

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I recently googled the word "sanctuary" and was somewhat surprised by the number of websites that I found. The word itself is defined as 1. a place of refuge or safety; 2. a na-

ture reserve, yet I found sites for nature sanctuaries, an apartment, condos, subdivisions, and golf courses named sanctuary, wildlife and farm sanctuaries, sanctuary walks and vacations, church sanctuaries, and personal sanctuaries, to name just a few. The listing that intrigued me the most, however, was "Nature as God's Sanctuary" on the website, *Embracing the Wind*. For me nature is a sanctuary where I feel safe and embraced by the real presence of God and I was curious about the author's ideas. I found much in common, regarding the wonder and sacredness of our natural world, but I was also challenged from two perspectives.

The first challenge asked "Does being in nature replace worship within a faith community?" Over the past years this question has been presented to me many times in a variety of forms. Basically it goes like this: "I feel closer to God when I am in nature, while bored when I go to church." My approach is to suggest the need for and support of a faith community, and I share how my relationship with God grows each time I participate with my faith community, especially through reception of the sacraments. I find great comfort and refuge when I receive Jesus so intimately in the Eucharist. I believe, however, that each person must actively participate and open him/her self to God's love and grace.

The second challenge, however, I cannot adequately and truthfully answer: "Are churches (St. James-Liberty) a place of sanctuary and refuge?" The author writes: "Many people walk [into] a church, trail their fingers over the pews, kneel at the alter and find sanctuary. . .it can feel like coming home with memories of salvation and baptisms, family and friends, and laying burdens down at the altar." What was so disturbing to me was the word **many**. Ideally our churches should be places of safety, shelter, and refuge for all. As an institution we often miss this ideal. How many people or groups of people do you know who are not welcomed in our church? How many have been turned away, or refused the sacraments when they spoke openly about their lives, understandings, or beliefs; when they revealed their sorrows, loves or burdens? Do we set moral or ecclesial conditions, strict adherence to orthodoxy, liturgy, canon law and the catechisms as prerequisites for acceptance; or do we embrace the teachings of Jesus? Do we offer sanctuary and comfort only to church observing, solid ecclesial individuals? Jesus met and welcomed people living on the fringes; he never asked first for compliance or repentance. He was/is present to all in need. He offers sanctuary, refuge and places of safety with compassion and love. I am indeed challenged: how does my lived faith compare with Jesus?


St. James Has a New Monstrance

Children living in poverty often go back to school without the basic items needed to help them manage proper hygiene.

This is why we work with local school districts and area churches to provide low-income families with pre-assembled hygiene kits at the start of each school year. And the items aren't those tiny, hotel size products. They are full sized hygiene items.

How You Can Help

Collect the items below, place them in a clear onegallon freezer bag (one of each item per bag for a total of six items in a bag. We will need an equal number of boy and girl bags.

Here are the items the kids will need:

Toothpaste (2.5-5 oz)

Toothbrushes (adult)

Body Wash (12-18 oz, men's and women's) (avoid larger sizes)

Shampoo (men's and women's) (you can substitute a "3-in-1" for a wash and a shampoo)

Bar Soap (bath size)

Deodorant (1.5-2.5 oz stick (men's and women's)

St. Mary Magdalene Feast Day July 22



St. Mary Magdalene is one of the greatest saints of the Bible and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace.

The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but we do know she was present with Christ during his public ministry, death and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels.

She is the patroness of converts, repentant sinners, sexual temptation, pharmacists, tanners and women, and many other places and causes.

Thursday, July 25 Feast Day of St. James the Greater The Patron Saint of Our Church



The son of Zebedee and Salome, "our" St. James is called "the Greater" to distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less", who was probably shorter of stature. He was the brother of John, the beloved disciple. Zebedee, his father, was a fisherman of the Sea of Galilee. Salome, his mother, was one of the pious women who afterwards followed Christ and ministered unto him of their substance.

James is described as one of the first disciples to join Jesus. When he first encountered Jesus, there probably was no indication that this was the day that his life would change. The dawn for him was not the bright beginning of a new day, but the end of long fruitless night of fishing. As James sat mending his nets in the boat with his brother John and his father Zebedee, he must have watched in wonder as his partner Simon brought in nets loaded with fish he had caught at the command of Jesus.

As Jesus walked towards James, followed by Simon and Andrew, He didn't pass him by. He stopped by their boat and called James and his brother John to do just what Simon and Andrew had done - follow Him. Without argument or discussion, James and John left their boat and even their father behind, and followed Jesus.

James was one of only three apostles whom Jesus chose to join to join him in prayer at the Garden of Gethsemane for his final prayer before his arrest and whom Jesus selected to bear witness to his Transfiguration.

Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Gospel across Israel and the Roman kingdom as well. He traveled and spread the Word for nearly forty years in Spain.

The Acts of the Apostles records that "herod the king" (traditionally identified with Herod Agrippa) had James executed by sword. St. James is the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in the New Testament.

Hillcrest Hope Ministry



The Pastoral Council is managing the overall needs and expectations of Hill-crest Hope in our ongoing commitment of sponsoring an apartment. We are spearheading the organization of volun-

teers to support our pledge to Hillcrest Hope and these families. Hillcrest Hope is not a rehab or a shelter, it is a debt reducing or debt eliminating program for their residents. Hillcrest Hope provides all the necessities for everyday living so the residents can focus on saving and debt elimination. They provide weekly financial and budget counseling, and weekly meetings with their case manager about their progress in general. The goal is to prepare these residents to successfully re-enter society.



St. James sponsors one of the 11 apartments they have in Liberty. At present it is ready for occupancy and should be filled soon (see pictures)— we will keep you updated on this. A single person, couple, or family can reside in the apartment.

Sponsoring those in "our" apartment gives St.

James parishioners an opportunity to be involved in the experience and personally make it special for people who reside there. There are many needs as well as wants that these families have. This is ongoing and can be daunting for



just one or a few people, but with teams of volunteers, it doesn't take much time or effort on our parts and can make the journey of these families bright and so much easier.



Families can now stay in the apartment anywhere from 4 to 8 months, provided they continue to do



their part in keeping a job and meeting with their case manager and counselors. Therefore, the time you would be donating will vary with the team you are on and can be as infrequent as a couple of times a year or less.

In the near future, we will also be having a Hillcrest Hope fair to give more information as well as another opportunity to sign up for teams at that time.

Team descriptions are listed below. (note: many of these things are done once either just after residents leave or just before new residents enter).

<u>Cleaning team</u> - to examine and conduct basic cleaning when the apartment is vacant. Remove and dispose of damaged apartment items.

Shopper Team - People willing to purchase perishables and necessities when a new resident moves in.

<u>Re-stocker Team -</u> People willing to gather items for the apartment when needed: towels, bedding, kitchen items (usually assessed when apartment if vacant)

<u>Repair/Repainting team</u> - (this is very infrequent) Hillcrest Hope will supply the paint, the Sponsors will provide the supplies and manpower. (let us know your specific or nonspecific talents in household repairs!)

<u>Hospitality Team</u> - People willing to take a meal to the resident/family within their first week of moving into Hillcrest Hope.

<u>Special Occasion recognition Team</u> -- People willing to provide an age-appropriate gift for birthdays and some appropriate acknowledgment for other special days such as father's and mothers day, graduations, etc.


