## From the Pastor's Pen

Sometimes when I am at the back of the church waiting for Mass to begin with the entrance hymn, I observe people coming by the holy water font. It is our custom, of course, to touch the holy water and to make the sign of the cross. It is a beautiful gesture which reminds us of our baptism and our discipleship. It is a joy to see that often very small children also reach to the font with a kind of awkward sign of the cross. What I see most is people touching the water and making a sign of the cross that seems like a gesture without much thought and devotion, more like just going through the motions.

The sign of the cross is, in fact, a beautiful gesture that affirms our faith in the Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In this sign we affirm our faith in the fundamental truth of our faith. We also acknowledge the mystery of the cross. We move our hand up and down, symbolizing the horizontal dimension of the cross. Then we move our hand from side to side, symbolizing the arm of the cross. We move our hand from head to heart, remembering that Jesus "came down" from the glory of the Father to redeem us and to live in our heart. We might also see our gesture from side to side as a sign of the wideness of God's mercy.

We also make a smaller sign of the cross at the beginning of the proclamation of the gospel. As the priest or deacon says the words "A reading from the gospel according to Mark" (this year), the people automatically sign their foreheads, asking God to enlighten their minds; sign their lips, asking God to help them to proclaim the gospel; sign their heart, asking God to help them to live the values of the gospel.

There are other pious customs associated with the sign of the cross. Some people find it meaningful to sign themselves with the cross when passing a Catholic Church. Or they may make the sign of the cross when they hear or see an ambulance. The point is that when we make the sign of the cross we do so with meaning and devotion

#### A Third Eucharistic Adoration Day is Being Planned For Wednesdays Sign Up Now



## Someone is Watching and Wondering



trouble and when book by Ann Lamott, entitled life is hard, flis Somehow. In this book she shares many thoughts on peace is there. loving and being loved. At one point she considers words she would whisper to her grandson if she were to

die suddenly. She writes, "when you find yourself in trouble, make a gratitude list, do chores, be kind to yourself, be of service [to others], get outside, and [remember to] breathe." I found her words inspiring, as I reflected on those times in my life when I experienced trouble. Reading her words I realized, that indeed they express how I deal with difficulty. I try to remember my many blessings with gratitude. I get busy, I try to be kind to myself (often allowing myself chocolate or a sweet treat), I sit outside and enjoy the solitude of nature, and I force myself to breathe deeply. There have also been times in dealing with my problems, I find comfort in helping others, simply being present and listening to their concerns and life situation. Reading Ann Lamott's words I was also reminded of two songs, popular when I was much younger: "Let It Be" by the Beatles and "Bridge Over Troubled Waters" by Simon and Garfunkel. The Beatles song begins: "When I find myself in times of trouble, Mother Mary comes to me, Speaking words of wisdom, let it be. And in my hour of darkness she is standing right in front of me, speaking words of wisdom, let it be." Beautiful words but unfortunately I am not a person to simply let it be. I am always looking for solutions; wanting to make things better; a sign of my impatience and at times, lack of trust. I find myself, however, relating to the words in the Simon and Garfunkel song: "When you're weary, feeling small, when tears are in your eves I will dry them all. I'm on your side." These words make me think of Jesus' words of love and being a servant. To stand with those in trouble, giving comfort and aid. That is what I, as a Christian, feel called to. I should never leave another struggling alone, filled with loneliness, exasperation, sorrow, or pain. I am called to meet the other person wherever he/she is, to walk with them, to share their burden, to offer respect, dignity, and agape. As a follower of Jesus I am called to offer His love through comforting, supporting and caring. Any less and I am turning my back on what I profess to believe. I am committing the sin of hypocrisy, separating myself from God, and utterly failing to follow Jesus. In thinking back on difficult times in my life I realize that it was through others that I truly felt God's presence and unconditional love. #### ST. JAMES PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, AUGUST 12, 2024

Chairperson, Joan Peluso called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. The following council members were present: Fr. Mike Roach, Eddie Baker, Kevin Casel, Chris Fullinwider, Corrine Katzer, Betsy Lewey, Yvette Lopez, Joan Peluso, Sherri Porterfield and Jeff Ridder. The opening prayer was given by Joan Peluso.

