

From the Pastor's Pen

I recently read a book called "1776" by the Pulitzer Prize winning author David McCullough. It helped me to remember some of the history of the Revolutionary War, the death and destruction that occurred and the valor of the Colonists. Yes, sometimes freedom comes at a great price. We only need to recall the war in Ukraine, the bloodshed, destruction, violence, and the atrocities against the citizens.

So as we celebrate Independence Day we remember not only the freedom won by the Revolutionary War, but also the freedom preserved by all the wars that have followed. We honor all the heroes who have given their lives to preserve and protect our nation's freedom, but also the freedom of every peaceful people.

In a sense, "independence" is not always a Christian virtue. Sometimes people want independence from laws, independence from responsibility, independence from stewardship of our earth, and even independence from God. As Christians, we believe that we depend on God for our life and all the things we need to sustain life. We are not meant to be "lone wolves," distancing ourselves from other people, wanting an independent lifestyle. No, we are dependent on each other, we need each other, we find fulfillment in our relationships with one another. As we celebrate Independence Day, we give thanks to God that we live in a country where we enjoy freedom, but also remember that God gives us the task of caring for one another.,

I would also like to look back to a celebration on July 1, which in the old church calendar celebrated the feast of the Most Precious Blood. Devotion to the Blood of Christ has always been a reminder of the life-giving sacrifice of Jesus. I encourage you to join members of the Society of the Precious Blood in that devotion.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



This week many will gather with family and friends to celebrate July 4th. There will be parades, speeches, music, picnics, barbeques, and of course fireworks. We refer to this day as Inde-

pendence Day, yet the Treaty of Paris, ending the American Revolution with England, declaring that the thirteen colonies were an independent nation, was not signed until 1783, seven years after the Second Continental Congresses' actions on July 2 (the vote to approve a resolution of independence proposed by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia), and the subsequent debate, revision, and final approval of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776 (an explanation of the decision to be free of British rule). Following the vote to approve, the official congressional printer, John Dunlap, worked through the night printing 200 copies of the Declaration, to be distributed to the public. Even then, however, most signatures were not attached until August 2nd,1776. Also let's not forget the War of 1812 when the British tried to reclaim her colonies. So when was the true Independence day for people in the United States? Some would contend independence came through the Emancipation Proclamation; others might suggest June 19, 1865; some would say independence came with voting rights for women or the civil rights legislation of 1964 prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. I question, however, are there still individuals or groups of people fighting for their independence and rights enumerated in the Declaration of Independence, U.S. Constitution with its amendments, and legislation which has since been enacted and intended for all people residing within our continental borders and territories.

As a citizen of the United States I feel grateful for the vision of the Declaration of Independence and our Constitution. As a Christian and practicing Catholic, however, I believe there is so much more to accomplish. I see people who struggle for basic human needs (food, clothing, shelter, medical care, education, and safety). I see people crying to be recognized with dignity and respect. There are individuals exposed to human trafficking and unsafe working/living conditions. There are people targeted for their religious beliefs, ethnicity, and yes, even poverty. In this amazing country in which I live, people are still objectified, mocked, and bullied for who they are. Personally I am challenged every day to follow Jesus' commandment to love and serve one another. I ask myself, who do I objectify, disrespect, or harm through either my actions, inactions or words? How am I complacent, turning blind eyes to "these Truths. . . that all [humans] are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness"? I wonder, will my Lord judge me as a sheep or a goat?

Help Love INC Supply Hygiene Kits for Low Income Kids in Clay County

Children living in poverty often go back to school without the basic items needed to help them manage proper hygiene.

When we asked kids what they needed for back-toschool, they said they wanted to "look good" and "smell good." That is why we work with local school districts and area churches to provide low-income families with pre-assembled hygiene kits at the start of each school year. And the items aren't those tiny, hotel size products. They are full sized hygiene items.

How You Can Help

First, encourage your friends to collect the items, placing them in one-gallon freezer bags (one of each item per bag for a total of six items in a bag. We will need an equal number of boy and girl bags.

The clear freezer bags will help us identify which bags are for the boys and which are for the girls. We need a total of 600 kits.

Here are the items the kids will need:

Toothpaste (2.5-5 oz)

Toothbrushes (adult)

Body Wash (12-18 oz, men's and women's) (avoid larger sizes)

Shampoo (men's and women's) (you can substitute a "3-in-1" for a wash and a shampoo)

Bar Soap (bath size)

Deodorant (1.5-2.5 oz stick (men's and women's)

Second, you can send donations to help Love INC purchase the colorful, nylon, string-tie gym bags that make up the "kits." Because we purchase the bags in bulk, they only cost us about \$1 each. We will need 600 bags. When the bags are distributed, the kids will be able to select the color of bag they like best, and then the freezer bag kit will be placed inside the nylon bag and given to the child.

Third, you can help us distribute the bags. If you can help, let us know and we will let you know where and when, typically the first or second week of August. We already have confirmations from the Liberty School District and the Kearney School District.

Please bring the completed bags to Love INC no later than Wednesday, July 24.

You can bring the bags any Monday through Thursday between 10am and 3pm, or by appointment by calling (816) 994-6927.



Feast of the Most Precious Blood July 1



July 1st is the Feast of the Precious Blood and the month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood.

The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity.

The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (as well as most other months of the year).

In 1930, the Church declared worthy of belief, the visions of the shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal from the May 13 to Oct. 13, 1917. Pope John Paul II exhibited his approval of Fatima many times. He visited Fatima 3 times – in 1982, 1991 and 2000. During his 2000 visit made the Feast day of Our Lady of Fatima universal by ordering it to be included in the Roman Missal.

St. Thomas, Apostle Feast Day July 3



Best known for his initial unwillingness to believe the other apostles in their claim that Jesus had risen from the dead, St. Thomas can teach the faithful about believing without seeing.

When he was told about it by the other apostles, he said, "Unless I see in his hands the print of the nails, and place

my finger in the mark of the nails, and place my hand in his side, I will not believe."

When Christ appeared later he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side and do not be unbelieving, but believe."

Pope Benedict XVI said "The Apostle Thomas' case is important for at least three reasons. "First, it comforts us in our insecurity; second, it shows us that every doubt can lead to an outcome brighter than any uncertainty; and, lastly, the words that Jesus addressed to him remind us of the true meaning of mature faith and encourage us to persevere, despite the difficulty, along our journey of adhesion to him."
