as you place yourself in God's care, daily.

Fr. Tim Coday and the St. James Knights Tanzania Missionary Support

Fr. Timothy Coday is a member of the Precious Blood Missionaries and a brother of St. James parishioners Gerard Coday and Dennis Coday. He is actively involved in a missionary in Malongwe, Tanzania and our St. James Knights of Columbus have helped support his missionary there over the last several years. Fr. Coday has been working for the Society of Precious Blood in various missionary assignments throughout Tanzania for the last 38 years.



This is the hospital in Malongwe, Tanzania that Fr. Tim Coday and locals operate. He also lives there in Malongwe. The tank in the picture collects rainwater that is used in the lab and to clean and sterilize instruments.

In 1983, after the local area Precious Blood Seminary closed, Fr. Coday traveled to Chile in South America and Tanzania in southeastern Africa to ascertain working and supporting the Precious Blood missionaries in those countries. He ended up going to Tanzania to help with the missionary needs there. In his early years in Tanzania, Fr. Coday helped on the receiving and distributing end of shipping goods to support the local Catholic missions. He later became involved with water projects that included the drilling of wells for locals in the bush country. His involvement helped create more wells so that the local people would have more water available and have it available much closer to their homes. The populace living in the bush country obtain water much like in the time of Jesus, where the water must be carried back to homes in containers such as water buckets and pitchers. It is not uncommon for locals to have to walk 5 miles or more a day to carry water back to their homes. With the additional wells that Fr. Coday and co-workers installed, the walk to available water was cut from 5 miles to less than a mile for many families. Running water in homes in the bush is not an option due to the expense of drilling wells and the lack of electricity.

With Fr. Coday's can-do attitude and excellence in managing people and projects, he was given more projects by the Precious Blood Missionaries to help locals improve their lives. He became involved with supporting local schools and a hospital and dispensary in the town of Malongwe. To help fund maintaining the hospital and dispensary, Fr. Coday obtained a needed rice hulling machine to remove the husks from rice for local food consumption when the rice was to be used for cooking soon.



Rice Hulling Machine in action – the money generated by hulling the rice helps pay for maintaining the hospital and dispensary.

To purchase the rice hulling machine would take money that the hospital did not have. So, while home on leave visiting his immediate family a couple of years ago, Fr. Coday approached the St. James Knights of Columbus about funding the need to buy a rice hulling machine that would remove the husks from the rice grains. Not only would this machine provide clean rice for food consumption, but it would also give the hospital a source of revenue by charging locals in the area a small fee for cleaning the rice for food. The money obtained from hulling the rice is used today to help fund operating the hospital and dispensary.

Around November 1, 2023, when Fr. Coday was home on another visit and staying at the Precious Blood Center in Liberty, he came to the St. James Knights again with another need. Their hospital and medicine dispensary did not have working electricity other than a diesel generator that ran the lighting in

the hospital. He asked the St. James Knights for support to buy wiring, lights and conduit to be able to hookup to electrical power that was nearby. The hospital did not have electrical service and if they wanted it, they would have to provide the wiring,


lights and accessories needed to hook up the power in the hospital. The St. James Knights provided \$2,000 to Fr. Coday's hospital group to fund these costs. The hospital and dispensary are now hooked up to electrical power, but they still maintain the

generator system as a backup when and if they lose power. The generator system is entirely separate from the electrical power system.

Over the last 3 years the St. James Knights have provided \$4,000 for the rice hulling machine and for the electricity hookup to support Fr. Coday's mission work in Tanzania. The Knights have been kept up to date on Fr. Coday's Tanzania missionary project by brother Gerald and his wife Maureen Coday. Knights past officer and parishioner Michael Kieffer is a close friend, and in addition, often provides updates on the Tanzania mission and Fr. Coday's good work. The St. James Knights of Columbus are pleased to be able to support this good missionary work with the needy in Tanzania and feel this fits right in with their on-going support of 10 seminarians.

Fr. Tim Coday is supported by the Precious Blood Society and visits by his immediate family. His brothers and their families travel to Tanzania to visit him periodically and St. James parishioner brother Gerard and his wife Maureen Coday will be visiting him later this year.


