## From the Pastor's Pen

On this Father's Day Weekend, I join Fr. Mike as we extend to all fathers, grandfathers, stepfathers, foster fathers, and Godfathers our very best wishes with thanks for all that you do for your families and for passing on the values of our Catholic faith.

This week members of the United States Province of the Society of the Precious Blood, Sisters of the Precious Blood, Companions and invited guests will come together in Saint Louis for a Eucharistic Convocation. The theme is "An Infusion with the Precious Blood of Jesus: A Dynamic Force for a Lasting Eucharistic Revival." The gathering and theme are part of a national Eucharistic Revival with the goal of a joyful, expectant, grass roots response of the entire Catholic Church across our country.

The Diocese of Kansas City-Saint Joseph, together with the Archdiocese of Kansas City, Kansas, brought this effort to our area with a Eucharistic Revival at the Liberty Memorial on Saturday, May 4. As we approached that gathering, I highlighted the efforts of the national revival in the Pastor's Pen on that weekend. The goal of the revival is that all Catholics across our country encounter the reality of our Eucharistic Lord. It is hoped that the Revival will re-educate Catholics about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and to inspire them to a deeper conviction and appreciation for this precious gift. Video presentations as well as material for small group study are available on-line or in print from a national office.

A National Eucharistic Congress will be held July 17-21 at the Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Indiana. It is the first Eucharistic Congress in our country in 83 years. All Catholics across the country are invited. In the days before the Congress there will be Eucharistic processions from the north, south, east, and west. Two dozen teenagers have committed to be "Perpetual Pilgrims," carrying the Eucharist and leading the procession. People may join the pilgrimage at any point, walking a short or longer distance. On Wednesday, July 17, the four branches of the Pilgrimage will converge at the convention site. In order to facilitate the flow of information, parishes are encouraged to have "Point Persons" to provide information and coordination.

## Someone is Watching and Wondering



Last week I wrote about personal prayer life and suggested that one path is to begin with scripture, specifically discerning how the words of sacred scripture resonate in

your life and how God's truth is being revealed to you. In other words, how do you come to experience and know God through prayer? Let me suggest that coming to know God is essentially the same as getting to know another person and developing a deep, honest, relationship.

How do you and I develop a friendships? I meet someone and first look intently at them; how are we alike, how are we different in appearance, age, dress/style, facial expressions, and upon meeting what is expressed through body language. Secondly we spend time together both in speech and silence. Perhaps we write to one another, or share experiences both good and bad. We listen to one another's words, and watch interactions with other people. Eventually, we may grow close, even integrating into our own personalities what we find best in them. Finally, we commit ourselves to a loving relationship; loving one another, unselfishly as Christ taught. I do not believe it is possible to develop a deep, loving relationship with God until I experience letting go of myself, and getting to know God as a dear, close, friend, through a bond rooted in mutual love, trust, and respect.

I recently read Mary Higgins Clark's response to the question: "How can I find God?" Her initial response was: "Why are you asking? Is it because there is a restlessness in your very being that urges you to seek, to find the source of your existence?" These words caught my immediate attention and as she further explained, I found myself reflecting on my own experiences. She wrote how she finds God in the natural world, with the changing seasons witnessed in the cycles of plants, and the never ending cycle of life. She wrote of watching newborn infants, helpless and still sleeping peacefully. She wrote of days following nights; sunrises and sunsets, tides rising and receding, each event in perfect harmony without any intervention from humans. She cited Thomas Aquinas' words that belief in God is not in opposition to science, but that in everything, God is the "uncaused cause," which we seek. Finally Mary Higgins Clark wrote how to realize that all the good, all the love we have experienced, has been a gift of God, the eternal good, the unfailing love, and forgiveness proclaimed by Jesus. She suggested we begin our journey to finding and developing a relationship with God with these words of prayer: "I believe Lord, help my unbelief." I would add: "Be still and know that I am God," Psalm 46:11. Form a relationship with God; let God be your dearest most trusted friend.

In June of every year, we honor fathers. Mother's Day became an official U.S. holiday in 1914, but a holiday honoring fathers did not become official until 1966, when President Lyndon Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day.

Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President Richard Nixon signed it into law in 1972. But this doesn't mean that the holiday was not celebrated before this time.