Guest Report: During the Council's recent retreat, it was decided that the members would like to have a better understanding of each St. James staff members' job. Chairperson Peluso introduced St. James Pastoral Associate Cecilia Richardson who talked to the Council about her job. Cecilia is and has been a great asset in giving her time and talent to the parish over the past 23 years. As Pastoral Associate, Cecilia assists in the planning and execution of funerals and weddings of parishioners. She communicates with the family involved in these services to select the readings and music, as well as, taking care of any live streaming video needs and coordinating with the funeral dinner teams if needed. She deals with all aspects of any wedding at the church including, bridesmaid lineup, the wedding rehearsal, and making sure that the church is cleaned up and ready for Mass later in the day. In addition, Cecilia works with groups who wish to rent the Parish Hall or Social Hall for an event. She also takes care of parish emails and Prayer Chain requests.

She told the Council that her last day in this position will be August 31 as she is retiring. Chairperson Peluso led the Council members in thanking Cecilia for everything she has done for our parish and wished her the very best in her retirement. She will be missed.

**Old Business:** Betsy Lewey reported to the Council that the apartment which St. James sponsors is ready for a tenant. On the weekend of Aug. 10 and 11 parishioners were able to sign up to volunteer on one of six teams after each Mass. Betsy reported that there was a great turnout with many people wanting to volunteer their services. Eventually, team leaders for

each team will be named to make it easier to accomplish each team's goals. Everyone agreed how exciting it is to have so many parishioners wanting to be a part of this ministry.

**New Business:** Sherri Porterfield told the Council that the Adult Faith Program will be getting started with registration for the first class being held the weekends Aug. 17-18 and Aug. 24-25 after all Masses. Parishioners will also be able to register through Sept. 5 on the church website. She also told the Council that 9 parishioners are serving on the Adult Faith Team to help make decisions and assist in all areas of the program. In addition, she shared a video and information about the first class, THE SEARCH, and asked if any members could help with registration and/or would be willing to serve as a small group facilitator when classes begin. Classes begin on Sept. 12 and run through Oct. 24. Additional classes will be announced and scheduled with more information to come.

The Council was informed that a group picture will be taken at next month's meeting and to dress appropriately. This picture will be on the website and in the bulletin. She also told the Council that Sandy Gagnon, Director of Christian Initiation Ministry and Judy Keisling, the Bulletin/Website Editor will address the Council during the September 9 meeting about their jobs.

**Closing:** Fr. Mike closed the meeting with a prayer and the members prayed "The Lord's Prayer" together.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:43pm. The Council's next meeting is Monday, September 9 at 7:00pm in the AV Conference Room. If you have any ideas or concerns for the Council, please contact Fr. 



#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

The Pro-Abortion Initiative Petition seeks to amend the Missouri Constitution and legalize abortion throughout <u>ALL</u> stages of pregnancy.

#### WHAT IT SAYS:

- This Section shall be known as "The Right to Reproductive Freedom Initiative."
- The Government shall not deny or infringe upon a person's fundamental right to reproductive freedom...including but not limited to prenatal care, childbirth, postpartum care, birth control, abortion care, miscarriage care, and respectful birthing conditions.
- 3. The right to reproductive freedom shall not be denied, interfered with, delayed, or otherwise restricted unless the Government demonstrates that such action is justified by a compelling governmental interest achieved by the least restrictive means. Any denial, interference, delay, or restriction of the right to reproductive freedom shall be presumed invalid.
- 4. Notwithstanding subsection 3 of this Section, the general assembly may enact laws that regulate the provision of abortion after Fetal Viability provided that under no circumstance shall the Government deny, interfere with, delay, or otherwise restrict an abortion that in the good faith of a treating health care professional is needed to protect the life or physical or mental health of the pregnant person. ...
- 8. For purposes of this Section, the following terms mean: (1) "Fetal Viability", the point in pregnancy when, in the good faith judgment of a treating health care professional and based on the particular facts of the case, there is a significant likelihood of the fetus's sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures.

\* Missouri Revised Statutes, Sections 188.010 - 188.375 \*\*Based on Doe v. Bolton

#### WHAT IT DOES:

#### THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using <u>"person</u>" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

#### MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" <u>promotes the myth</u> that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have *always* provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this petition.

#### PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Current Missouri laws<sup>\*</sup> require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed and to administer medication abortions in person in case of complications for the woman. These health and safety standards could be seen as an "interference" or "delay" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

#### ALLOWS FOR ABORTIONS IN THE SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER

This amendment allows abortions at any time to protect not only the physical, but also the mental health of the woman. This means that a health care provider could justify a late-term abortion due to a woman's "emotional, psychological, [and] familial" concerns\*\*. An abortion provider would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.
