From the Pastor's Pen

The Vatican Dicastery for the Laity, Family, and Life has called for a world-wide observance of a World Day for Grand-parents and the Elderly this Sunday, July 28. A special Mass will be celebrated today in Rome at St. Pater's Basilica. It is likely that this day was chosen because it is close to the Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, known in tradition as the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and therefore the grand-parents of Jesus, a feast celebrated each year on July 26. It is expected that thousands from Rome and other places as well will turn out for the Mass and celebration.

In initiating this observance, Pope Francis recalled the Scripture even when Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the Temple. There they encountered two elderly people, Simeon and Anna, who were inspired to recognize Jesus as the Messiah. Even today, the Pope says, the Holy Spirit stirs up thoughts and words of wisdom in the elderly. They remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between the different generations to pass on to the young experiences of life and faith. We must never forget our grandparents. They preserve our spiritual roots and the passing on of our values.

Sometimes the elderly are placed in care facilities, are lonely and forgotten. It is also true that grandparents and the elderly are also treated with great respect. I have seen wonderful examples in our own parish family. Also we have excellent volunteers who visit the hospital and rest homes, giving such great care and comfort to the ones they visit. Thank you to Jeanne Verssue who organizes this ministry. It is a great gift to look into the face of an elderly person and see the face of Christ.

If you feel the calling to be involved in ministry to the homebound and those in care facilities, please call the parish office. May God bless you.

Three steps anyone can learn to help prevent suicide.



Someone is Watching and Wondering



Synodality is a term that has been used in our Catholic Church to describe a process of collaboration and discernment, generally among Bishops, for addressing issues/

teachings within our faith communities. The word "synod" comes from two Greek words meaning "walking together." Broadly speaking synodality is the journey of living our faith together as the People of God. Synodality is a way of speaking and listening to one another, and reflecting on how God, through the Holy Spirit is speaking to all of us. Thus synodality becomes the pathway for addressing issues facing the Church, our contemporary 21st century society, and the natural world. In a synodal Church, therefore, the entire community, in all its diversity, comes together to pray, listen, dialogue, discern, or offer suggestions related to pastoral decisions, which align as closely as possible to the teachings and example of Jesus. Pope Francis continues to stress, however, that the church must first become synodal before dealing with critical, controversial issues; hence he called the Synod on Synodality which will meet for the second time this fall.

Watching this process unfolding, I continue to be amazed at what laity and clergy alike express as the issues our Church needs to address and what the Church should be saying to the world today. Here are a few examples of input I have read: challenge the world in terms of justice; people need to pray more; the church needs to speak out regarding sin in our world; we need to bring more people (bodies) into church; stop the evil of abortion; ordain women; allow priests to marry; improve preaching; return to the Latin Rite (pre-Vatican 2); increase devotional practices; and so on. Not once, however, have I found any comments regarding acceptance and kindness. How can we be synodal people if we continue to talk about "us vs them?" I don't believe we can have a synodal church by shutting the doors to some individuals; by thinking in terms of winners and losers; through isolationism and nationalism; through exclusivity and withdrawal from ecumenism. I do not believe we can be a synodal church without listening to people living on the outskirts of society: the migrants and poor, the voices of those struggling to survive physically, emotionally and economically, family members torn apart by war and violence, the voiceless and little ones who have no one to speak for them. A synodal church is not, to my way of thinking, an institution of power and wealth. A synodal church is the "body of Christ" sharing God's love and mercy through simple acts of kindness and compassion. Isaiah 40 begins with these words: "Comfort, give comfort to my people says your God." For me, this is the essence of synodality/a synodal church; giving comfort and protection to all of God's creation.