The idea for Father's Day is attributed to Sonora Dodd, who was raised by her father after her mother's death during childbirth. While listening to a sermon at church on Mother's Day, she thought about all her father had done for her and her siblings and decided fathers should have a day, too.

Because Dodd's father was born in June, she encouraged churches in her area, Spokane, WA, to honor fathers that month. The first Father's Day was celebrated in Spokane in 1910.

Over the years, the idea spread, and people lobbied Congress to establish the holiday. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson, who had signed the proclamation establishing Mother's Day, approved the idea, but never signed a proclamation for it. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge made it a national event to "establish more intimate relations between fathers and their children and to impress upon fathers the full measure of their obligations."

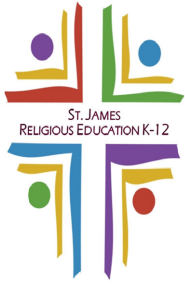

The 1st Parent Information meetings will be held in  
September.

Fees for the 24-2025 year will be \$40 per child. The  
fees will cover both the First Reconciliation and First  
Communion Programs as well as retreat expenses.  
Arrangements will be available. Finances will not pre-  
vent any student from preparing for/receiving the Sacra-  
ments.

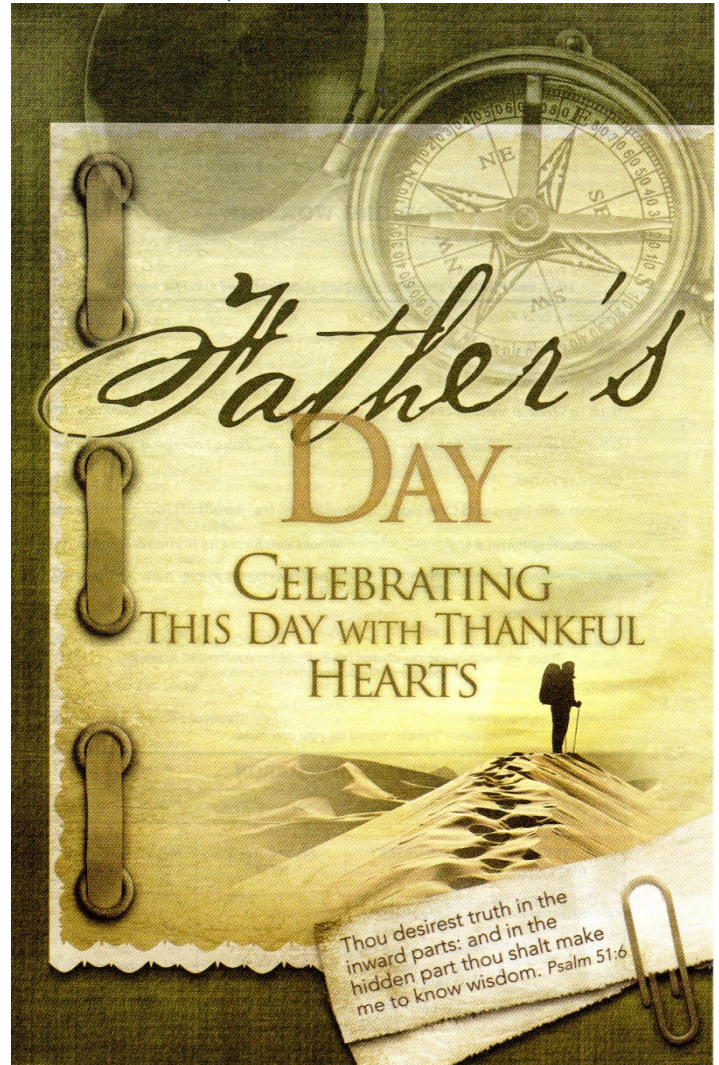

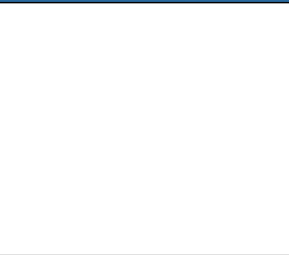

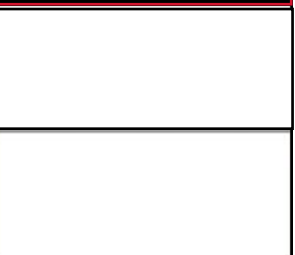
