

From the Pastor's Pen

There are names for people born during certain periods, like "Millennials, born between 1981 and 1996. Blessed Carlo Acutis is destined to be the first "millennial saint" when he and 14 others are canonized in 2025. Recently Pope Francis met in consistory with Cardinals to formerly approve the canonization ceremony and designation.

Probably most of you are familiar with the life of Blessed Carlo He was born in London, England, on May 3, 1991. His family moved to Milan, Italy, when he was only an infant. He is described as an "ordinary boy who lived his childhood and youth among family, school, and typical boyhood games." He became very skilled with the computer, creating an on-line data base of Eucharistic miracles around the world, so great was his love for the Eucharist. He volunteered at a church-run food kitchen, helped the poor in his neighborhood, played saxophone, and enjoyed soccer and video games. His life-long plan was "always to be close to Jesus." He was devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary, striving to pray the rosary each day, and having a great love for the Eucharist. He was only 15 when he was diagnosed with a very aggressive form of leukemia. He died on October 12, 2006. As was his desire, he is buried in Assisi, Italy, the home of his beloved St. Francis.

In February, 2020, Pope Francis formally recognized a miracle attributed to his intercession. In October of that same year he was beatified at the Basilica of Saint Francis. An estimated 117,000 pilgrims visited his tomb in just the first year of his beatification. A second miracle attributed to his intercession occurred in 2022. Pope Francis urged young people to learn about Blessed Carlo, "who did such a great deal of good things, despite his short life. Prayer, witness, and charity were the hall-marks of his life and should be a key part of the life of every Christian."

Though his youthful activities were very ordinary, still he had an extraordinary way of responding to the call of his faith. Not young people today will imitate Blessed Carlo, though many Catholic youth will admire his zeal and dedication.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I grew up in a home where there was always music. No one played an instrument, but my mother sang, my father played his favorite LPs, and my sister Susan

played her radio and 45s. My mother sang hymns and Christmas carols, my dad liked organ music, country music, and especially Bing Crosby, while my sister introduced me to 50's Rock and Roll. I loved it all. In elementary school my classmates and I were taken to the KC philharmonic where I gained an appreciation for classical music, while old movies on television provided exposure to beautiful sound tracks as well as many musical productions. In my first year of college it was opera and ballet, folk music, and the Blues. Much later my children brought in Heavy Metal and Rap sounds. I must confess, there is very little music I do not like.

What ever your thoughts and feelings regarding the Opening Ceremonies of the 2024 Olympics, if you watch the broadcast, I was amazed at the variety and inclusivity of the music, and I was once again transformed into my own musical world. I even found myself singing and brought to tears by Celine Dion's performance of *Hymne a l'amour - If You Love Me.* (No I cannot sing French but I knew the English words from an old movie I watched many years ago.) This song, a reflection on love that is boundless and eternal, ends with the dramatic phrase: "Dieu réunit ceux qui s'aiment - God unites those who love."

Beautiful last words for the beginning of the Olympics: If we love one another we are united, because it is God who unites us in love. I am sad, however, that the ideals of the Olympics, just like the ideals upon which the United States of America was founded, do not seem to be the dominant feature of our society. Even within our church there seems to be so much division and taking of sides (conservatives vs liberals vs progressives, traditionalist vs modernists, sacred vs secular, etc.) I find it so difficult to understand why we seem to be stuck in a culture of winners and losers. As a Christian, even though I fall very short, I strive each and every day to love like Jesus teaches. I try to embrace diversity, understand different ideas, and seek the common good. Equality does not mean we are all alike nor should we be. Though we are all created in the image and likeness of God, we must understand that we are created with uniqueness and individuality. I believe created in God's image means that we are all created to love and be loved, to serve and be served, to cherish and be cherished, and that we are all united by common "golden" threads" weaving us into God's beloved sons and daughters. We surely will differ in many things, but in reality nothing can separate us from God's love; only we can choose to deny that such love exists, not simply for those like me but for everyone.

St. Maximilian Kolbe Feast Day August 14



St. Maximilian Kolbe, born January 8, 1894, in Poland, was a Polish Conventual Franciscan friar and a martyr in the German death Camp of Auschwitz during World War II.

He was very active in promoting the Immaculate Virgin Mary and is known as the Apostle of Consecra-

tion to Mary. It is said during the last days of his life Kolbe led prayers to Our Lady with the prisoners. He died on August 14, 1941, and his remains were cremated on August 15, the same day as the Assumption of Mary feast day.

Kolbe was canonized as a saint by Pope John Paul II on October 10.1982.



The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates the Blessed Mother's entrance into heavenly glory. The Catechism explains that Mary "was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her Son's Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of his Body" (CCC, 974).

Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage into eternal life by the choices we make today. When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship is the true meaning of heaven: "To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ" (CCC, 1025).

We can see how, throughout her life, the Blessed Mother continually chose to go deeper into her relationship with God. She modeled how to value and respect His precious gift of human life, from the moment of conception to its natural end. In the Annunciation, through her "yes," Mary witnessed to the undeniable humanity of pre-born children as she conceived and carried the Christ child in her womb. After the Annunciation, having learned that her cousin Elizabeth was with child, she went in haste to her aid.

Our Blessed Mother shows us how the way we live today can prepare us, in hope, to also enter into heavenly glory at the end of our lives. Are we open to God's precious gift of new life? How do we support pregnant mothers and parents? Do we prioritize showing our love to those who are ill or aging? Do we care for them in a way that respects God's gift of life?

Religious Education 2024/2025 Year

We are busy putting together the calendar for the RE programs this year. We are excited to continue to bring back traditions and build on those from last year. Trunk-or-Treat is being planned, Chris Cakes is reserved for Mardi Gras, and more ideas are brewing!

The first day of classes for all RE programs will be in September!

Registrations are now underway for PreK-7th grade RE, First Sacraments, Confirmation, and Camino. Thank you to those who have already registered!

As our parish transitions to the new Confirmation age being guided by The Way initiative, it is important your child is attending a religious education program from Kindergarten on. For those students who are incoming 5th, 6th, and 7th grade, you will be some of the first teens to receive Confirmation at the younger age and the next couple of years will be focused on preparation for this sacrament with you.

Families with 2nd graders or older and who intend for the child to receive first sacraments this year, your child must be enrolled in a religious education program AND First Sacrament preparation. Please note – these are two separate enrollments. School families will only need to enroll in First Sacraments.
